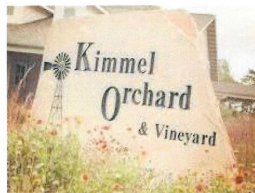

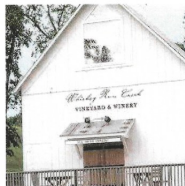


Nebraska City Apples & Fall Colors

Enjoy a fall day exploring Nebraska City and Brownville, Nebraska. Shop for fall apple products
and taste a variety of fruit wines. Enjoy the fall colors of the beautiful Nebraska countryside.

This morning, we visit the impressive Missouri River Basin Lewis and Clark Interpretive Center, located on a scenic 79 acre wooded bluff overlooking the Missouri River. In the 12,000 square foot visitor center, you will explore the world that unfolded to Lewis and Clark as they passed through this area in 1804--and again on their return journey in 1806. Enjoy breathtaking views of the Missouri River valley adorned in fall colors. Learn about the animals, birds, fish, plants, and medicinal discoveries of the expedition. Highlights also include a life size keelboat and a full size replica of a Plains Indian earth lodge.

Next, we travel to the historic St. Benedict Catholic Church in Nebraska City. Enjoy a delicious homemade luncheon buffet, lovingly prepared by the women of the parish. After lunch, take a few moments to explore the historic 1861 church building. This afternoon we visit the scenic Kimmel Orchard and Vineyard, a beloved 80 acre destination filled with fruit trees and vineyards. Upon arrival, enjoy a relaxing, senior friendly wagon ride through the orchard, complete with easy boarding steps, a covered roof, and comfortable bench seating. As you ride, you will hear engaging stories about the orchard's rich history and fun facts about its many fruit varieties. After the tour, take time to explore the Apple Barn Market, stocked with locally made treats--jams, jellies, apples, cider, and more.



Next, we travel south to the charming, historic river town of Brownville, a hidden gem along the Missouri River. Our first stop is the Flatwater Folk Art Museum, located in a beautifully renovated church. This unique museum features a rich and varied collection of folk art--from early American traditions to the bold expressions of the American Southwest. Owner George Neubert, a respected curator and artist, will personally lead our group on a private guided tour, sharing the stories and significance behind each piece. His insights bring the artwork to life, making this experience a favorite among past tours to the museum. Our final destination is Whiskey Run Creek Winery, where you will enjoy a relaxing wine tasting experience. This charming winery offers a delightful blend of history and scenic beauty. Sip wine on the deck of a beautifully restored 110 year old barn, peacefully suspended over a gentle stream--a setting that captures the rustic charm of Nebraska's countryside. Adding to its appeal, the winery sits on the site of an original 1860s distillery, giving it a rich sense of history. Be sure to ask Ron, the friendly winery owner, to show you the original brewery cave, still intact from those early days, where barrels of beer and whiskey were once stored.
