From Tappan Zee Bridge: Thruway to Exit 8, then I-287 East to exit 5. County Center is 1/4 mile on left.

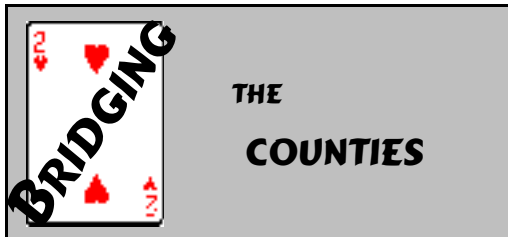
From CT: I-287 West to exit 5. Left turn toward Rte. 119. Left turn onto Rte. 119. County Center is 1/2 mile on left.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Last year I dedicated my messages to explaining the purposes and the structure of the Board of Directors for our Unit. This year, I'd like to discuss our players, who are the all important core of our Unit.

As in most organizations, our members range from novice to expert, with the majority falling somewhere in between.

When I first started playing bridge in the late 1960s, everyone played together. There were no stratifications or even alerts. I can remember playing at a New York regional when an entire auction, from the opening bid until the final slam contract was reached, was with artificial bids, and I had no idea what was happening. But this didn't inhibit me. In fact, I was thrilled if I could just place 5th in my section. I certainly did not expect to win. I just wanted to improve my game.

Today we play by different rules. For a variety of reasons, the ACBL has changed the duplicate bridge environment. Certainly many of the changes were intended to level

the playing field. We want newer players to be more comfortable while they are learning the game. We want to protect all players from misunderstandings at the table.

But we are not always mindful of the purposes for the changes. We frequently separate into the lowest level we are eligible for, thus impeding our own development. We call the directors for failures to alert, even when we know what all the bids mean. While we do and should take advantage of the rules, we may also fail to remember the reasons we want to play bridge. We forget about the enjoyment and the satisfaction we feel when we play a hand well. Sometimes we care too much about winning, and not enough about playing.

Let's stop! Let's begin the New Year with a new Bridge Spirit. Let's become better bridge players and more pleasant bridge players.

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Editor's Corner



At the New York City regional in December, for the first time my knockout team was put into Bracket I based upon our masterpoint holdings. It felt odd to be classified in the same bracket as a team of 4 national champions. Although we missed playing that team, we did have to play against two professional players in the first round, and a third in the second round. Alas, we didn't win the event (we tied for third/fourth).

The quality of the bridge was incredible. There were very few mistakes made by the opponents. You had to be on the top of your game at all times. And it motivated you to play even harder. It was an experience I won't forget, and I look forward to having again.

At the Rye Town Hilton, we were back down in Bracket II. While we had another good session (this time second place), it just wasn't as exhilarating because it wasn't against "the best." Even so, it was great to see 80 teams competing in the same event.

But these lead me to a few observations. First, why were we in Bracket I or II?

The obvious answer seemed that the knockouts were being dominated by flight C players seeking their gold points. But where were the flight A players? With a team masterpoint total of about 2,700, it seems to me that there should have been a lot more

teams higher than us.

Secondly, the masterpoint awards for knockouts are too skewed. Had we lost in the second round of the knockouts in NYC, we would have won about 1.25 points. Instead, for just one more win, we got 13.42 points, over 12 more points. While I am not complaining, it just doesn't seem fair to the team we beat in the second round.

After I drafted this column, there was a letter to the editor in the February issue of the ACBL *Bulletin* regarding the issue of the masterpoint awards for knockouts being much higher than pair games. The letter writer did not indicate whether he thought points awarded for pair games should be raised, or whether the overall awards for knockouts should be reduced.

Certainly the extra masterpoints help explain the popularity of knockouts. And the extra masterpoints are not necessarily an incentive for the flight A players to enter the knockouts. But I don't think this is a complete explanation for their absence.

On a related note, I believe the same observation also holds true for Swiss Teams. For whatever reason, the overall awards in team games are higher than those for pair games. It's just something else to consider in deciding what event to enter.

Without the help of our volunteers we would not be able to put on such a great tournament. Thanks also to Sol Weinstein and the directing staff, and to our caddies.

On April 17, the District will again be running the Grand National Teams at the United Methodist Memorial Church on Bryant Avenue in White Plains. It's another big event in your own backyard. Flights B & C will be a one day, two session Swiss Teams with the winning teams in each flight getting \$500 and entry fees to play in the finals in New York City in July. Flight A and

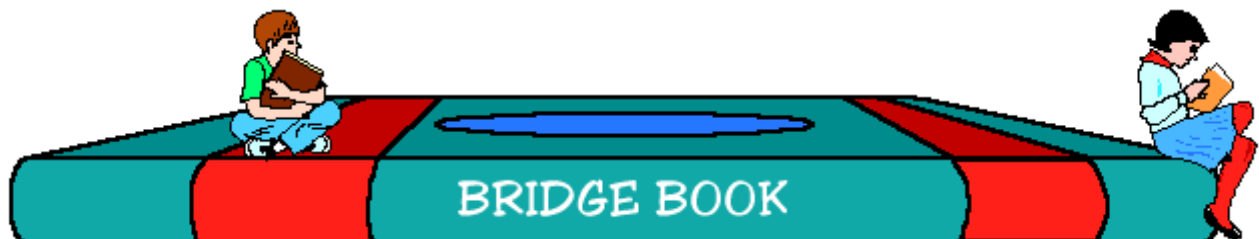

Convention Hall

Modified Miles Transfers

The September 2003 Convention Hall looked at minor suit transfers over 1 no-trump openings. For the convention-aholics out there, there is also a minor suit transfer system available over 2 no-trump openings (or 2 no-trump overcalls after a preempt by your opponents). Warnings: this is not for novice players, casual partnerships or people who tend to forget conventions. Don't say I didn't warn you.

The key problem in a transfer system over 2 no-trump is that 4♣ is normally reserved for Gerber. Marshall Miles first invented the solution to this. Here are the beginnings of the four key sequences:

- 1) 2NT - 4♣
- 2) 2NT - 3NT* - 4♣*
- 3) 2NT - 3♠* - 3NT* - Pass
- 4) 2NT - 3♠* - 3NT* - 4♣* - 4♦*

#1 is standard. That's just Gerber.

#2 shows the transfer to clubs. To transfer to clubs, you respond 3NT! This is very counter-intuitive, and this is what you are most likely to forget. At least once you will probably make a mistake by bidding 3NT intended as a signoff, which it's not.

So how do you get to 3NT? That's sequence #3. 3♠ is a transfer to 3NT, with a wrinkle. The wrinkle is sequence #4, where 4♣ is now a re-transfer to 4♦.

Obviously, with a very weak hand, you can just pass after the transfer is completed.

As it is non-standard, all of the bids marked with an asterisk above must be alerted.

Everything discussed above is how Marshall Miles originally designed the convention. However, I recommend a different set of continuations than he does after the transfer is completed is sequences #2 and #4.

Bidding 4NT over the minor is invitational to slam, either in the minor or in no-trump, if the 2NT bidder's hand is appropriate. A raise to 5 of the minor is a sign-off in game. 5NT is a try for a grand slam.

Here are the ace-asking sequences after the transfer:

- 2) 2NT - 3NT - 4♣ - 4♦
- 4) 2NT - 3S - 3NT - 4♣ - 4♦ - 4♥

Marty Bergen aficionados will recognize this as Kickback. I recommend the Roman Key Card 1430 version. On a side note, Kickback is NOT alertable, as it is an ace-asking bid (just like you don't alert Gerber or Blackwood). But after the auction is over you are required to inform your opponents that an ace-asking auction took place.

Other new suits are cue-bids.

As you can see, this is a convention only for people who are convention lovers. It is by no means essential, as it comes up very rarely. But when it does come up, it does help your minor suit grand slam bidding.
