The most difficult part of horse ownership is losing one. In June we lost our special friend Joker whom we rescued from a farm where he had been abandoned last fall.



Every year Trinity Stables offers intern opportunities for high school students. This year Emma Tuck, from The New School in Atlanta, was our intern. Emma will be attending Warren Wilson College near Asheville, North Carolina in the Appalachian Mountains this fall.

Warren Wilson College is a work college located on a full working farm, where participating in a job on campus is part of the college experience. Emma will be working with the land maintenance crew on campus, helping around the farm, forest and garden while learning about land management.



Emma wants to major in Sustainable Agriculture because she says, "The current farming system in our country doesn't consider the long term effects of using such intensive methods on the land, people and environment in the surrounding areas. Working on a horse farm like Trinity Stables has taught me life skills that I will carry with me into my future and I hope to always keep horses in a central role in my life!"

Summer Camp Recap

Trinity Stables had a successful summer camp season with the addition of two new camps.

We started the season in early June by offering overnight camp at Hard Labor Creek in Rutledge, Georgia. The facility was terrific and the trails were slightly challenging but our advanced riders handled the trails like pros. Everyone was in heaven!

Our second camp was for advanced riders only. We built a cross country course in the south pasture and the girls were very proud of themselves for designing and building the course with their own two hands.

Our beginner camp went off without a hitch and due to the extreme heat spell, we experienced in June, the girls were able to spend time playing in the 300 gallon water trough each day. They also enjoyed doing fun crafts.

Our Archery camp was it a big hit! The kids learned safety from the ground and from the horse's back. By the end of the week many of the kids were cantering and shooting from their horses. After four days of practice they were hitting the targets.

Due to the huge success of the cross country course and archery camps we will be offering them again next year.

Volunteer Highlight

People volunteer for many reasons. Some volunteer because they need community service hours or because their place of employment requires they give back to the community. Others volunteer because they love animals.

Rica Daniels, a proud mother of three adult children and grandmother of two beautiful grandchildren, had a life changing event that brought her to Trinity Stables.



In 2021, Rica was diagnosed with bone cancer in one of her legs. One month after having surgery to remove the cancer, her thigh bone snapped in half and Rica had to have a second surgery to repair the broken bone.

During her recovery, Rica went to equine physical therapy to learn how to walk again. She worked with a horse that was trained to tap her leg on a specific nerve that helped her remember how to lift her leg again. Later she advanced to walking while holding on to the horse until her pace improved.

While recovering, Rica discovered the TV series "Heartland". It was then, that she realized she wanted to learn how to ride horses and volunteer at a barn.

Rica searched for six months before finding Trinity Stables Horses Healing Hearts. She said she felt a sense of peace like no other the first day she came to the barn. "I spoke to Shawn, the Volunteer Coordinator, and loved her from the first moment we spoke".

Besides volunteering at the barn, Rica enjoys taking riding lessons from Tasha, the Founder of Trinity Stables Horses Healing Hearts. Rica has connected with two of the horses at the Stable; Raven and Apollo. Raven made Rica feel like she had legs again and says that her connection with Apollo is unexplainable.

Members of Rica's family have also benefited from the barn. Her son, Qua, has found peace at the barn with the help of a horse named King. And Rica's granddaughter loves to help with barn chores and visit all the horses. She looks forward to the day that she can take riding lessons too.

Rica has grown close to her new "barn" family and says that the owners are such amazing people that no one could ever break her bond with Trinity Stables Horses Healing Hearts.


