ABOUT CLEAR CAMBODIA

Clear Cambodia was founded in 1999 to provide families in rural communities access to safe water, sanitation facilities, and hygiene education. They operate the largest BioSand Filter (BSF) program in the world and implement roughly 22,000 BSFs per year in communities, schools, and clinics. Their work is critical to improving water access throughout Cambodia, where the plentiful water sources are often contaminated by iron, arsenic, or even human waste.

BSFs are a valuable alternative to buying bottled water (a financial impossibility for most rural families) or boiling the impurities out of surface water (which is both time-consuming and harmful to the environment). Layers of gravel, sand, and biofilm are used to remove dangerous toxins. To promote ownership, families assemble their own BSFs and participate in maintenance training.

PROGRESS TO DATE

Your funds were sent to our local partner in January, and the following six months are considered the planning stages of project implementation. Preparation is one of the most important stages of the process. Our partner uses this time to assess and select which communities or schools will receive water points based on factors such as geography, need, community interest, the risk of overlap with other organizations, and the availability of spare parts for future repairs. Once a school, health clinic, or community is determined, construction materials are transported to the site and training begins.

WHAT'S NEXT?

In the next few months, the construction of BSFs will accelerate. Once construction is complete, Clear Cambodia will test the water flow and quality. Every family will also learn how to manage and maintain their BSF. Meanwhile, Clear Cambodia will encourage community members to build latrines and coordinate training covering topics such as sustainability, sanitation, and hygiene. Clear Cambodia's BSF Construction
Training program teaches community
members how to construct and maintain
their own BSFs using local materials
such as sand, gravel, and cement.
The training program includes both
theoretical and hands-on components
and aims to empower community
members with the skills and knowledge
to improve their own access to clean
water. So far, the program has trained
over 2,000 people in BSF construction
and maintenance.
