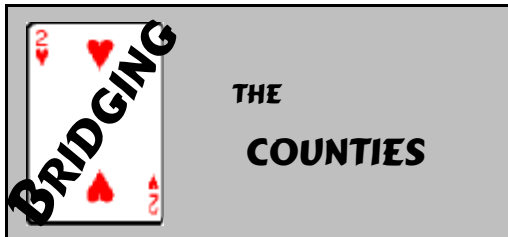

At a recent club game, I was involved in a very unusual auction. No one vulnerable.

I was South. While I like light openers, my hand was just a shade too light for me to

open it 1♦. But playing random preempts, I could systemically open it a weak 2♦ which only promised 5 diamonds and did not deny a four card major.

2♠ was standard. 3♣ was natural and non-forcing, suggesting that partner was not happy with diamonds for a trump suit. Then things got even stranger.

3♦ was a cue-bid in support of spades. I cue-bid 3♠ in support of clubs. 4♥ was a cue-bid looking for slam. North's double showed hearts - a penalty double.

Undeterred, East cue-bid 5♣, which I doubled for penalty / lead direction. West made a forcing pass, as he had nothing left to cue-bid. North of course passed.

East persisted by cue-bidding 5♦, which led to my second penalty / lead directing double. West cue-bid 5♥ to confirm the ♥A and deny the ♦A or a void. North made a fourth penalty double. East, knowing they were of the ♦A signed off in 6♠.

3 out of 5 pairs reached 6♠, one doubled. Of course, the auction wasn't the same at the other tables. Of interest is that the auction at our table included 6 cue-bids (by both pairs) and 4 penalty doubles by us, and yet the final contract was not doubled and it made.

Could you find the 7♥ save?

Hats off to our USA II Junior Team that came home with a bronze medal from the World Junior Team Championships in Paris. It was heartwarming to watch the team struggle to recover from a 96 IMP deficit at the halfway mark of the semi-finals against Italy, only to come up short by less than an IMP. But they mustered up all their strength and

morale to beat Poland for the bronze. Five members of this team were the same juniors who won the gold medal two years ago in Brazil. A great accomplishment for Joe Grue, Kent Mignocchi, Kevin Bathurst, John Kranyak, Joel Woodridge and John Hurd.

It's time to think about lining up your partners for the Rye Town Hilton from January 13-18. And don't forget to pray to the Snow God to keep the snow and ice away from Westchester that week. Golden Apple XXI Swiss Teams

The Closed Westchester Tournament that starts of the WCBA's annual tournament schedule winds up on Sunday, January 4, with the Golden Apple Swiss team event - number XXI.

The five-match Golden Apple contest will take place at the Bridge Deck, starting at 12 noon. A complimentary bagel brunch will precede the game at 11:30 AM.

There are two masterpoint flights: open (no masterpoint restrictions) and 0-300. The event is limited to WCBA members and players who work in Westchester County but live elsewhere.

Co-sponsoring the Golden Apple for the 21st year is the Westchester County Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation. Westchester medallions will be awarded to the winning team in both flights.

Convention Hall

Modified Miles Transfers

The September 2003 Conventional Hall looked at minor suit transfers over 1 no-trump openings. For the convention-aholics out there, there is also a minor suit transfer system available over 2 no-trump openings (or 2 no-trump overcalls after a preempt by your opponents). Warnings: this is not for novice players, casual partnerships or people who tend to forget conventions. Don't say I didn't warn you.

The key problem in a transfer system over 2 no-trump is that 4♣ is normally reserved for Gerber. Marshall Miles first invented the solution to this. Here are the beginnings of the four key sequences:

- 1) 2NT - 4♣
- 2) 2NT - 3NT* - 4♣*
- 3) 2NT - 3♠* - 3NT* - Pass
- 4) 2NT - 3♠* - 3NT* - 4♣* - 4♦*

#1 is standard. That's just Gerber.

#2 shows the transfer to clubs. To transfer to clubs, you respond 3NT! This is very counter-intuitive, and this is what you are most likely to forget. At least once you will probably make a mistake by bidding 3NT intended as a signoff, which it's not.

So how do you get to 3NT? That's sequence #3. 3♠ is a transfer to 3NT, with a wrinkle. The wrinkle is sequence #4, where 4♣ is now a re-transfer to 4♦.

Obviously, with a very weak hand, you can just pass after the transfer is completed.

As it is non-standard, all of the bids marked with an asterisk above must be alerted.

Everything discussed above is how Marshall Miles originally designed the convention. However, I recommend a different set of continuations than he does after the transfer is completed is sequences #2 and #4.

Bidding 4NT over the minor is invitational to slam, either in the minor or in no-trump, if the 2NT bidder's hand is appropriate. A raise to 5 of the minor is a sign-off in game. 5NT is a try for a grand slam.

Here are the ace-asking sequences after the transfer:

- 2) 2NT - 3NT - 4♣ - 4♦
- 4) 2NT - 3S - 3NT - 4♣ - 4♦ - 4♥

Marty Bergen aficionados will recognize this as Kickback. I recommend the Roman Key Card 1430 version. On a side note, Kickback is NOT alertable, as it is an ace-asking bid (just like you don't alert Gerber or Blackwood). But after the auction is over you are required to inform your opponents that an ace-asking auction took place.

Other new suits are cue-bids.

As you can see, this is a convention only for people who are convention lovers. It is by no means essential, as it comes up very rarely. But when it does come up, it does help your minor suit grand slam bidding.

Results From the Instant Matchpoint Game

Jarl Ingers and Jim Levin were the North-South leaders at Westchester clubs, and Lee Gottlieb and Stephen Sahlein were the East-West leaders in the ACBL Instant Matchpoint Game played September 30.

The ACBL-wide event was contested at four unit clubs with a total of 268 participants. There were 14 tables in play at the Bedford Bridge Club, 24 at the Bridge Deck, 20 at the Hartes' Club, and 9 at the Larchmont Temple Bridge Club.
