Grace from God is one of the greatest gift we will ever receive. I spent some thinking about that reality for those of us who have decided to follow Jesus. It's the most compelling part of the gospel story for many people. It's such a unique concept to be forgiven by our Creator and an idea that needs constant exploration.

The question on my mind over the weekend was this: Since I've received grace, how then should I pass it along to others? Going along with this question is the thought about how freely God chooses to bestow it upon us. Ephesians 2:8-9 says, "God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it." This understanding of grace lets us know there is nothing we can do to earn what God readily gives.

Because of this understanding of grace, I am compelled to act in the same manner as I seek to practice the example of the Lord. One way I am striving to become more gracious is by assuming the best in the people with whom I come into contact.

Two things can happen when we assume the best in people. The first thing is they may rise up to face a new challenge. This has been a helpful idea in my parenting style over the years. Raising children is a difficult task, but I want them to know I believe in them! I try my best to lead with trust with our daughters. I've found when I do this in the midst of a challenging parenting situation, they are able to discern the right way to handle things on their own.

The other thing that happens is they get to witness an example of God's grace. By giving away what I've received from the Lord freely, I am providing a powerful witness to the testimony of Jesus. I view withholding judgement in this same vein. Extending kindness through assuming the best in people is a great way to show them the love of Christ. People are more likely to be receptive to the gospel when it's presented in a way that proves we have soft hearts.

I hope these thoughts are helpful for you as the week goes by. I'm praying for restoration to move through our church body. Have a great week.
