- 1 bolt of white
- A stack of 108" measured pieces from quilts
- 18 yds Polka Dots (donated from JL's stash)
- 1 bolt of batik (donated from JL's stash)
- and more bolts inbound

Star Spangled Beauty fabrics, Jelly Rolls, Fat Q. Layer Cakes and blender yardage was ordered over the winter and other more deep burlap blenders should arrive by Dec/Jan.

This is an on going annual process as we strive to meet the goals and interests of the group.

Silicon Valley Finances

Quilts of Valor Foundation SILICON VALLEY QOV - 589



As of June15th, 2025

Reports come out monthly around the 15th of the month and are generally about 1 month behind.

TOTAL \$1394.54 6/15/25

Its important to note funds held in our QOV Foundation 589 account for 2024/25, mainly were derived from the 2 Fabric Vault Fundraisers held in '23/'24, the '24 5K Walk-A-Thon, and \$300.00 from Dignity Memorial. We received funds from our QOV Boutique as well as generous donations from our members. Occasionally a QOV recipient donates.

We have not received any Grant Funds for several years. We are largely self-supported at this time. This may be our last Rodeo folks.....

For several years Silicon Valley Group funds have supported the National Sew Day QOV Quilt Kits supplied to our members. These kits contained supplies for a complete quilt top, backing, pattern and a label.

We will able to do this once again for the National Sew Day (NSD) in February 2026. The NSD26 team is already planning stages - utilizing brand new patriotic fabric, layer cakes, jelly rolls and fat quarters and fabric from local quilt shops and as well as our 589 group fabric that has been recently ordered. Members who renew in September will receive their "Liberty Ticket 2026" during our Fall Sew Day. Which maybe redeemed for (1) 2 yard cut wide-back and label. "Non-Sewing" members may wish to redirect their "Liberty Ticket".

Post Cards have been ordered and our Spoonflower labels. Labels & Post Cards are offered at no charge.

Additional 2 yard cuts of 108" wide-back fabric will are offered (as a courtesy) to our members for a nominal fee as a donation to our QOV Silicon Valley 589. This supports our group!

Backings are \$ 25.00 each and George and Anne comprise the backing team.

Preference is for direct donation using a credit card via QR Code followed by or checks made out to the QOV Foundation with Silicon Valley 589 on the memo line.

Donations made to QOV 589 are tax deductible also!

Members are responsible for supplying heir own fabric for tops (beyond the supplied NSD kits). We each have our own tastes and interest in fabric design. Silicon Valley QOV has very limited "donated fabrics" on hand.
