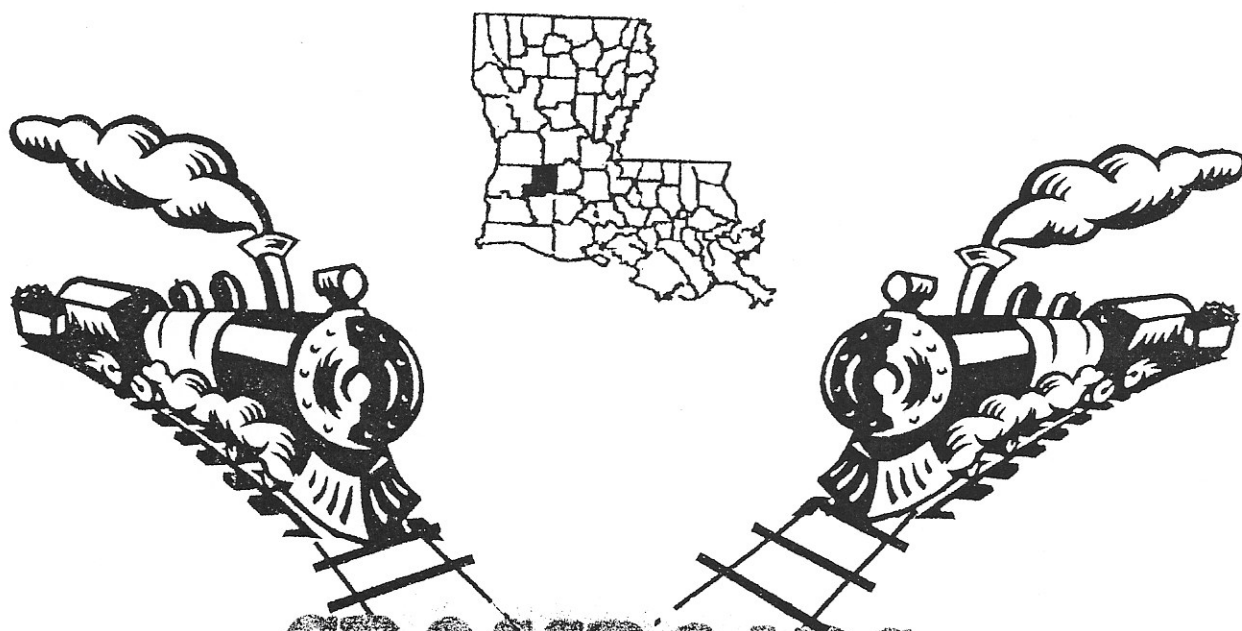

Dearest relatives and friends:

After the fierce battle of Okinawa, Sunday 1 April 1945, our Commanding Officer, Capt Dix received orders to proceed to San Francisco for more troops to make the final assault on the Japanese homeland. . An announcement came over the PA system stating: "HOIST THE HOMEWARD BOUND PENNANT, WE ARE GOING HOME!" What a jubilation! We were going home at last after long hours of battle station watches. The battle didn't matter now. We were going home!

Today our Great Commanding Officer sent orders to hoist the HOMEWARD BOUND PENNANT at 1030 CST for our 46 year old son, Thomas...the battle with cancer was over. He was going home at last!

His 15 year old son Mark wrote this about his dad: "...I remember he came to all my football games, all my track meets, and all my award ceremonies...he was always there for me...he was the life of the party..."

Visitation will be Friday, 26 Dec. Funeral services will be at 1030 AM Saturday, 27 Dec, Hixson Bros Funeral Home, Alexandria, LA. Burial will be in Kinder, LA at the Green Oaks Cemetery at 1330.

State of Louisiana Parish of Calcasieu: Know all men by these presents: That I, Martin White, of Kinder, P.O., in the Parish of Calcasieu, Louisiana, for and in consideration of the price and sum of five (\$5.00) dollars, to me in hand paid by A.S. Garland, Martin White, J.S. Tingle, Francois Pitre, and H.J. Myers Trustees and for other valuable consideration have granted, sold and conveyed and by these presents do grant sell and convey with full subrogation of my right and actions of warranty against all former owners and vendors unto the said above named Trustees of Calcasieu Parish and State of Louisiana all that certain lot or parcel of Land situated in the State and Parish aforesaid and described as being five acres in the south-corner of the SW-1/4 of SW-1/4 section 13 Tp. 6 S.E. 5W. La Mer. Being the length of four (4) acres north and south and one and one-fourth acres east and west bounded on the south by south line of section 13 and on the east by SE-1/4 of SW ¼ of said section 13 Tp. 6S. R. 5 West La. Mer. It is agreed and understood that this sale and conveyance is made and accepted in trust for the use and benefit of the Congregational Church and for the use and benefit of the neighborhood as a cemetery. To have and to hold the above described premises together with all and singular rights and appurtenances thereto in any wise belonging unto the said Trustees and their successors forever and I do hereby bind myself, heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Trustees and their successors as such Trustees in trust as set forth, against any person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand at Kinder, Louisiana in the presence of S.L. Martin and Paul Leeds and J.W. Rhorer Lawful witnesses on this 15th day of April A. D. 1899. (signed) Martin White, accepting the above, A.S. Garland, Howell H. (his x mark) Myers, Francois (his x mark) Pitre, Trustees for selves and others. (attest) Paul Leeds, S.L. Martin and J.W. Rhorer.

State of Louisiana, Parish of Calcasieu: Before me John Webster Rhorer, a duly qualified Notary Public in and for the said Parish and State on this day personally appeared Martin White and the within signed Trustees to me personally known to be the identical persons whose names are subscribed to the foregoing instrument and they acknowledged to me in the presence of Paul Leeds and S.L. Martin witnesses that they executed the same on the date thereof, and that it was their own free and voluntary act for the uses and purposes therein expressed and signed same in my presence.
