Concurrent Driver Education Program: The student may apply for and obtain a learner license from the Texas Department of Public Safety upon successful completion and mastery of Module One. This must include a minimum of six hours of classroom instruction for Module One.

Block Driver Education Program: The student must complete and master all of the modules (a minimum of 32 classroom instruction hours) before he/she may apply for and obtain a learner license from the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Under no circumstances may any behind-the-wheel instruction be permitted until a learner license has been issued to the student by the Texas Department of Public Safety.



In-Car Observation & Behind-the-Wheel Instruction Log

The seven (7) hours of in-car observation and seven (7) hours of behind-the-wheel instruction must be completed by the Parent Taught teacher registered with TDLR. The behind-the-wheel curriculum will be provided in the Parent Taught course you purchased. Only one hour of behind-the-wheel observation or behind-the-wheel instruction per day will count towards the 14 hours regardless of the number of hours the student actually drives in a day.
