Arrive in Honolulu and check-in to your hotel or vacation rental

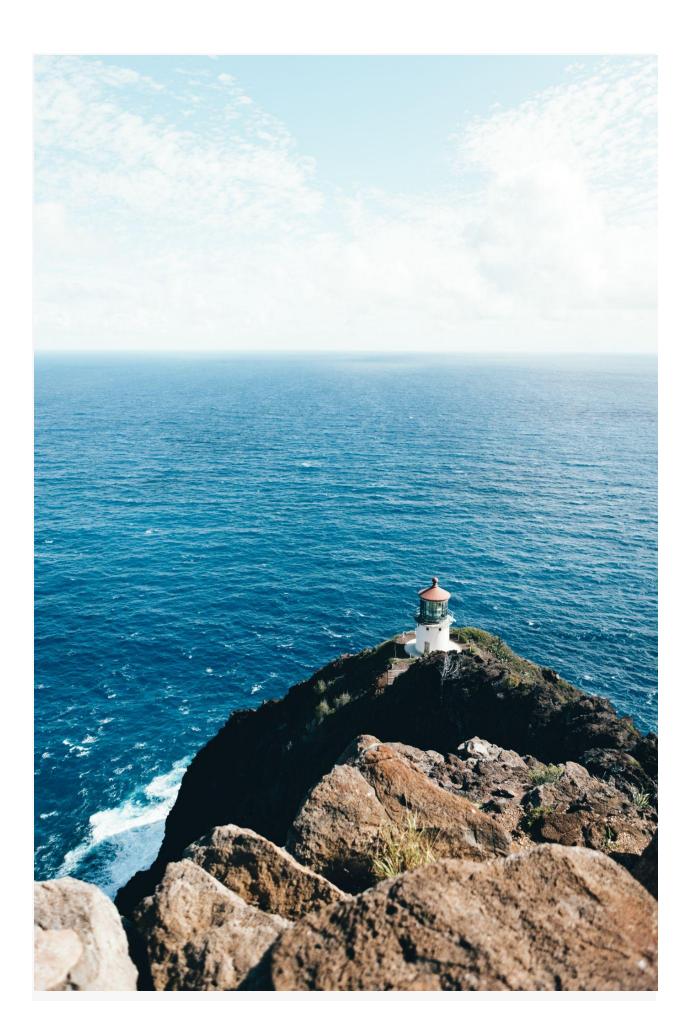

Enjoy a family-friendly dinner at a local restaurant

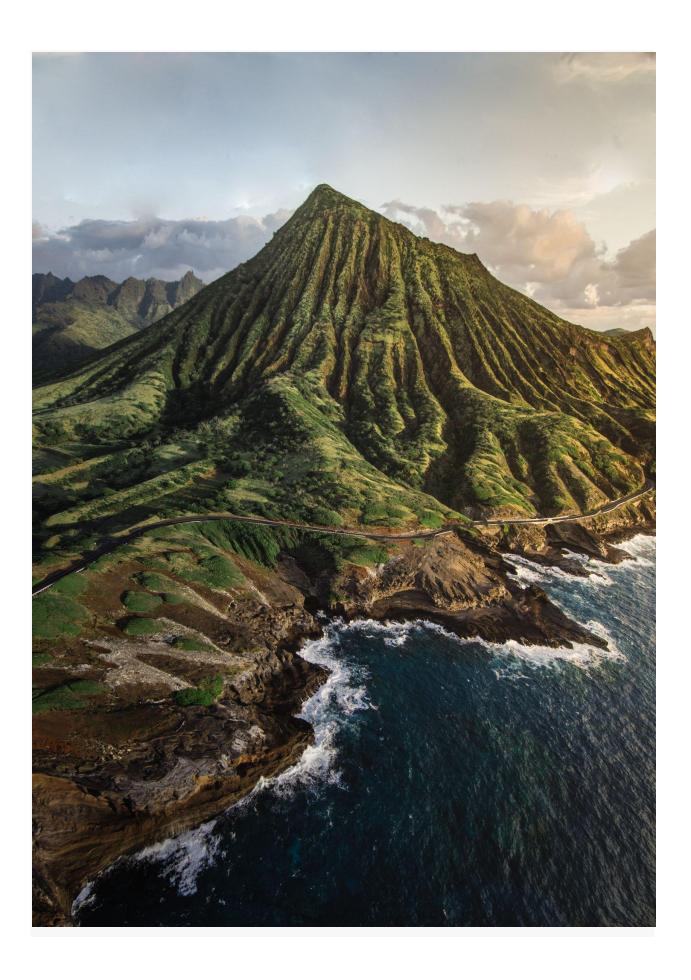


We would recommend Sky Waikiki for an amazing sunset view, or you can't go wrong with Marugame Udon.

Day 6:

Explore the Koko Crater Trail, if you can't make it up, you can only go part way up with the children to take in the panoramic views of the island. Be warned this hike is not an easy one, but with a bit of resilience and cold water, it's totally possible.



Another amazing option is just across the street at hanauma bay ridge. This one is a bit different than hanauma bay itself as its the ridge above, overlooking the beautiful bay.



Take a turtle canyon catamaran and let the kids snorkel with the turtles. It will be a memory nobody will ever forget.



Day 7:

Head to the east side of the island to the Botanical Gardens. The name is Hoomaluhia. It's a great idea to bring snacks or pick-up food on the way and have a picnic there. The views are amazing!
