NORTH AMERICAN PAIRS QUALIFYING SCHEDULE

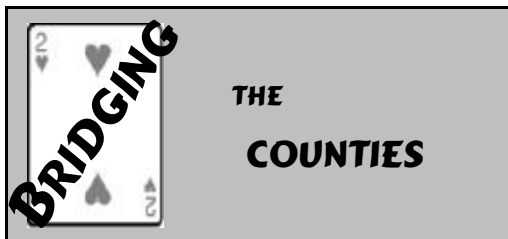
The North American Pairs qualifying games will be held during June, July and August. There are three masterpoint flights: A, Open; B, 0-2000; C, 0-500 (Non-Life Master). You may qualify to play at any NAP qualifying game in any Unit in District 3. Those that qualify can play in the District 3 Final (no Unit Final this year). The top three pairs in each flight will qualify to play in the North American Final to be played at the Spring 2005 Nationals in Pittsburgh, PA. The top two pairs in each flight will have their expenses to attend the Nationals subsidized by the ACBL. Following is a list of club qualifying games in Unit 188.

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Editor's Corner



I had the opportunity to play at District 3's Inter-Unit Game in Tuxedo, NY. The game was to honor people in all of the units in District 3 who volunteer to help at the unit level. I got to meet a lot of new people, including several who I corresponded with via e-mail long before I ever met them.

What made the game interesting was that it was a form of duplicate I had never played before - Swiss Pairs.

Most readers of this column are familiar with Swiss Teams - the usual Sunday event at regionals and sectionals. For those who are unfamiliar with Swiss Teams, you can read the article on page 6 of the September 2002 issue of *Bridging the Counties*. The entire issue is available on-line at: <http://www.bridge-wcba.com/bridging.html>

Although Swiss Pairs is a team game, it differs from regular Swiss Teams in one very important respect. At Swiss Pairs, your partner must be constant, and your teammates never are. Each match, your teammates are selected for you at random. (At least in theory. This game was deliberately set up so that your teammates would never be from the same unit as you are. So, for example, we never had teammates from Unit 188.)

We were pair 28. In the first round, our teammates were pair 13. We played a seven

board match against two pairs which comprised the opposing "team." At the end of the match, we compared scores just like Swiss Teams. As usual, the IMPs were converted to Victory Points.

But each pair keeps their own separate Victory Points. After the first round, we had collected all of 2 Victory Points. So both my pair (28) and pair 13 had a score of 2 VPs, and the pairs went their separate ways for the next round.

The game lasted four rounds. Like Swiss Teams, the winners were the ones with the highest VP total at the end. But, of course, you have a winning pair, not a winning team.

There are a few differences worth noting. First, you can't put together a strong team. As your teammates change randomly every round, you have no idea in advance who your teammates will be. Secondly, it's meant to be much more social. The idea is to force you to play with and against new people. Since your opponents this round may be your teammates next round, it behooves you to be nice and pleasant to them (which you should be, anyway).

It was a fun change of pace. If you have the opportunity, I would recommend that you give Swiss Pairs a try.

Kay Samotus

Kay Bailey Samotus, a player, director and teacher and an integral part of bridge life in Westchester for over 50 years, died this past November.

She ran and directed "Kay's Bridge Club" for 30 years. She was also the first director of Pickwick, a membership bridge club. Previously she had worked for the ACBL when it was in Greenwich, CT and was a former board member of the WCBA.

Her former students included Larry Cohen, the world-famous player and writer. But even beginners found her to be a warm and nurturing mentor, whether as students in her class or as players at her table. She was as kind and pleasant to them as she was to more experienced players, and was more than willing to answer their questions.

She had four children with her first husband, Harvey Bailey, principal of Port Chester Junior High School. After he died, she married Louis Samotus, who died several years ago.

Convention Hall

When you sit down for a new partner for the first time, you decide what conventions you are going to play and fill out a convention card. Often times you simply ask something like, "Do you play Flannery?" and if the answer is yes, you mark the card and proceed without any further discussion. There is a small problem with this approach. Simply because you both play the same convention, does not mean you play it the same way!

When deciding what conventions to play, it is important to discuss the conventions in more detail, and not just refer to them by name. Flannery, responsive doubles, gambling 3NT, Gerber and 1NT forcing are some of the conventions that come in different flavors. This article will just briefly mention some of the issues raised by these five conventions to give you an idea how to handle your future

discussions in this area. While this article will raise specific questions, it will not provide concrete answers, and leave you to decide the answers based upon the rest of your system.

Traditionally, Flannery is a 2♦ opening bid showing 11-15 HCP and 5 hearts and 4 spades. Can you open 2♦ with a weak 6 card heart suit, that you don't consider re-biddable? Is a response of 3♦ defined? (Bill Flannery originally used it as a control asking bid.) Is a 3♣ response passable or it forcing? Does a 1♠ response to a 1♥ opener guarantee 5 spades?

The traditional approach to responsive doubles requires that the opponents bid and raise the same suit. Many people add variations to expand its scope beyond this. Also, what does it show? Example:

1♥ - Double - 2♥ - Double
Does the responsive doubler show 4

spades or deny 4 spades?

For a gambling 3NT bid, how many cards are promised in the minor? How many outside stoppers? What about singleton kings? Is 4♣ the only runout, or is it 4♣ or 4♦?

The issue with Gerber is usually less in the responses and more when does it apply, i.e. is 4♣ Gerber or not? But Gerber also comes in other flavors, such as Roman Keycard and Roman Keycard 1430.

For those who use a 1NT response as forcing after a major suit opening, is 1NT still forcing after a double? What about by a passed hand? If you play constructive raises, does that change anything?

The list goes on. Virtually every convention has variations. Just make sure you and your partner are on the same page.

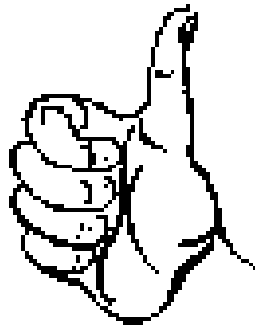
