**Editor's
Corner**



After a recent club game, one hand generated a vigorous post-mortem.

The scoring is matchpoints. You are sitting South, in third seat, at unfavorable vulnerability, and pick up this hand:

♠AKJxx ♥KQxx ♦AK ♣xx

Although the exact details of the auction varied according to the table, North always opened the auction. Assuming a 15-17 range for a 1NT opener and playing 5-card majors, North opens 1♦. Slam is in the air.

Your first bid of 1♠ is easy. Partner re-bids 1NT, showing a balanced 12-14 points, and denying four spades.

First problem. Does partner deny holding three spades? Partnership agreements are important here. Typically with three spades and a balanced hand opener will re-bid 1NT, but opener would raise to 2♠ on an unbalanced hand or a hand otherwise lacking a good rebid.

Regardless of whether opener could have 3 spades, opener could well have four hearts. So you pull out 2♣ as a new minor forcing / checkback Stayman bid. In the post-mortem it was pointed out that 2♥ is not forcing in this sequence, so that is not a legitimate option.

Opener responds 2♠, showing three of them and a balanced hand. Second problem. Does opener deny holding 4 hearts? No.

Partner's first priority is to show 3-card support. A 2♥ response would deny holding 3 spades.

This is the third juncture, and where the standard auctions spun off in different directions.

A 3♥ bid now is forcing, and asks for 4-card heart support. This will elicit a 3NT response, saying opener is either 3-3-4-3, 3-2-4-4, 3-2-5-3, or 3-3-5-2.

Whether or not you bid 3♥ first, a Blackwood or Gerber sequence will reveal opener has one ace. If playing Keycard Gerber or Blackwood, you can discover partner has the queen - of either diamonds or spades, it turns out - and the club king.

Finally, knowing you are missing one ace, you have to sign off in a small slam. The critical decision: 6♠ or 6NT?

The form of scoring influenced me - 6NT scores more than 6♠. (Of course, my auction was also different: 1NT [11-14] - 2♣ - 2♦ - 6NT.) I also knew I had at most an eight card fit, not a nine card fit. Also, both hands were relatively balanced suggesting play in no-trump. Due to the diamond suit blocking, 6NT rolls while 6♠ fails on a bad break in a side suit. Partners hand:

♠Qxx ♥Axx ♦QJxx ♣KQx

Changes to the District 3 Grand National Teams

The District 3 finals for qualification for the Grand National teams will be held on March 24, 2007. The winners in each of the four flights will advance to the national finals at the summer NABC in Nashville, TN. No pre-qualification is required to compete in the Saturday portion of the district finals.

The four flights are the same as last year. For purposes of determining qualifications for flights, masterpoint totals as of September 1, 2006 will be used. All team members must be members of the ACBL and reside in District 3. Teams may consist of 4-6

players.

District 3 will give the qualifying team in each flight \$500 towards expenses and pay for their entry fees as long as they remain in this event. Unit 188 will not be contributing any additional subsidy.

The Championship Flight and Flight A will be single elimination knockouts to determine the winner. The ACBL Mid-Chart applies to the Championship Flight, but Flight A is limited to the ACBL General Convention Chart. The knockouts will start on March 24, and continue on March 25 if necessary.

Flights B and C will be contested in two-session Swiss Teams on March 24. The winners of the Swiss Teams will advance to the national finals. There is no event on March 25 for Flights B & C.

The location has also changed. The District Finals will be held at the Memorial United Methodist Church, 250 Bryant Avenue, White Plains, NY.

Roving Rosie

(Editor's note: Let's welcome Rosemary Boden to our

KISS ON THE CHEEK

It's the semi-finals of the bracketed compact KO's at the
New York City regional. My team has somehow found
itself in the top bracket where we have already survived a
three-way against the Cohen/Pollack team. We are now up
against a strong team from Long Island. The opponents
have reached 4♥, and I have the tight ♥QJ. I make an
innocuous opening lead, and dummy tables the stiff ♥K.
Declarer wins the opening lead, and leads a trump towards
the stiff ♥K. I drop my ♥Q. Declarer thinks, returns to his
hand, and plays the ♥A. My ♥J drops. Declarer stands up,
leans across the table, and kisses me on the cheek. Play
continues. In the end game, declarer leads towards
dummy, eschews the spade finesse, forgets to cash
dummy's good diamond, and gives me my ♠K.
Whereupon I leaned across the table and gave him a kiss
on his cheek.

We won our semi-final match, only to succumb to the
superior strength of Cohen/Pollack. But what can you
expect when it's 35,000 masterpoints versus 5,000?

Ah, the joys of bridge. Playing in the top bracket was
not a first for me. I had the good fortune to play against
Jade Barrett a few years ago. Although he didn't kiss me,
he demonstrated the same joie de vivre as the Long Island
declarer. I ran into Marc Jacobus at a Florida regional, and
told him how much I enjoyed my day playing against him
in the Spingold. He said that he considers it his **JOB**
to ensure that everyone at the table has a good time. I only
wish we could all be this considerate, all the time at the
table.

One of my partners at the Ft. Lauderdale Bridge Club
always plays with a twinkle in his eye. And when he
successfully works out where a missing card is, and his
opponent duly comes up with it, he chuckles and says, "So
you have the queen, you rascal."

He wasn't quite so lucky on another deal. My partner
opened 1NT (15-17 HCP). RHO overcalled 2♥, DONT,
showing hearts and spades. I doubled, penalty oriented.
That ended the auction, and 5 minutes later we were
+1100. I think this is an excellent argument against stolen
bid (mirror) doubles. If we allow the opponents to enter
our auctions without fear of penalty, they will be in our
face stealing part scores.

I can hear you asking, "How good was your hand?"
About 8 or 9 HCP, not enough for game. We have about
24 HCP compared to their 16 HCP. My double is based
more on strength than on relevant cards. Sometimes they
will make their contract, but most of the time we will score
a big profit, especially if they are vulnerable.
