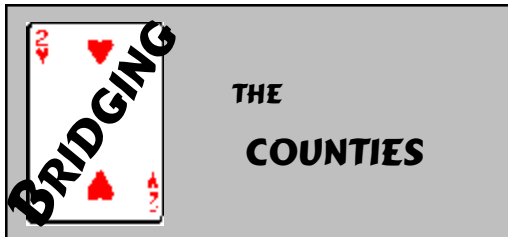

You may have noticed something I deliberately omitted from the job requirements: bridge skills. It does not matter if you are a Flight A or a Newplicate player.

The Editor also normally serves on the WCBA Board of Directors. Attending board meetings is an important way to know what needs to be included in here. There are only 4 to 5 Board meetings a year, for a few hours on Saturday mornings.

At The Hilton Rye Town, January 12-18, we will be running The Golden Opportunity Pairs. Brand new for District 3, this event is exclusively for players with 0-750 MPs. No hot shots in this event, and it's a two session Gold Point Event. In order to win gold you must play both sessions. Overall awards for the top strat and section tops for the top strat give gold points. This event will be on Friday, January 19th. One session entries are permitted. At the end of the year, it's rime to thank others who make bridge successful in District 3. Besides those in other units that you don't know, I want to thank our Regional Tournament Staff. Changes to the Closed Westchester Tournament

There two changes to the Closed Westchester Tournament this year. The complete schedule appears on page 1 of this issue of *Bridging the Counties*.

The first change is that that the tournament has a new name. The tournament is now called the "Winter in Westchester Tournament."

The other change is to the schedule. The Friday evening game has been moved up to 6:30 PM. Otherwise the schedule is the same as last year's.

Saturday's schedule is the same as last year's. There is no game in the evening. Breakfast, lunch, and cocktails with hors d'oeuvres will be served. You may participate in either or both sessions on Saturday without the meals. If you want to eat at Riverview, the morning session comes with breakfast and lunch, while the afternoon session comes with lunch and cocktails with hors d'oeuvres. Season's Greetings



2009 WCBA Double Knockout Results

The 2009 WCBA Double Knockout has concluded early. In all three brackets, undefeated teams defeated once-defeated teams, ending the knockouts a month earlier than anticipated. All three brackets crowned their winners in October.

Tournament organizer Mike McNamara reported that things were a lot smoother this year. The “must play dates” and his offer to resolve scheduling problems seemed to work to get every match scheduled on time with a minimum of problems.

In Bracket A, the Meadow team (Roberta Meadow, Rick Zucker, Mike McNamara, Sylwia McNamara, and David Yates) defeated Rich Laufer’s team.

Convention Hall

Many people use Texas transfers over a 1NT opening. The convention is designed to be used over interference. But at least two interesting situations can arise when the opponents interfere.

Does Texas apply over interference at the 3 level? There are three possible answers to this question. 1) Texas does apply, and Stayman is lost. 2) No Texas, a cuebid is Stayman, and other bids are natural. 3) For scientists with detailed agreements, Texas is used with a 4♣ bid used for Stayman.

If the opponents overcall in a known major (ex: 2♥ shows hearts, or 2♠ shows spades and a minor), what does a transfer into the known major mean? Consider the sequence of 1NT - 2♠ - 4♥???. Again, this is not covered by the basic convention and depends on partnership agreement. Option 1 is that it breaks the Texas sequence, and is a slam try in the other major that demands a cue-bid by opener. (4♦ is a sign-off in 4♥.) Option 2 actually demands that the 1NT bidder complete the transfer. Responder can pass to reveal a psychic bid, or bid on as a slam try with the transfer serving as an advance cue bid. Thus the sequence: 1NT - 2♠ - 4♥ - Pass

4♠ - Pass - 5♦

is a slam try in diamonds with responder having already made a cuebid showing a spade control.

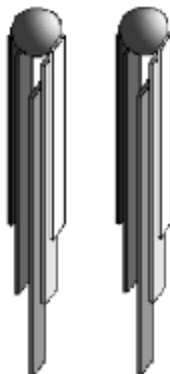

Bridge to Success

A new column intended for beginning to intermediate players

To start this column for beginning and intermediate players, I thought I would share some of my experiences with conventions which many experience players consider essential. At first it was hard to understand why I needed to remember all this information which rarely seemed to come up. However, as I progressed I realized that I would improve my bidding if I used conventions to increase my understanding of partner's hand.

An example of such a convention is the reverse. This occurs when the opener re-bids a suit at the two level which is higher ranking than the first bid suit. The advantages to the convention are that it gives partner the specific information you have a strong hand (16+ points) which is unbalanced (usually 5 of the first suit and 4 of the second suit). Examples are:

1♣ - 1♠ and 1♣ - 1♠
2♥ 2♦

A reverse is forcing for one round and allows you to figure out what partner has in order to further guide your response.

This explains why you use an important convention like a reverse. A problem can arise if you don't recall that your partner is using one. For example, I have missed the reverse several times, much to the chagrin of various partners. However, I still think that it should not be discarded because the rewards can be significant. With practice, it will eventually become second nature.

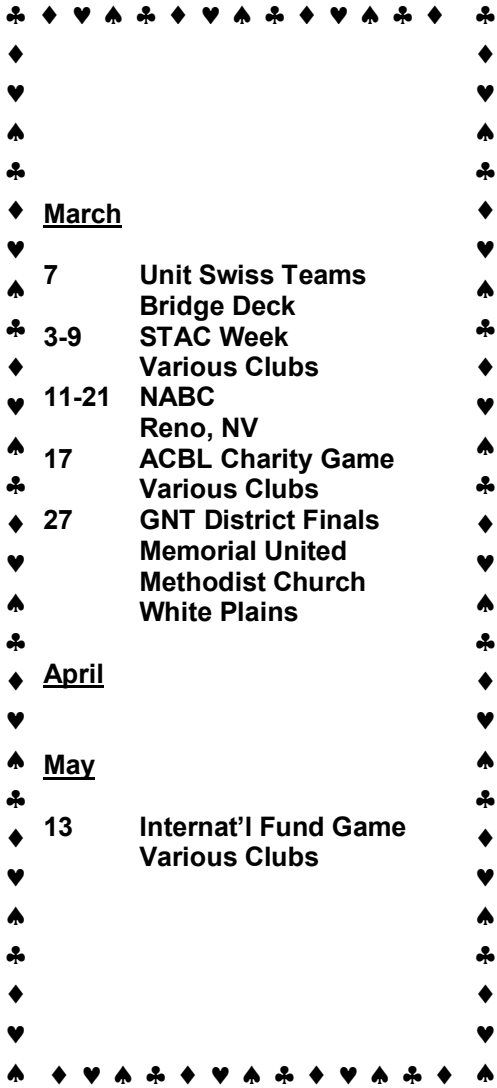
