This month we have been going through the series “Wisdom 2024: A Leadership Series”. This series is something that I had tasked the elders with earlier this year. Each year I have asked them, I give them a theme to go off of and what comes from that time in study is what you have heard and will hear on Sunday morning. This month, they were tasked to spend time in the Psalms and to choose a specific psalm to preach from.

The Psalm is a wonderful part of the Bible. There is a lot that can be said on the Psalms. The Psalms “might well be called a little Bible. In it is comprehended most beautifully and briefly everything that is in the entire Bible. It is really a fine enchiridion or handbook” (Luther, Luther’s Works, 35:254).

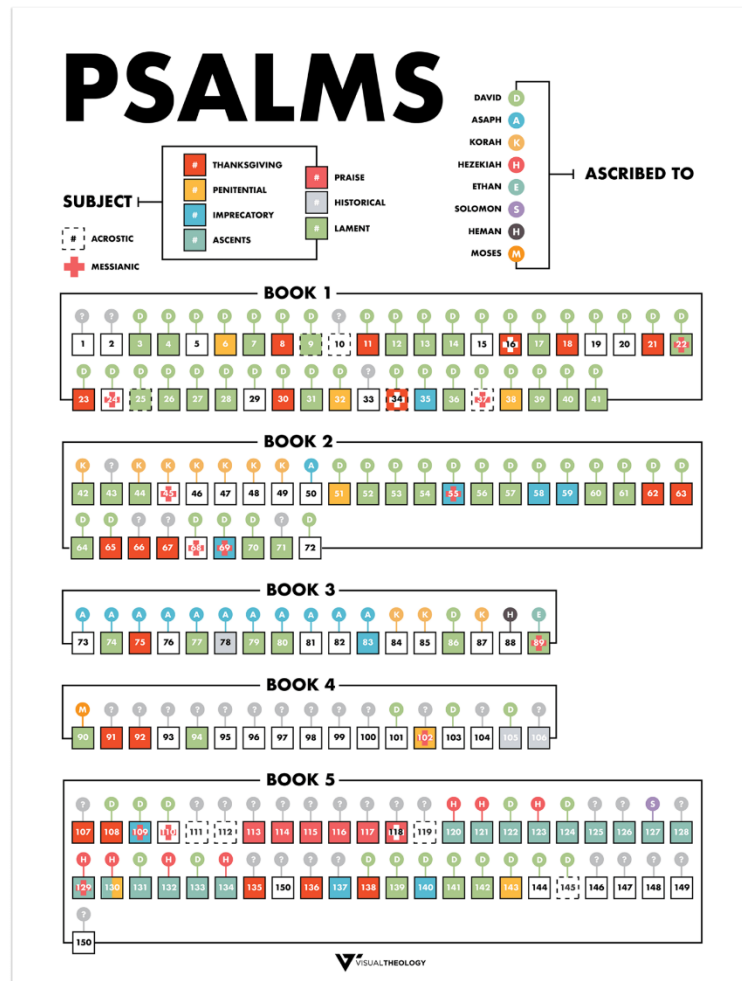
“The Psalter occupies a unique place in the Holy Scriptures. It is God’s Word and, with a few exceptions, the prayer of men as well” (Bonhoeffer, Life Together, p. 44)

There are a lot of unique ways to approach the book of Psalms and the collection of songs and poetry that are within. Something that we sometimes overlook is that a lot of these psalms were meant to be sung. Some psalms are poetic theology being poured out emotionally, spiritually and physically to God as gifts of praise, worship, pleas and more. This collection within the Bible has 150 chapters of unique and insightful messages that to go through them all would take over three years of preaching! (maybe one day)

So, as we enter into our last couple of weeks in the Psalms together, I wanted to show you this neat chart that I found while writing up this morning’s trumpet. Full disclosure, I have not fully checked into the accuracy of every detail in this image but from what I know, it looks good in giving a good comprehensive image of the Psalms. I’d love for you to spend time the remainder of this month learning more about the Psalms and how to incorporate their teachings into your daily meditation.
