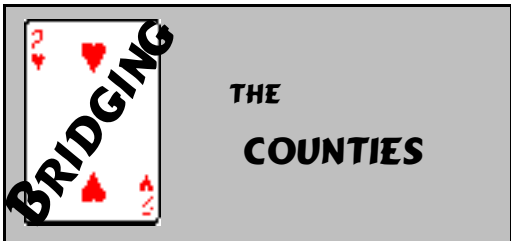

Editor's  
Corner



I have a confession to make. Back in the June 2004 issue of *Bridging the Counties*, I wrote a whole Convention. Hall article on making sure that you and your partner were on the same wavelength regarding conventions. Recently I did not take my own advice.

After that article, I played in was a knockout teams match at the NABC in New York City. Our teammates had agreed to play Smolen over INT openings. Nothing more was said at that time. They had a misunderstanding as to what bids were forcing in a Smolen sequence, and wound up playing in a part score when game was cold. We lost that match by 1 IMP.

So in Danbury I played with a new partner for the first time. We were pressed for time as we filled out a card, so we didn't have time for a lot of discussion. We agreed to play Smolen over INT openings, with nothing more said at that time.

Of course it comes up early in the match. I'm stuck sitting at the table, trying to decide what a bid means, whether it's forcing, and what will happen to me if I pass my partner's forcing bid? I was not feeling good, knowing that I was going to have to defend whatever decision I made. I passed what was meant as a forcing bid, generating raised eyebrows from the three other people

at the table. Fortunately for me, game was not making.

This illustrates the importance of partnership discussion and understandings. Fortunately for me, she was understanding about my problem. She didn't complain about what I did. At a break, I explained why I passed, and we cleared up our agreement. And she had a good laugh about the Smolen disaster at the NABC when I told her about it.

One agreement we did have time to make was on our level of aggressiveness. We agreed to be very aggressive in the bidding. My comment at the time was, "I don't like to tell my partners to pass."

Later, in second seat she overcalled 1♥ with 1♠ at favorable vulnerability with this hand:

- ♠ K x x x x
- ♥ 10
- ♦ x x x
- ♣ Q J 9 8

It's not everyone's cup of tea (the same bid was made at the other table), but it was meant more to disrupt the opponents' bidding than anything else. Fortunately, I remembered our agreement on aggressiveness and didn't bury us in a no-play game with my monster hand. Because I knew our agreement, we won that match by 3 IMPs.

## This N' That From Your District Director

This fall there were two major bridge events sponsored by District 3 and both were very successful. The North American Pairs District Finals, held in Mahwah, NJ, attracted 52 tables, an increase of almost 20 tables over last year. This was in spite of the tail end of one of the famous hurricanes in our neck of the woods that morning. At the end of the tough two-session event, the Unit had winning pairs in both Flight A and Flight B. Congratulations to Al Stauber and Carlos Munoz, and Sylwia and Michael McNamara. These two pairs, along with Laura Brill and Rick Goldstein who also qualified in the Open Flight, will be representing District 3 in the championships at the Pittsburgh NABC. District 3 has never taken 1st place in this event, so we're rooting hard for a win.

Our second success this fall was the regional in Danbury, CT at the Sheraton. The proximity to most parts of our Unit made this an almost perfect location for us. We are all very blasé

about the beautiful fall foliage, but if you happened to look while you were playing or on the drive there or back, you might have seen one of the more beautiful autumns. Moving this tournament out of the mountains just about doubled our attendance. We again thank the New England District for allowing us to use this site. We'll be back again next year, a week earlier in October.

The ACBL has reached an agreement with Edge TV to televise a bridge program. This is expected to begin midway through 2005, with a minimum of 14 hours. At the moment, no agreement has been reached on the format, but it is expected to be non-tournament play. Some of you may remember when there was a Goren Show on TV many years ago, which met with reasonable success. We are optimistic about getting bridge televised into the homes of millions of people.

This year is ending on the up side

for bridge. The ACBL is reporting revenues in excess of expenses for the first 8 months of 2004 to be \$104,000. Regional attendance is up slightly, while Sectional attendance is down slightly. STACs are up a bit. Our membership totals continue to have a small but steady increase. For the new year, we should each make a resolution to sign up one new ACBL member. After all, what better salespeople can we have than ourselves, we who love this wonderful game.

Both Ron and I wish you a happy and healthy new year. Start off the season with gold points at the Rye Town Hilton, January 11-17. We've been promised no snow this year (well, we can hope). ### Golden Apple XXII Swiss Teams

Concluding the WCBA's annual Closed Westchester Tournament on Sunday, January 9, will be the Golden Apple XXII, a Swiss Teams event in two masterpoint flights.

The Golden Apple is a five-match contest that will take place at the Bridge Deck, starting at 12 noon. A complimentary bagel brunch will precede the game at 11:30 AM.

There two flights are open (no masterpoint restrictions) and 0-500. The event is limited to WCBA members and players who work in Westchester County but live elsewhere.

Co-sponsoring the Golden Apple for the 22nd year is the Westchester County Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation. Westchester medallions will be presented to the winning players in both flights.

### Changes to the Closed Westchester Tournament

This year changes have been made to the Closed Westchester Tournament to make it even more enjoyable.

The Friday morning limited masterpoint game has been eliminated from the tournament. Instead, there will be a 0-750 game held concurrently with the open game at 1:30 PM. The Friday afternoon game will be held at both the Bridge Deck and the Hartes' Club. Scoring will be across the field - so regardless of which club you play at, you will be competing against everyone else.

At the Bridge Deck, there will be a complimentary cold buffet dinner between sessions. The Friday evening session will be held only at the Bridge Deck.

On Saturday, there will be two separate sessions at 1:00 PM and 7:00 PM at Riverview. The winners of the afternoon game will receive the Harriet Aks Memorial Trophy. In between sessions, there will be a cocktail hour and dinner. At the Annual Meeting, new life masters will be recognized.

The tournament concludes with the Golden Apple Swiss (see left column for details).

## District 3 Grand National Teams

The District 3 finals for qualification for the Grand National Teams will be on Saturday, April 22, 2005 at the Memorial United Methodist Church in White Plains. The winners in each of the four flights will advance to the national finals at the summer NABC in Atlanta, GA. No pre-qualification is required to compete in the district finals.

The four flights are the same as last year:

- Championship Flight - Open;
- Flight A - 0-5000 masterpoints;
- Flight B - 0-2000 masterpoints;
- Flight C - 0-500 masterpoints and non-life master

For purposes of determining qualifications for flights, masterpoint totals as of September 1, 2004 will be used. All team members must be members of the ACBL and District 3. Teams may consist of 4 - 6 players.

District 3 will give the qualifying team in each flight \$500 towards expenses and pay for their entry fees as long as they remain in this event. Additionally, Unit 188 will give another \$125/player (up to a maximum of \$500/team) for Unit 188 members who qualify.

The Championship Flight will be a single elimination knockout to determine the winner. The ACBL Mid-

Chart applies. Flight A will also be a single elimination knockout, but only the ACBL General Convention Chart applies. In the event of a tie, the teams will play additional boards to break the tie.

The winners of Flights B and C will be determined by a two session Swiss Teams. The ACBL General Convention Chart applies. In the event of a tie for first place, tie-breaking rules will apply to determine the winner.

### The No-Trump Range

Using standard bidding treatments, it is very easy to describe balanced hands in all point ranges. Unfortunately, many beginning players do not seem to be taught the basic theory behind bidding and re-bidding various no-trumps to describe their hands in different point ranges.

The theory is simple. If you have a balanced hand in the appropriate point range, you open the bidding with a no-trump bid at the appropriate level. If you have a balanced hand but do not have the appropriate point count, you open one of a suit and re-bid no-trump at the appropriate level if you do not have support for partner.

Using standard methods, a 1NT bid shows 15-17 HCP, and a 2NT bid shows 20-21 HCP. Traditionally a 3NT opening bid shows 25-27 HCP, although it is common today to show this type of hand by opening 2♣ and re-bidding 3NT. Following is the chart to show how to open describe balanced hands in every point range:

- 0-11 HCP: Pass
- 12-14 HCP: Open 1 of a minor, re-bid 1NT without support for partner's response
- 15-17 HCP: Open 1NT
- 18-19 HCP: Open 1 of a minor, re-bid 2NT
- 20-21 HCP: Open 2NT
- 22-24 HCP: Open 2♣, re-bid 2NT
- 25-27 HCP: Open 3NT, or open 2♣ and re-bid 3NT depending on your system

Don't stress out about hands with 28+ HCP. They don't come up often enough to worry about. Some people may shift the ranges slightly (ex: 2NT is 20-22, and 2♣ followed by 2NT is 23-24). Small changes are OK, just so long as all ranges are still covered.

What about hands with 5 card majors that are balanced? Some people advocate opening NTs with them, others advocate opening 1 of a major. If you choose to open NTs with 5 card majors, the above structure still applies, and you may want to consider using Puppet Stayman (which I will cover in a future column). If you don't open NTs with 5 card majors, then you need to have re-bids defined to show your point range. For example, after 1♥ - Pass - 1♠ - Pass you could use:

- 1NT = 11-15 HCP
- 2NT = 16-18 HCP
- 3NT = 19-20 HCP

After 1 Major - Pass - 1NT - Pass you could use:

- 2 suit = 11-15 HCP
- 2NT = 16 - 18 HCP
- 3NT = 19 - 20 HCP

These are just suggestions on how to handle balanced hands after opening 5 card majors. You will want to discuss it with your partner to set your own agreements.

## Make It Easy On Partner

When you defend a hand, your partner will frequently have choices in play. Help him or her to avoid a wrong guess. Here are two examples.

♠J 10 9 6	
♥J 10 8 3

South West North East  
1♠ Pass 2♠ Pass

You are East. The opening lead is the ♠3. Declarer wins and plays two more rounds of spades, ending in dummy. The ♦K is lead, and you take the ♦A to shift to a low heart. Declarer puts in the ♥9, and partner wins the ♥Q. Partner returns the ♥5, covered by the ♥10. What do you do?

You may think partner doesn't have the ♥A, in which case the right play is to duck. If you do that, you've just cost yourself an overtrick. From the other side of the table, your partner may be thinking the low ♥5 shows the ♥A. Since the ♥2 should show an honor, and the only honor missing is the ♥K, I will lead low back to my partner.

What can be done to avoid this? West could play the ♥A, forcing East to win the next trick with the ♥K. While 4♠ is still cold, East can safely lead another heart towards the ♥Q.

Here is the next example, not double dummy:

♠8	♠A 6 2
♥A J 7 2	♥K 10 8
♦A J 5 4	♦9 8 7
♣K 10 4 3	♣9 8 7 2

South West North East  
1♠ Dbl 2♠ All pass

West leads the ♠8 to your ♠A. Dummy has ♥9 6 4. You want to return a heart. But which one?

If you lead the ♥8 on this hand (thinking third best from an honor), and declarer plays the ♥Q, partner does not know whether to grab his ♥A or not. The ♥8 looks high, probably the top of 2 or 3 cards. It's a good deceptive play by declarer out of ♥Q 5 3.

Make it easy on your partner - lead the ♥K, not the ♥8. Partner probably has heart honors for the takeout double, and if not your ♥K is finessable anyway. Taking 3 heart tricks is probably the difference between the contract making and you setting it.

Too much thinking! Make it easy on your partner.
