

All new members are asked to supply a five-generation Ancestor Chart, which will be kept in a file in the Genealogy Room of the Kinder Library.

A blank five-generation Ancestor chart form is included in each issue of CrossRoads.

Of interest:

The recording of Rev. Paul Leeds' Church Records is an on-going, slow process, but we are making progress. These will be a valuable research tool when completed.

The Society is in the process of copying Allen Parish World War 1 Draft registration forms from a microfilm borrowed from the Acadia Parish Genealogical and Historical Society. This is a slow, time consuming project, that we are hoping to put into book form for our Library.

Of Interest:

Whiskey Chitto Creek—crosses the northeastern boundary of Beauregard Parish, and empties into Six-Mile creek, in the Parish of Allen. In 1846, the name was recorded on a map as "B. Whiskey Chitto", and also in 1895. In 1926 the name was given on the Public Service Commission Map as "Whiskey Chitto Cr.". Currently, an official map shows, "Whiskey Chitto Creek". The name is derived from the Choctaw Indian, meaning "Big Cane Creek".

From The New Orleans Weekly Times Picayune; Monday Morning, July 9, 1849: Accidental drowning-During the passage of the Steamer JOHN GORDON up the Arkansas River, the Mate accidentally stepped overboard on the night of the 23rd. ult. and was seen no more.

Obituary of John R. Philyaw, Sr. Taken from Rev. Paul Leeds Congregational Church Records of Emad, La.

- Whereas:- The Peavy-Byrnes Company Mill at Emad having out out, bringing to an end the Mill-town of Emad, causing the members of the Emad Congregational Church to remove to other localities,
- Be It Reselved:- That we disband the Emad Congregational Church by taking the fellowing steps, namely:-
- .First,- That we resert our gratitude to God the Father, Sen and Hely Spirit for all the rish mercies and blessings granted us during the years of our shurch life here.
- Second, That we express again our christian leve and good-will be the past and present members of this church, and commond them to God and His Church where ever they may go.
- Third, -That letters to any ovengelical shurch be granted to all of our menbers who are in good and regular standing.
- Fourth, That the community shurch building and its furnishings, by the advice and concurrence of all interested parties, be given in trust to the paster, Rev. Paul Leeds, to be used on his mission field as its needs domand, with the understanding that the phase and communion set be given to the St. Peter's Congregational shurch of Indians on Bayon Blue.
- Fifth, That the Clerk of the shurch be instructed to complete all shurch in resular stand ing, record this entire resolution in the shurch reserves and state ite the Reserve Book with the Registrar of the State Association.
- Sixth,- That the Emad Congregational Church, as an earthly organization, is now authoritatively and in decent order, diskanded.


Dear Ancestor, the place you filled.

The Nevils Cemetery is located in Allen Parish, in the Indian Village Settlement, ten miles west of Kinder, on Hwy 383, about .5 mile west of the Indian Village Pentecostal Church, on the left side of Hwy 383. It is about 100 years old. The cemetery is well-kept, and all markers are very legible: total of 18 graves. There is more space on the south side for the cemetery to expand, but none on the other three sides. The cemetery was divided into rows for documentation purposes, starting with the west line (or back line), and reading from south to north, or left to right. All graves face east
