Editor's Corner



In response to the last issue of *Bridging the Counties*, I received an e-mail from Carlos Munoz about several things that I had printed. I want to share the discussions that we had.

The first had to do with the masterpoint totals that were printed for the Top 100. Carlos realized that his point total shown was as of October 1, 2008, not November 1, 2008. This perplexed me. I had gotten the information from the ACBL on November 1. I had previously checked my masterpoint total at the MyACBL web portal, and confirmed that the October points had been recorded. So I thought I had the latest information when I typed it up.

Well, it turns out that the ACBL does something funny with the recording. Yes, your masterpoints are recorded on your individual records immediately. But the ACBL keeps (at least!) a quadruple set of books. When I got the masterpoint holdings for the Unit members, the records of the Unit roster's masterpoints had not been updated. Nor were the records for the Mini-McKenney or Ace of Clubs races updated. These three sources of information don't actually get updated until the 6th or 7th of each month. Now I know.

This discovery only happened by accident. Carlos knew that he had reached

Diamond Life Master in October. But his point total that I published still put him at Gold Life Master. If not for this coincidence, nobody would have noticed the discrepancy. And congratulations to Carlos on his achievement of making Diamond Life Master.

The other big point of discussion had to do with the ribbon qualifications. Carlos was surprised to learn that Blue Ribbon qualifications were awarded in Flight B events. This led to some research into what constituted Flight B.

In years past, it was simple. There were only three stratifications, and fewer events. Flight C went up to about 300 masterpoints, and depending on the event Flight B was up to around 1,500 MPs. This made some sense, as to award gold points and Blue Ribbons Flight B had to have an upper masterpoint limit of at least 750. First and second in Flights A and B won Blue Ribbons, while first and second in Flight C won Red Ribbons.

But then came masterpoint inflation, bracketed team games, and stratiflighted games. Masterpoint limits were raised (look at the WCBA Bob Katz Spring Sectional - Flight C is up to 1,000 MPs). So at regionals more Blue Ribbons are being handed out all around as a result of the new events.

This N' That From Your District Director

District 3's first Regional of the year -The Hilton Rye Town - was a challenge for all who weathered the snow, ice, extreme cold, problems with the food service in the restaurant on the first night, bathrooms being renovated on the Westchester Ballroom level, a rock slide on 287 and other inconveniences. Kudos to the super directing staff who made it possible for all the latecomers to get into the game, to the caddies and our volunteer staff including Mimi Bieber, tournament chair, Gina Tamres, Pairing and Hospitality for the Seniors and Newplicate, Tanya Reyes Hiller, Judith Chaice, Kassie Munoz, Linda Otness, Dick Kraner, Rhoda Levine, Barbara Skluth and scores of others who contributed to the success of this tournament. Since we now use preduplicated boards (and our machine does not require bar coded cards) we were able to add in any number of pairs and they would still all play the same hands keeping the contest as it should be. And yes – in spite of the inclement weather and other problems the tournament ran over 2000 tables. Special thanks to all of you players who ventured out to support this wonderful Regional. The District also wants to thank the Hartes Club, the Bridge Deck, and the other clubs in this Unit for closing during the tournament.

Many of you were at the Boston NABC this past November and know

what a great tournament it was. While the table count was a bit under estimate largely due, we think, to the economy, the host group provided us with super hospitality and entertainment, and the playing conditions were outstanding. And of course, the city of Boston offers great sightseeing and terrific restaurants. All in all, a wonderful place to host an NABC.

At the National Board of Directors meetings in Boston, the Board gave Management the go-ahead to buy land and erect a building in the Memphis area. I should have more to report on this after our meetings in the spring. The Board is looking at adding a new event to the Spring Schedule at NABC's starting 2010: the Platinum Pairs. A six session NABC+ event that will require either 50 platinum points earned in the last 3 years or 200 lifetime platinum points. For those who don't know platinum points can only be earned in NABC+ events that are held at NABC's. The feeling is that the Blue Ribbon Pairs is no longer as exclusive as it was and this would be a truly exclusive event. If the Scheduling Committee can find a really good place to put it into the schedule it will become a part of the Spring Schedule. More than 1,000 players are eligible to participate in the prestigious event. In order to come close to a break even budget, the Board passed an increase in

entry fees at NABCs. NABC+ events will now be \$20 a session, up from \$18. All other events will go up by 50 cents a session. The ACBL has a new Marketing Director, Vicki Campbell and a new Youth Director, Patty Tucker. We are expecting big things from both of them.

As the New Year begins it is only fitting to thank two members of your Unit who serve on the District Board -Carlos Munoz who is the District Treasurer and works tirelessly and without complaint and manages to keep a group of volunteers pretty much in line with their spending, and Mimi Bieber who is not only the secretary for the District but as I mentioned in this article is also the tournament chairman for the largest regional in our District. While Jeff Allen is not on our Board he has been doing the District audits for many years and has also helped us with our Financial statements from time to time.

Don't forget the GNT Finals at the United Memorial Methodist Church here in White Plains on April 4 and our two upcoming regionals: in Saratoga Springs, June 15-21, and Fairfield, NJ, June 29-July 5. There are plenty of gold points and fun almost in your own backyard.

Changes to the WCBA Spring Sectional

Significant changes have been made to the WCBA Bob Katz Spring Sectional this year. Although the full schedule is on page 1 of this issue of Bridging the Counties, an explanation of the changes is detailed here.

Like last year, there will be three sessions on Friday. There will not be a Women's Pairs on Friday afternoon. The Friday evening game time has been moved up from 7:30 to 7:00 PM. Additionally, the Friday evening open session will be an IMP Pairs, while the newplicate game will still be scored at

matchpoints.

In prior years, the Saturday open games were two separate single-session events. For people who have fewer than 2,500 masterpoints, there are single session B/C/D pair games. There will also be a separate stratiflighted A/X pairs game open to everyone. While the A/X game is a two-session event, you can sign up to play in only one session. For those pairs who sign up for both sessions initially, there will be overall awards given. Besides the higher overall

awards, additional points will be awarded because it is an International Fund Game.

There is no newplicate Swiss on Sunday. For players with under 2,500 MPs, there will be a Bracketed Round Robin Teams. So newer players will still be competing only against newer players. There will also be an open A/X Swiss Teams.

In conformity with the scheduling changes, the masterpoint levels of the various flights have also been adjusted.

2009 WCBA Double KO Entry & Conditions of Contest

Come join the more than 125 players that played in last year's Double KO. A Double KO is a knockout event similar those run at regional tournaments, with a few differences. First, it takes two losses to get knocked out of the event, not one. Second, instead of being played in one or two days during a tournament, the event runs from April until October with each team playing one match per month. The two teams schedule their match at a time and place that is convenient for them, allowing a lot of flexibility. There will be 3 brackets: (one top bracket, one for players under 2500 mps, and one for players under 1000 mps). Any team can request to play in a higher bracket. A team that qualifies for a lower bracket can also choose to simultaneously play in one or both higher brackets. The event is sectionally rated and the points count toward the Player of the Year race. You can view the full conditions of contest, brackets and results for last year at http://www.bridge-wcba.com or the Coordinator Mike McNamara's personal website: http://mjad.com/bridge. The entry is \$48 per team. Teams will also have to pay a fee to the club for any match they play at a club. Teams must have at least 4 players and may have 5 or 6 players to make scheduling easier. Entries are due by March 23, 2009.

There are a few changes this year. The limit for Bracket 3 has been moved up to 1,000 MPs, and up to 2,500 MPs for Bracket 2. The WCBA Unit Board voted to institute firm must-play dates. Each month the coordinator will pick a date and time by which each match must be played. If the teams cannot agree on a date prior to the must-play date, then the match must be played on the must-play date at the time indicated. The must-play dates will be dates at the end of each month at a time when one of the participating clubs is holding a regularly scheduled game. If one or both teams fails to field a team on the must-play date, then one or both teams will forfeit that match. Given the new must-play date structure, the Coordinator will be available to try to help teams find a date to play. If you reach the 15th of the month or if you have tried already and cannot find a date, captains are encouraged to contact the Coordinator so that he can help find a date for the match to be played.

Ruffing Air

Opening lead: ♥Q

Analyze the opening lead in light of the bidding. How many spades does East have? Does East have a red-suit void? Does West have 6 hearts?

Since West didn't lead a spade, he is void, and East has 8 spades. Since East didn't double for an unusual lead, he doesn't have a red-suit void. If West had \(\psi QJ10983\), he would have overcalled 2\(\psi\) at his first turn.

So what is the danger? The only danger is that West has all 4 clubs. Since East has 8 spades, this will happen almost 1/4 of the time. If West is forced to lead clubs, his club winner will disappear.

Win the \bigvee K (East doesn't have a void), and cash the \bigstar A (East discards a spade). Lead a diamond to the \bigstar A. (Cashing 2 more diamonds to discard a spade and a heart is optional.) Now lead a spade towards the \bigstar A. If West ruffs a loser, there are 12 tricks, so he discards a diamond. Win the \bigstar A, cross back to the \bigvee A, and cash the remaining diamonds (discarding a total of 2 spades and 1 heart).

Lead another spade, again giving West a chance to ruff a loser (in which case you would discard dummy's last heart). So West must discard a heart. You ruff, and exit with a heart. West is forced to win, and lead out of his *JT7 depriving him of his trump trick.

Giving an opponent a chance to ruff a loser is a useful technique.

Convention Hall - Advanced Reverse Drury

By Ron Fischer

(Editor's Note: In the December 2005 and March 2006 issues of *Bridging the Counties*, Convention Hall columns by Ron Fischer were printed about Advanced Reversed Drury. This column updates the convention as described therein. It is completely self-contained, and there is no need to refer to the prior articles. Also note that this is a Mid-Chart convention.)

Why Play Drury?

After a third hand opening, responder may want to invite game. Unfortunately, a 3-level response may not be safe, especially if responder only has 3 trumps. A 2. response to a third hand major suit opening asks if opener is interested in game.

This gives up a 2* response as a natural bid. The tradeoff is well worth it.

Is there any advantage to have responder use 2 ◆ to show 4 trumps? No, it is a disadvantage. If opener has no interest in game even opposite 4 trumps, then why tell the opponents you have 9 trumps? It is a mathematical certainty that if one side has 9 trumps, the other side has at least an 8-card fit, so balancing is easier. You also give up a natural 2 ◆ response.

ENTER ADVANCED REVERSE DRURY

In Reverse Drury, opener re-bids two of his major with no game interest, and re-bids $2 \spadesuit$ (artificial) when there is game interest. This frees up $2 \blacktriangledown$ to show a distributional hand with both majors and no game interest after a $1 \spadesuit$ opener. As other meanings of a $2 \blacktriangledown$ re-bid are possible, be sure to discuss this with partner.

When is Reverse Drury used? After any third or fourth seat opener where 2* is a legal bid. It is on in competition.

It is also used where partner opens in first or second seat, and right hand opponent doubles. A re-double then denies 3-card support. Make sure that you and your partner understand that a 2* bid by an unpassed hand over a double shows exactly 3-card support (and check this box on your convention card). The use of a re-double in this manner makes it easier to later double the opponents in a 2-level contract when the doubler has made a takeout double based on high card points without a lot of distribution.

Since a response of 2 • to Reverse Drury is always artificial and expressing interest in game, let's talk about the continuations. Assume a 1 • opener in third seat, and a 2 • response.

- 2♥=No game interest. Responder should raise with 5+ hearts. Pass with 4 hearts. Otherwise correct to 2S.
- 2. No game interest. Pass is the only call responder should make. Do not defeat Reverse Drury by bidding again unless there is competition.

- 2 \(= \text{Asks for 4-card support and further description.} \)
 - 2 ●=4 hearts and 3 spades. If opener re-bids 2S that ends the auction.
 - 2 = 3 spades and fewer than 4 hearts.

If responder has only 3 spades, if opener signs off in 24, he does not go beyond 2S no matter how good his hand is.

Holding 4 spades, responder then shows an outside 4-card suit. So:

- 3 = 4 + clubs, 4 spades
- $3 \leftarrow = 4 + \text{diamonds}, 4 \text{ spades}$
- 3 **v**=4+ hearts, 4 spades
- 3♠=Exactly 4-3-3-3 distribution.
- 2NT=4-card support and a singleton. Do not make this bid with only 3-card support. This is not a natural call, and is the most frequent error made by responder. A 3♣ bid then asks where the singleton is. The responses vary slightly depending if opener bid 1♥ or 1♠:

Over 1♥	Over 1 🛦
3 ◆=1 diamond	3 ◆=1 diamond
3 ♥ =1 club	3 v =1 heart
3♠=1 spade	3 ▲ =1 club

(An alternative method is that 3♦ shows 1 club, 3♥ shows 1 diamond, and 3♠ show 1 of the other major. This keeps the responses the same regardless of which major is opened.)

WHY GO THROUGH ALL THIS?

The number of points needed for a major suit game is 26 minus 3 points for every trump over 8 trumps. The extra distribution really comes into play when opener is at least 5-4-2-2, and responder has at least 7 HCP. For a discussion of the importance of distribution here, see "Short Suit Total" in *I Fought the Law* by Mike Lawrence and Anders Wirgren. A 5-4-2-2 hand with 13 HCP will often produce 10 tricks opposite 4 trumps, but only 8 tricks opposite 3 trumps. This is because when responder has the 4th trump there is less likelihood of a trump loser, and the fourth card of a side suit can be ruffed.

Reverse Drury is not used with 5-card support. Use Jacoby 2NT and Jordan 2NT instead. Since 20 points will normally produce a game if either partner has the extra distribution points, showing the extra trump via 2NT is more useful than using it as natural. 2 over 1 players can respond 1NT followed by 2NT to show 11-12 HCP.

When using 2NT in this way, keep the responses the same as Jacoby with one exception. If opener re-bids 3*, he has either no game interest or a singleton club. Responder is to sign off in 3 of the major. If opener has the singleton club, he will now cue-bid to force to game. A re-bid of 3 of the major by opener now does not deny game interest - it is a slam try!
