

# Pure nostalgia: the piano recital From: The American Press Newspaper

Readers are invited to share memories. This reader recalls a piano recital in Kinder, early in World War II.

My sister, Ila Belle LaBuff Fontenot, recently shared with me the program for a piano recital held in Kinder in 1942.

The program reminded me how cultural growth for young people seemed to be the order of the day in a lot of communities in the 1930s and 1940s.

The names of the tunes these young piano students played gives you a sense of the times. The recital was held the night of May 21, 1942, at Kinder High School, by students if Mrs. J.T. Christian Jr.

DUHON RESEARCH"

I began working on my genealogy in 1995. I am not retired, so I do not have much time to devote to this endeavor, although when I do, it is always very satisfying. The chart that I have titled "Some of the Descendants of Lastie Duhon" was prepared by myself over the last several weeks. It is by no means complete. The chart is best used to easily visualize the relationships of Lastie's descendants. For more detail I have summarized as much information as I have been able to accumulate thus far on standard Family Group Sheets. A few of Lastie's grandchildren and many great children are living today. I have talked to many of these people by telephone. All the people that I have contacted have been very nice, especially considering that to most, I am a stranger. On the Family Group Sheets I have made a notation "incomplete" if I suspect that I have not listed all the children. If I have not marked "incomplete", I am reasonably sure that I have listed all the children.

For years I have been curious about the apparent divorce of Lastie from his first wife, Artemise Young. The only child of Lastie and Artemise was Elodie Duhon, my great grandmother. Elodie married Albert Nunez. The family of Lastie, Artemise, and Elodie are in the 1860 U.S. Census at Calcasieu Parish. Enumerated immediately before Lastie is his immediately family, parents Alexis and Marguerite with 5 children. Also, there is only one family between Alexi's family and the immediate family of Artemise, James Young with wife Irene and 4 children, enumerated after Alexi's family. Ahead of Alexi's family, there is only one family between Alexi's and that of William Langley with wife Mary Ann and 6 children, one of which is to become Lastie's second wife around 1866. I only recently noticed the close proximity of the William Langley family.

By the 1870 U.S. Census, Lastie is enumerated with wife Mary and children Joseph and Camille, still in Calcasieu. The James Young family in 1870 is at Grand Chenier in Cameron Parish. It appears that Elodie is listed there with her grandparents. I have not located Artemise anywhere in the 1870 census. Enumerated near the James Young family in Cameron Parish is Albert Nunez, Elodie's future husband. Apparently boys didn't travel very far to do their courting.

Albert and Elodie married in 1875. The 1880 census shows Artemise living with Albert and Elodie. It indicates that she is a widow. I have not as yet found any second marriage for Artemise. She is actually shown with Albert and Elodie in the 1900 and 1910 census too. Elodie is actually counted twice in the 1910 census. Albert and Elodie divorced shortly before 1910. You can also find Elodie enumerated with Lastie and Marie at Kinder in Calcasieu Parish. She is listed as "Lodi Nunez" and is indicated as "daughter". In 1997 I got to visit with one of my father's first cousins, Phillip Broussard Jr. at Lake Arthur. He grew up around his grandmother Elodie and all his aunts and uncles in southwest Louisiana. He told me that Elodie's father's people were from the Kinder and Elton area. Another interesting tie is that my grandfather Gilbert Evans Nunez, the youngest child of Albert and Elodie, was baptized in 1909 at the Jennings Church, even though he resided in the Lake Arthur area. Sponsors were listed as Joseph and Aurelia Nunez. Joseph was a younger brother of Albert Nunez whom my grandfather would periodically live with when he was a boy. My grandfather may have been traveling with his mother and aunt and uncle from Lake

Arthur to Kinder in 1909 when he was baptized. Apparently Elodie stayed at Kinder for a while. I have not found my grandfather Gilbert Evans Nunez anywhere in the 1910 census. He is not listed with his father in Cameron Parish, nor with Elodie in Kinder, or with his Uncle Joseph in Cameron Parish.

It was somewhat surprising to me when I realized that marriage and family difficulties that many people experience today are not that different from what many people experienced 100 years ago. My father's relatives have been able to tell me very little in the way of personal stories about Elodie's parents. I hoped to learn more about what my great great grandfather Lastie Duhon was like. In November this year, I began searching for living descendants from Lastie's second marriage, to Mary Langley, hoping to eventually hear some of those stories. After many phone calls, I was eventually led to a very special genteel lady in Basile, Mabel Doise Ledoux. She co-authored a booklet in the early 1980s, "Cheno Chapelle", about the Liberty Cemetery southwest of Elton. Lastie and many of his family are buried there. Mrs. Ledoux told me that she would ask around about any descendants of Lastie. In a few weeks she called me back to let me know she had found just one, Florence Duhon Dillard.


Cold telephone calls are difficult when you are trying to reconstruct your family tree. Mabel told me she would introduce me to Mrs. Dillard. I was nervous. What would Florence think when her half second cousin, once removed, showed up asking her a lot of questions about her great grandfather, who died in 1920 when she was just 7 years old? My wife and I met Mabel and Florence in November in Basile at the Pat Killeen Community Center. It couldn't have been more enjoyable. If I am lucky enough to live as long as these two young hearted women, I hope to have their same positive, friendly, youthful attitudes. Florence is now my "kissing cousin". I show everyone my snapshot of the two "chicks" I met during my fall vacation.

I met Florence at the beginning of my search, in earnest, for the living Lastie descendants. She actually remembered Lastie and Mary. Her great grandmother Mary used to give Florence and some of her cousins spoons and tell them to go out and dig in the muddy street in Elton to make mud pies. Florence had much contact with Lastie's youngest daughter, Mary Ann, who Florence knew as Aunt May. She also remembered that May had a brother Louis who also lived in Elton. Florence unfortunately had lost both her parents by the time she was 10 years old. Her father, Madison Duhon, had also lost his parents before he was grown. Life is truly hard. With the leads form Florence and many phone calls, I was able to put together the chart of Lastie descendants. With more time, I hope to get a more complete listing, and maybe even get some additional family stories. Who knows! Someone out there may even have some old snapshots of Lastie and family. 1920 wasn't that long ago.

### Emily (Emile) Marcantel

#### Notes

Emily Marcantel, older sister of my grandmother Laura, helped raise her little sister after their mother died. My grandmother was 11 months old when her mother died, and Emily was about 13 years old.

Aunt Emily as we always called her, was a gentle, but old fashioned lady. I thought she spoke strangely at times, such as, she would say "I hoped her", instead of "I helped her".

She had very little schooling, but was fairly good at business, as she ran a restuarant in Kinder for many years.

I never knew her husband, Joe Duhon, since he died of Typhoid Fever in 1911. She also lost a child then, and became seriously ill herself, with typhoid Fever. She was taken to St. Patrick's Sanitorium in Lake Charles, running a fever of 106, and all hope was given up of her survival, but slowly she improved, and lived to a ripe old age.

She was close to our whole family as I grew up, so I spent lots of times in her home. I thought she lived-in the biggest house in Kinder, since it had an upstairs (mostly an attic), and I was so fascinated by that attic. Only about twice was I allowed up there, and it seemed to be filled with all kinds of magical and mysterious items, which I longed to investigate. Sometimes, when I thought no one saw me, I would climb up to the top of the stairs and peek over the top railing trying to see and figure what that dark, secret chamber held. I remember seeing a couple old trunks, boxes, and pieces of furniture. But I never did get to explore to my hearts content.

In her living room, was a low chest, like a wash stand, with a swinging mirror, that could tilt up or down. On it, she had some fascinating items, such as a glass dome clock, with the clock works visable. I was very small for my age, but I could tilt the mirror down until I could see myself, and I would stand in front and admire all the pretty things, and look at myself. She would laugh, and encourage me to tilt the mirror.

After I grew up, I would go visit Aunt Emily with my grandmother, and much to my surprise, I realized that her home was really very small, compared to how it seemed to me as a child. And in those later years, I learned to appreciate the old furniture in her home. It was furniture many people would pay a fortune to own today. I often wish I had just one or two pieces now. Yes, I have many fond memories of my Aunt Emily. She was a precious "Gem", living a simple life style, old fashioned, with no modern conveniences, and content with what "The Lord provides".

September 14, 1911:

'Mrs. Duhon's Huband and Child Died, but She May Recover.'

"Mrs. Joseph Duhon was brought to St. Patrick's Sanitarium from her home in Kinder last evening suffering from a severe attack of typhoid fever, with which she was stricken a few days ago. Reports from the hospital today were to the effect that Mrs. Duhon's condition had improved since coming to the institution. When she left her home her fever was at 106. It dropped from this point and this afternoon stood at 101.

Mrs. Duhon's attack of the fever draws more than the usual attention to cases of this kind, she having within the past two weeks lost her husband and little child by the disease. Precautions have been taken at Kinder since Mrs. Duhon's removal from her home to prevent any further spread of the fever."


