

We all agree that Christ came to save the world. Why is it, then, that crime and evil in general are so rampant in the world? For example, Muslins and Buddhists ask why it is that "Christian" nations are so immoral, with so much selfishness.

There is no falsehood in Christ's Gospel. But the problem is that "an enemy" (satan has thrown a smoke screen around Him and has hidden Him from view. And for many centuries satan has tried to do this inside the church!

Part of this smoke screen is the idea that sin is stronger than God, that temptation to sin is so strong that it's hopeless to say "No" to it. So, many give in. They do not realize what a powerful Savior Jesus is, because they think He was so different from us that He doesn't understand how strong our temptations are. He belongs in dark cathedrals in stained glass windows, irrelevant to our real needs. But that's not true. Are sin and evil too difficult for Him to meet and conquer? The answer again is resounding "No!"

This lesson contains great Good News: Christ is God in the highest sense, but He became man in the deepest sense. He is your Savior. He is closer to you than you may have thought.
