Did You Know...

- ▶ The majority of drownings occur in residential pools while children are unattended
- ▶ For every child who drowns, four others are hospitalized for near drownings, and as many as three suffer brain damage
- ▶ Fifteen percent of children admitted for near drownings die in the hospital
- ▶ Typical medical costs for a near-drowning victim can range from \$75,000 for initial emergency room treatment to \$180,000 a year for long-term care. While a near drowning that results in brain damage can ultimately cost more than \$4.5 million
- ▶ Unprotected in-ground pools are 83 percent more likely to be involved in a drowning than pools with complete four-sided isolation fencing

Home Safety Tips

1. SUPERVISE:

Never take your eyes off children in and around water.

2. USE BARRIERS:

Fences, self-closing/self-latching gates and secured doors with alarms can prevent young children from wandering into the pool. Check for broken or missing drain covers.

3. LEARN TO SWIM:

To stay safer in the water, all family members should learn to swim well.

4. KNOW HOW TO RESPOND:

Get training in basic water rescue skills, first aid and CPR. Have rescue equipment and a phone by the pool. Immediately phone 911 and begin CPR.
