

No Fairfax Festival Beer Booth

Due to rising costs and surcharges our Parlor won't be operating our beer booth at the Fairfax Festival this June. This year's increased costs:

- \$600 for 100% recyclable cups.
- \$750 to rent the Refrigerated Beer Trailer.
- \$1200 Event Insurance for serving alcohol.
- \$400 for Health Dept. and ABC License Fees.

This increase of \$3000 makes the beer booth a break-even proposition at best. The beer booth has been a staple of our Parlor for years, raising money for our charities and show-casing our Order to the community, but we had to decide if all the effort and planning was worth it. We sent out a survey to our membership and only 10% of the 61 respondents said we should keep the beer booth. (11% undecided and 79% against keeping it.) We'll continue looking at our options for future festivals, but for now we'll participate in the parade only, carrying our flags with pride and dignity. Hope to see you out there!


That was our heyday. But a lot of those guys have passed or have health issues and aren't able to help out like they used to. We need new brothers to step up and take their places.




