From the Missouri Conservationist regarding our feathered friends --

* Birds eat 400-500 million tons of insects every year. * Vultures eat dead carcasses and metabolize diseases like botulism and rabies. They eat disease and it doesn't pass out the other end, preventing both wildlife and human health outbreaks. * Birds disperse seeds to vegetate our world, and hummingbirds help pollinate many flowering plants.

A message from the Area Chairman --

I hope you had a fulfilling Thanksgiving Day and four-day weekend along with plenty of leftovers that will grace our waistlines. By the time you receive this, we would have had our second fall shoot at the area. It's supposed to be a cold day, so we should have good attendance.

We had our first fall meat shoot on October 28th and it was well attended. A fast pace and good time was had by all with near perfect weather. A chill in the air, but not a cold day, kept us on the go most of the day. The judging was more than a little tense with the first four rounds being so close that we paid out a second place. There was less than 1/64th of an inch difference between the top two cards, which the shooters took as a challenge.

We will be doing some repairs to the Windy Hill Shelter when weather allows and into the summer. We need to shore up the building and replace some rotted boards where needed. To bring more birds to your backyard, try these tips -- * Put out a birdbath - water attracts 10 times more birds than seed does. * Attract Baltimore orioles with half of an orange, fleshy side out, and grape or blackberry jelly. * In the fall, don't deadhead zinnias or marigolds. Goldfinches love their seed heads.

Trees are constantly "on the job", working for us in incredibly important and surprising ways. They provide habitat for wildlife, cost-saving shade for our homes, and a host of wood products we rely on every day. Pecan and black walnut trees right here in Missouri provide the nuts we use in our favorite recipes.

INVASIVE SPECIES from the Missouri Conservationist, October 2023 --

Invasive nonnative species destroy habitat and compete with native plants and animals. Please do what you can to control invasive species when you landscape, farm, hunt, fish, camp or explore nature. Live bait -- including minnows, worms and crayfish -- or aquarium species -- including fish, snails and plants -- should never be dumped in a waterway. Once dumped, the live bait or aquarium species can become invasive in our lakes and streams. It is illegal to dump aquatic species into waterbodies from which they were not obtained.


