I received a box in the mail from a first cousin I have not seen since 1968. In it were photographs from 1905 through the 1950s from my Father's side of the family. Dad was born in 1933 and was raised on a small family farm in Perry County, Ohio. When I showed the box to him, he knew everyone in the photos. (Thanks for filling in the blanks, Dad.) Along with the photos was a locket with pictures of a man and a woman. The locket belonged to his Mother, and the images were of her and my Grandfather. A pocket watch, given to my Grandfather "on the occasion of his 21st Birthday," was the biggest surprise. There were also many letters from 1916, a broach and ring belonging to one of Dad's Aunts.

This past Friday, my best friend gave me a leather-bound American Translation of the King James Bible published in 1827. He did not remember how he acquired it but thought I would like it. Yes, I love it!

The third gift was given to me by the Goodbar's. I asked them several years ago to get a miniature statue of the Stature of Liberty. The Goodbar's have children living in Brooklyn and I asked them to pick one up for me on one of their visits. My mother was born in Manhattan and raised in Brooklyn. I went to visit the Statue of Liberty when I was in kindergarten.

I told Sandra that this completed a set for me. On my desk is a souvenir rock with the year 1620 inscribed on it. My Father's family came over in 1620 on a ship called the Mayflower, and my mother's family came over from Hungary in 1906, and they processed through Ellis Island.

Yes, unexpected gifts are the best! Grace is a gift I did not expect. I was in the trap of works and legalism, trying to win the uphill battle of more good works than bad to earn a pass into heaven.
