The American Bar Association recognizes members of tribal bar associations of federally recognized Indian tribes and nations as full members of the ABA. This squarely puts tribal court bar membership on equal footing with the bars of states and territories of the United States. The Constitution of the American Bar Association, Rule 3.1, states as follows:

"Members. Any person of good moral character in good standing at the bar of a state, territory, possession, or tribal court of any federally recognized tribe of the United States is eligible to be a member of the Association in accordance with the Bylaws."

Tribal court bar associations require their licensees to follow the rules of professional conduct of the tribe. Tribal courts typically adopt and/or are guided by the rules of professional conduct of the state bars in the states in which those tribes are located. Failure to comply with those rules of conduct subject the attorney to sanctions by the tribal court, including disbarment and license revocation.
