THE MORE YOU KNOW

The biggest concern with pets eating Halloween candy is the risk of the ingredient xylitol. Xylitol is a sugar alcohol commonly used as an artificial sweetener. Xylitol is toxic to pets. This ingredient is often used in sugar-free items but has been showing up in more and more foods every day even when they are NOT labeled as sugar-free. Most often, xylitol is found in sugar-free gum, sugar-free candy, and sugar-free baked goods. It is sometimes found in toothpaste and peanut butter as well.

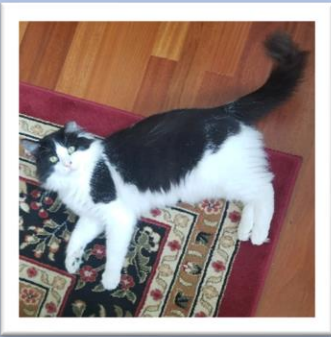

IT WAS LOVE AT FIRST SIGHT



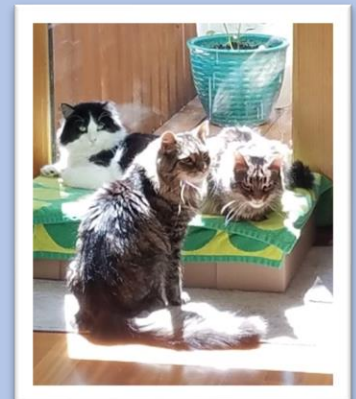

He had been a stray that wandered into the backyard of a kind cat-loving family. They began feeding and caring for him, but they knew that he would need to find a permanent home, as they were at capacity with their four cats. When Lisa, the shelter president, posted a photo of the handsome boy who would soon be coming to the shelter, I knew that I had to put a plan together to convince my husband that we were wrong about not having any additional cats.
