75th Anniversary Coming!

Fairfax Parlor will celebrate its 75th anniversary in September 2024. In anticipation of that event, each future issue of our newsletter will trace the history of our parlor from its institution in 1949 until the present. Here's the first installment.

Fairfax Gets A Parlor!

The organization known as The Native Sons of the Golden West was founded in 1875 and eventually encompassed hundreds of subordinate parlors. It wasn't until 74 years later that Fairfax Parlor was organized and admitted to the Order.

In 1949, Marin County already had three other parlors: Mt. Tamalpais in San Rafael, Sea Point in Sausalito and Nicasio in Nicasio. There were also several Native Daughters parlors in Marin including those in San Rafael and Fairfax.

In August 1949, Mrs. Agnes O'Connell, past president of Fairfax Native Daughters, instigated a campaign which resulted in a meeting of eligible men at the old Hamilton House in Fairfax, where Past Grand President Walter Bailey explained the purposes and objectives of the Native Sons to 24 interested natives. Kenneth Edgar was elected temporary chairman and the group began its search for the 75 eligible men required to secure a charter from Grand Parlor.

On August 22, the group met to hear Grand President Dr. Peter Conmy and to elect its first officers.

D. Frank Monte, father of current member Charlie Monte, was elected the parlor's first president. Vice presidents were Roy Bunt, Arthur Hicks and Stan Marincik, with Recording Secretary Walter Sterner, Financial Secretary Ed Fuselli and Treasurer Ken Edgar. With the preliminaries out of the way, the Native Sons—and the City of Fairfax—prepared for the formal institution of the parlor.

NEXT: September 21, 1949—Fairfax Parlor is born.




