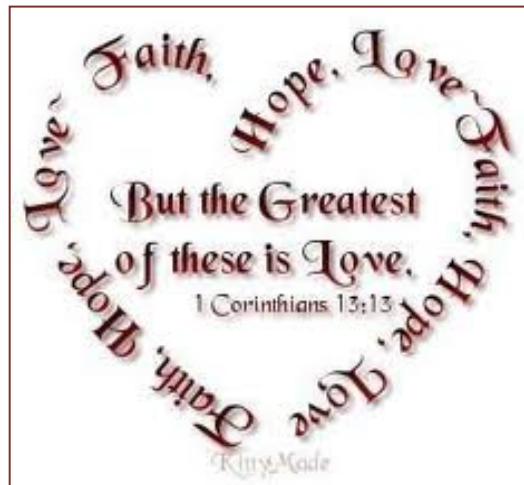

# Vestry Report

The Christ the King Vestry met on Tuesday, January 14, 2020, 6pm at Christ the King Church, Poway.

Peter McCoy has graciously stepped in to fill the remaining Vestry term of Mac Nibbs.

Jim Heaton went over the December financial reports. CTK ended the year with Pledges at about 92% of budget but Open Plate came in at \$2700 over budget. Total expenditures for 2019 were \$20,000 below budget so overall there was a surplus of just over \$9000 for the year. After discussion it was decided to transfer the surplus into the Operating Reserve for use in the coming year against anticipated expenses that will be incurred as part of the Search Process.

Jim also reported that he has been wading through the recently updated diocesan Treasurer's manual and his goal for 2020 is to move CTK toward better compliance with the myriad policies and best practice suggestions included in the manual.

Staff reports - the Staff met prior to the Vestry meeting and it was decided to offer a class (or classes if needed) using the newly updated To Be A Christian (Anglican catechism) in Lent and that all parishioners, but especially those who are new to the faith/denomination or wishing to be confirmed, are highly encouraged to attend. Cindy will solicit for best days and times and Fr. Bill Gandenberger has graciously offered to lead the class(es). Cindy will look into options for obtaining the study materials for those who want to participate.

Brynne Daly, who has been the Nursery Care person for CTK for 5 years, is stepping down due to budget constraints and redundancy of serves with all our regular young attenders being of school age and involved in our Sunday School program. Brynne has graciously agreed to continue to make herself available if needed.

The Poway Outreach team reported that they are gearing up for the North County Veterans Stand Down in February and have begun collecting donations for that event. Volunteers for the 4-day weekend event are still needed and welcome. In Lent the team will collect loose change in baby bottles to be given to Life Choices. In March the team will hold a Easter 'Bathkit' drive to collect full size toiletries to be handed out via the YIT program to homeless youth in the Poway School District. Elaine asked on behalf of the team for a commitment to fund the ongoing YIT food card program. *A motion was made to fund the cards in the amount of \$200 per month for Jan/Feb/mar 2020 with the funds split evenly between the Church Mission Fund and the Poway Community Outreach designated Fund. The motion was seconded and passed.*

The Ramona Outreach team had no report but Peter said he would connect with the team leader, Leah Cullen, to get a report each month prior to Vestry.

Dcn Steve and Fr. Larry reported that the Fr. Gary has decided on how to arrange the wording on the signs on either side of the driveway into the upper parking lot and that the CTK info will be on the left side (which you see as you enter the lot) and the Preschool info will be on the right side.

Lynn Maudlin asked to share some info about the website and offered to help rebuild and host/maintain the site at no expense to CTK. She would then train a couple others to access the site for updates and additions. *A motion was made to authorize Lynn to rebuild the site and make the arrangements as needed.*

Fr. Larry brought up the RCC traditional Lenten Friday Fish Frys that CTK took ownership (mostly) of last year and asked if this would be done again as had been planned at the end of the last Lenten season. The consensus was to do it again, and that the price be set a \$5 a plate rather than \$10 as it is meant to be an outreach to the community and not necessarily a fundraiser. The first fish fry would be Friday, February 28 and run for 6 weeks. Helen will get the info put into the Poway newspaper once the details have all been set.

Cindy reported that she had amended the original 2018 lease agreement between RCC and CTK to reflect the current year, the current rental amount, and the buildings involved, and that both Fr. Gary and Fr. Russell had given their verbal approval. Both Fr. Gary and Elaine as the Rector's Warden for CTK have signed two copies, and Cindy will secure all the signatures and then provide copies to Fr. Gary and Elaine.

Elaine reported that the Search Committee has added the following parishioners to their number - Leah Cullen, Jen Marchewka, Larry Rello - and that they would be meeting for the first time immediately after the vestry meeting.

## POWAY MINISTRY TEAM REPORT

*As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace... 1 Peter 4:1]*

It's a brand new year and we are in the midst of preparing for the **Veterans' Stand Down at Green Oaks Ranch**. This four-day event, held **February 6 through February 9 at Green Oak Ranch in Vista**, is aimed at providing an array of services for veterans, including a respite from the streets for homeless vets in the form of cabin living and catered dining. Other services include medical, dental, and vision services, legal aid, clothing distribution, housing assistance to name a few. You can help by praying for the vets that attend and for the many volunteers. Your donations can also help. New items: socks, underwear, bath towels. New or freshly cleaned used items: blankets, jeans, cargo pants, warm jackets, belts, PJ bottoms, fleece sweatpants. Donations requested are for both for men and women. (Note: extra large sizes needed as well.) **Bring donations to church on or before Sunday, Feb. 2.**

During the Lenten season look for the *baby bottles*! Our customary pocket change collection will go to benefit **Life Choices Pregnancy Center of Poway**. The center provides abortion clinic alternative services, including free pregnancy tests, information on options available and ultrasound referrals. Look for the baby bottles in the fellowship hall each Sunday in lent beginning March 1.

Watch your bulletins for information on upcoming event to benefit **Youth in Transition**, a program for homeless young people served by the Poway Unified School District.

December and January have been quiet months for us as a congregation and ministry team (at least in the category of outreach and events). We did have a tasty soup supper fellowship time at the Turnbull's in December, but did not end up organizing another such event or BBQ in January.

We have continued to listen to our Lord's nudging and have stepped out in faith to bless our community: Neighborhood dog families were the recipients of Christmas dog toys and unconditional love as Leah continued her one-on-one (and dog) walking ministry.

The ladies of our church (Nancy, Judy, and Linda) never fail to minister to the homeless in our community during our fellowship time, always looking for those who could use a hot cup of coffee, some tasty treats, and the steadfast love of our Lord.

We were blessed to have a recently relocated to Ramona gentleman (whose name is John) come in and join us for a bit. We ministered to him as we were able and he allowed us to pray over him before he went on his way. He continues to be in our prayers and we hope in yours. We ask that you also lift up Joe and Chuck, other Ramona homeless community members, in prayer.

We, as a ministry team and family, have a heart for the homeless in our community. This is why we are part of Serve Ramona. Nancy will be attending their next meeting this month and will be sharing with us ways that we can join them in helping these exiled Children of God in 2020. The Lord is nudging our hearts and asking us to keep seeking ways to help them, especially in these very cold winter months. Some thoughts that have come to mind are:

Specifically setting aside all recyclable bottles and cans to give to the homeless who collect them for money.

Brainstorming for ways that shelter can be provided for the homeless (collect for and purchase the light/individual tents hikers use and offer them to those in need, maybe?).

Harvesting for the Homeless (enlist the generosity of neighbors who have fruit trees that often have fruit left on the branches, collect this bounty, and donate it to Serve Ramona or hand it out in person to our homeless community members).

In all this we ask for and expect to receive the Lord's guidance and steadfast love.

In looking ahead, we do have some church outreach in the works:

Thursday, February 13, 2020 – 6pm: We're planning a potluck and prayer meeting at the Town Hall. We pray this will be a time for us to continue to bond as a church family and seek the Lord's guidance as we embark on this time of change, growth, and renewal as a church.

Wednesday Lenten Soup Suppers (starting March 4, 2020 – 6pm – tentatively planned at the Oak Tree Ranch clubhouse).

May we all be stirred up to love and good works as we step forward in faith in this new year of possibilities!
