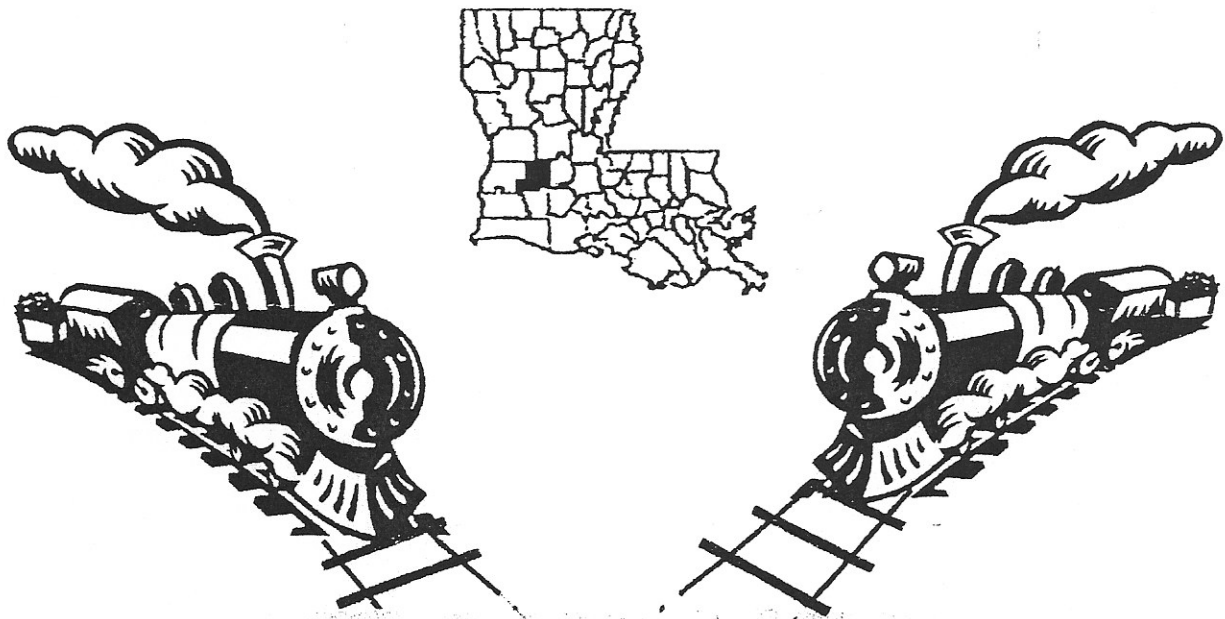

Collected obituaries were organized, cut and pasted, and copied on Copier, in preparation for forth-coming books on Allen Parish obituaries. Four members attended, and worked tirelessly on this project. Plus we had a surprise visit by our Mayor, Fred Ashy, who was very impressed with such a project (As of this writing, our Mayor has been seriously ill in a Lake Charles hospital, and the whole town of Kinder sends up prayers for his recovery). Thanks to all who helped on the obituary work shop, and thanks to those who are sending in copies of obituaries. Please check your records and send us copies of any obituaries you might have pertaining to this area.

Future plans include books of: Ancestor Charts (5-Generations), Compiled Obituaries, and WWI Draft Registration Cards.

We also need items of interest to publish in CrossRoads; copies of Land Records, Wills and Probates, Marriage Certificates, and copies of Obituaries are some suggestions.

The monthly meeting held on May 25, 2004, was well attended, and a very lively presentation on the Nevils' family was given by new member, Pierre R. Nevils and his sister Ouida Nevils Savant. Included were many old pictures, marriage license, and obituaries. The Nevils' family is one of the oldest pioneering families in this area. Trivia from the **NATCHEZ DAILY COURIER**, January 10, 1861

Married life – A newly married pair are like two travelers in an unknown country—fresh views of each other's dispositions are opening out before them every day, some beautiful, some unsightly, and mostly unexpected. A breeze occasionally springs up which may either enliven the journey by clearing the atmosphere, or dampen the ardor of the excursionists by ending in a thunderstorm. If a couple, however, have ordinary judgment, they will so arrange or dovetail their likings and dislikings as to jog on together agreeably on the whole. The cant of "incompatibility of temper" is, for the most part, the excuse of knaves and fools.

Memories of Alvin L. Nevils by Loretta Nevils Headrick

My brother, Alvin L. Nevils, was born in Indian Village, near Kinder, Louisiana on February 12, 1925. He grew up in the Village, and attended Kinder High School, graduating in 1943. He went to the war (WWII) in 1944, not long after he married Wilma Darbonne. He was only a baby really, only 18 years old. My Daddy, Joseph "Tute" Nevils, was on the draft board and wanted to keep him out. But he refused, not wanting to be a "draft dodger".

He was killed by a sniper's bullet many, many miles away from Indian Village. He volunteered to take a message, and was in Sicily at the time. He died September 13, 1944, still a child.

He had the opportunity to see a picture of his baby daughter before his death.

His body was returned in early 1946, to the old train station in Kinder, and his remains buried in the Nevils Cemetery in Indian Village. The war actually took two of my family. My mother, Blanche, died of a broken heart on September 6, 1945. She was laid to rest in the Nevils Cemetery where her beloved son's remains were later placed near her grave.

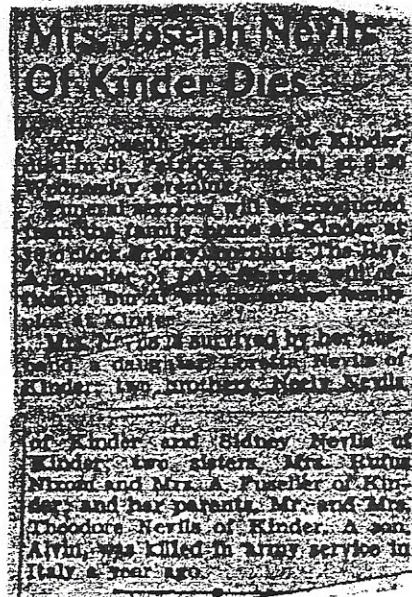
Mrs. Joseph Nevils Of Kinder Dies

Mrs. Joseph Nevils, 36, of Kinder, died in St. Patrick's Hospital at 8:30 Wednesday evening.

Funeral services will be conducted from the family home at Kinder at 10 o'clock Friday morning. The Rev. A. Fuselier of Lake Charles will officiate. Burial will be in the family plot at Kinder.

Mrs. Nevils is survived by her husband, a daughter, Loretta Nevils of Kinder; two brothers, Nealy Nevils of Kinder, and Sidney Nevils of Kinder, two sisters, Mrs. Rufus Nixon and Mrs. A. Fuselier of Kinder; and her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Theodore Nevils of Kinder. A son, Alvin, was killed in army service in Italy a year ago.

Uncle Pierre Nevils Died Wednesday

Born: Mar. 8, 1855
Died: Sept. 30, 1936

(Cem. marker has Oct. 30)

On Wednesday, of this week, Sept. 30, 1936 one of our friends and one of the oldest citizens of this section of Allen parish quietly died at his home in Indian Village after an illness of several weeks duration.

Uncle Pierre Nevils was known to most every man and woman in the southern part of this parish. He had numerous friends and relations was a congenial old French citizen with friends by the hundreds.

When a young man, Uncle Pierre amassed quite a fortune operating a cattle ranch along the banks of the Calcasieu river southwest of Kinder.

His death, while not a surprise to any of his friends or his own personal family, owing to his ripe age of above eighty, still, we were all fond of the gentleman and will greatly miss seeing he and the wife strolling along on the sidewalks of our little town together.

Interment was made at the Indian Village cemetery, Bro. Adrose Fuselier conducting the services with Revs. Davis and Remi Lormand assisting.

The Tribune wishes to join the many friends of the family in extending our sympathy in the loss of the husband and father of a large and prominent family of old Emperial Calcasieu Parish. This citizen served diligently in the up building of this area and again we say his passing will be missed not only by his family but by hosts of friends who learned to love and cherish this man for his wonderful personality, his loveable disposition and most of all, his friendly and personal honesty.

Unfortunately he was stricken with an acute attack of indigestion, followed by the bursting of a blood vessel in his brain that caused his death at 11:30 that night.

William, as he was known to all of us, was an extra nice fellow to know. was held in high esteem by all who knew him.

Interment was made in the Indian Village cemetery at five o'clock Sunday afternoon, with Rev. Blanchard Clark of the local Apostolic church officiating.

NEVILS CEMETERY - Allen Parish, LA

The Nevils Cemetery is located in Allen Parish, in the Indian Village Settlement, ten miles west of Kinder, on Hwy 383, about .5 mile west of the Indian Village Pentecostal Church, on the left side of Hwy 383. It is on the south end of private property owned by James "Jack" Nixon and Mert Lormand Nixon. The land was designated in the original will, for a cemetery.

The cemetery is well-kept, and all markers are very legible: total of 18 graves. There is more space on the south side for the cemetery to expand, but none on the other three sides. The cemetery was divided into rows for documentation purposes, starting with the west line (back line) and reading from south to north, or left to right. All graves face east.

Recorded by Ethel Fontenot Sacker in October, 2000. All readings were recorded exactly as written on grave markers, including any inscription.
