




CITY OF NEW ORLEANS TRUCK AND OVERSIZED VEHICLE ROUTE MAP

Trucks and Oversized Vehicle Route Compliance

Education, Awareness, and Enforcement

Route Signage

- DPW surveying and installing/replacing signs along truck routes
- Engage stakeholders on locations and corridors that may require "No Truck Route" signage

311 Reporting

- Create oversize vehicle violation event in 311 system
- Determine desired data points for collection to support compliance and enforcement



Trucks and Oversized Vehicle Route Compliance

Education, Awareness, and Enforcement

Permits

- Modify online Oversize Vehicle permit to ensure collection of company names
- Distribute route map and regulations to all current and future permit holders (one-time and annual)

Educational Outreach

- Distribute route map and regulations to all Orleans (or regionally) based oversize vehicle operators
- Public engagement through Council Offices and Neighborhood Engagement on reporting violations

Enforcement

- Short term: targeted enforcement informed by stakeholder and community input
- Ongoing: targeted enforcement informed by 311 reports
