This morning, my Scripture reading, and meditation were from Esther 3 and Revelation 22.

In Esther chapter three, I see foreboding darkness in the background. I perceive that a powerful fallen angel is directing a man with a historical generational grudge against the Jews and a king endorsing the extermination of a racial/cultural group without investigation. The man is Haman the Agagite—many Bible scholars agree Agagite is a shortened term for Amalekite (See 1 Sam 14-15 for the historical grudge), and the King is Xerxes I. The date was around 486 BC.

God already had a plan to save the apple of his eye and protect the linage of Jesus. We also see spiritual elements working behind the scenes in Daniel 10. And, yes, they still do their work in leaders, nations, and people (Rom 8.37-39 and Eph 6.12) today.

HOPE! Darkness will be a thing to the past, and all will be light in the new creation. So, I chose Rev 22.5 for meditation.

3 No longer will there be anything accursed, but the throne of God and the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him. 4 They will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. <u>5 And night will be no more.</u> They will need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.
