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Why I Wrote This Book

In 2017 I felt like I lost everything. I lost my health, my job, my business, my apartment, my belongings, multiple friends walked away, and for a moment I lost my faith. This was the first time in my life that I questioned if the God I was serving was really the true God. The most perplexing loss was the friends who walked away. Friendship was so important to me in this walk, and I poured much time and energy into the people I was connected with. I began to explore the idea that maybe the Bible was false and that the “Universe” and universal law was the way to go. If I could serve the Creator at a distance, maybe I wouldn’t take these life events so personally. Thankfully, those thoughts didn’t last long, but they went deep as I tried to soothe the deep wound from the mass exodus I had just endured. YAH began to restore me and bring me back to a place of stability in Him. During that period of healing and gaining understanding, I started to pen thoughts about what love looks like and what barriers keep us from experiencing love.

LOVE is a word that has become so common to speak and is used so loosely that it has lost its true weight and value. Most often, when someone says “I love you,” it typically just means that they feel strong affection towards you at that moment, maybe even enough to perform some action in response to that feeling. But it is often very surface level, temporal, and is easily subject to change. When we allow modern culture to define the standard of love, it falls victim to each individual’s fleeting feelings and perspectives. If we understood the true strength and power of love, we would realize that we don’t see it in action as often as we speak it.

While the feeling of affection is an important component of love, on its own, it is very fragile and is not a firm foundation to build on. Scripture reveals a love that transforms, an enduring *covenant* love. Covenant love has stability that endures the

seasons, endures change, endures trials, and remains faithful and true when love becomes challenging. YAH's Remnant is called to become One with the Source and Sustainer of Love so that we can be made complete in His covenant love.

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A Note About Names Used

YHWH ELOHIM = The LORD God

In Hebrew, יהוה (yod, hey, uau, hey) or **YHWH** is the name of the Creator that was replaced with the title LORD in most Scripture translations. Some pronounce this name as YAHWEH, YAHUAH, or JEHOVAH. The Scriptures translation used in this text utilizes the Hebrew letters instead of the title LORD. I have added YHWH in parenthesis to add more clarity for the readers.

YAH, a shortened version of the name seen in various scriptures such as Psalm 68:4, is the name I use throughout this text to reference the Father. If you are unfamiliar with this, be assured that as you read this book, when I use the name YAH, (short for YAHWEH or YAHUAH), I am referring to The God revealed in the Scriptures, (The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, The Most High Power, The Creator, The Father). Feel free to use whatever name you prefer as you read. Also, please note that when the word GOD is used in Scripture, it is the Hebrew word **ELOHIM**. You will see that word used in the text instead of GOD.

Messiah Yahusha (Yeshua) = Christ Jesus

The Son of YAH revealed in the New Testament is known commonly as Jesus the Christ. In this text, His original Hebrew name will be used. Various spellings are used today (Yahushua, Yehoshua, Yeshua etc.). I utilize the spelling **YAHUSHA** throughout this text. I add Yeshua in parenthesis beside it occasionally as a reminder for readers since many are most familiar and comfortable with that spelling. Within the scriptures where His name appears, the translation uses the Hebrew letters יהושע and I add YAHUSHA in parenthesis for clarity. As you read please feel free to substitute with whatever pronunciation you are most comfortable with and it is my prayer that name usage not distract from the content.

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
