History

The Club began on May 25, 1950 and convened on the second floor of the old Borough Building on Market Street in Camp Hill. There were 67 young women who were interested in joining the Club. These women were all residents of Camp Hill. By the second year, we had to relocate and moved to various locations in the Borough. In October, 1996 we returned to a brand-new Borough Building.

By the mid 1950's, the membership was opened to women in surrounding communities and the membership grew to approximately 215 members by 1954-1955. It continued to grow to 300 members by 1959 with a waiting list.

The object of the Club was and still is to develop educational, civic, and social interests of its members, and to contribute to the communities throughout the area. It has continued to be a philanthropic organization since the very beginning with many fundraising projects.

It has taken much planning, organization and energy over the years to make the Club as successful as it is today. If you talk to any of the older members of our Club you will learn of the many projects that helped make the Club successful.

Today, the Club is active in the Camp Hill community. Our primary objective is to raise money through fundraisers for our Philanthropic giving to local charities through lasagna and soup sales, as well as our yearly Bingo games. We have participated in the Annual Camp Hill Parade of Lights and the Memorial Day Parade.
