Driving & Bicycling

In Anguilla, public transportation options are limited, so renting or purchasing a car or bicycle is a popular choice for residents.



Driving:

To drive in Anguilla, you'll need a valid international driver's license or your home country's license. Roads can be narrow, and driving is on the left side, so be cautious, especially on less trafficked roads. Popular car rental services include Island Car Rental, Bass Car Rental and Andy's Car Rental. .

- License: You can use your existing valid license to attain an Anguilla Temporary Driver's License.



Bicycling:

For an eco-friendly and economic option, bicycling is also an option. Remember to wear a helmet and be mindful of narrow roads.

Basic Documents to Bring

Basic Documents to Bring

When relocating to Anguilla, it's important to bring essential documents to ensure a smooth transition and meet legal and academic requirements. Here's a checklist of the basic documents you should carry with you:

1. Valid Passport
Ensure your passport is valid for at least 6 months beyond your planned stay in Anguilla.
2. Letter of Acceptance
A formal acceptance letter from New Anglia University confirming your enrollment in the program.
3. Medical Records & Health Insurance
A health clearance certificate and proof of health insurance for the duration of your stay.
4. Proof of Funds
Documents demonstrating you have sufficient funds to cover tuition, living expenses, and other costs for at least 6 months.
5. Police Clearance Certificate
A criminal background check from your home country(ies) for the last 5 years.
6. Accommodation Documents
Rental agreement or confirmation letter from your housing provider (if applicable).
7. Driver's License (if applicable).
8. 3 Passport-sized photographs for the student permit.

Student Permit

Your student permit will be arranged upon your arrival to Anguilla. Make sure all documentation is accurate and complete. Student office can assist with this before coming to Anguilla.

Getting settled

Bank Accounts

Here are some of the local banks offering accounts for students. Documents Needed to Open a Bank Account:

1. Passport or National ID
2. Proof of Student Status (e.g., enrollment letter from New Anglia University)
3. Proof of Address (e.g., utility bill, rental agreement)
4. Proof of adequate funds

National Commercial Bank of Anguilla (NCBA): A popular choice with minimal fees, convenient online banking options, a debit and credit card options.

Republic Bank: A Caribbean bank with minimal fees and options for a debit and/or credit card.

Liberty Credit Union: The newest Anguilla bank known for exceptional customer service, a convenience card.

SIM Cards & Mobile Plans

Staying connected is important, and Anguilla offers two main telecom providers:

- FLOW Anguilla
- Digicel Anguilla

Both providers offer prepaid and postpaid plans. You can purchase a SIM card at the airport or at official provider stores.

Tip: If you need a lot of data, Digicel may offer better value. Make sure your phone is unlocked to use a local SIM card.

Home Internet

There are two main internet providers on the island:

- FLOW provides high-speed broadband internet via fiber connections.
- Digicel offers fiber internet with speeds ranging from 200 Mbps to 500 Mbps.

Both companies offer home internet services that can be installed after arrival.

Most rentals provide internet at no additional cost.

Immigration Process

Student VISA

You can submit your [VISA application online](#). You need to provide the following documents:

- Passport: A valid passport with at least six months of validity beyond the intended period of stay in Anguilla.
- Passport-size Photographs: Recent passport-sized photographs meeting the specified requirements.
- Letter of Acceptance: An official letter of acceptance from University confirming enrollment in a specific course or program (you can attach the offer letter along with student contract instead).
- Accommodation Details: Information regarding accommodation arrangements while studying.
- Travelling to come to Anguilla from other countries may need to apply for transit visas.
