

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the City of Norfolk will hold a public hearing on **TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 24, 2020 at 6:00 p.m.** and being held **VIRTUALLY ONLY**, to **consider whether to adopt an Ordinance drafted by the Committee of Petitioners for the Norfolk 2nd Amendment Preservation Coalition** proposing to prohibit the City of Norfolk from exercising any authority granted to it to regulate or prohibit the purchase, possession, transfer, ownership, carrying, storage or transporting of firearms, ammunition, or components, or a combination thereof and, furthermore, to waive the City's sovereign immunity as it relates to any injuries sustained by persons lawfully present on any property owned by the City that it designates as a firearm-free zone. After hearing the views of persons interested in the matter at the public hearing, the Council may vote on whether to approve the proposed Ordinance presented by the Norfolk 2nd Amendment Preservation Coalition.

We, as qualified voters in the City of Norfolk, who have signed hereunder, do hereby petition the City Council to consider and adopt the 2nd Amendment Preservation Ordinance written below. The purpose of this ordinance is to protect the rights of citizens to keep and bear arms under the 2nd Amendment of the United States Constitution and Article I, Section 13 of the Virginia Constitution. If the council rejects the proposed ordinance, or passes it a form different from that set forth in the petition; or fails to act finally upon it within the time stated, the committee of the petitioners may require that it be submitted to a vote of the electors in its original form.

2nd Amendment Preservation Ordinance

Section 1: The City of Norfolk shall not exercise any authority granted to it by title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia, its Charter, or otherwise to regulate or prohibit the purchase, possession, transfer, ownership, carrying, storage or transporting of firearms, ammunition, or components, or a combination thereof. This prohibition includes any authority existing at the time of enactment of this Ordinance or any authority extended in the future. The terms used in this Ordinance shall have the meaning defined in title 18.2 of the Code of Virginia.

Section 2: If the City of Norfolk designates any property owned by it as a firearms free zone, the City of Norfolk shall waive its sovereign immunity as it relates to any injuries sustained by persons lawfully present in such firearm-free zone.
