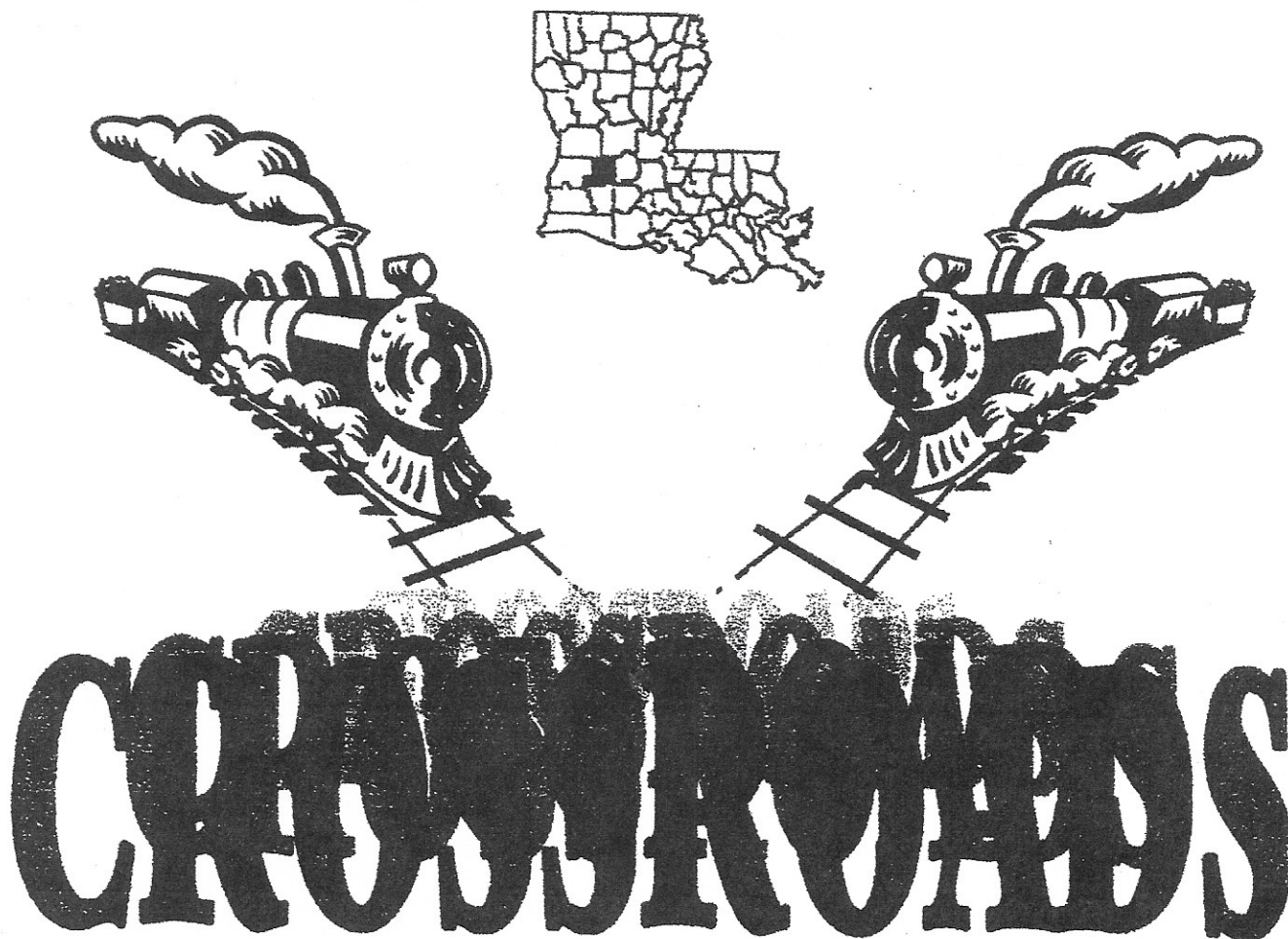

The Library will stock the necessary forms, and any member will be glad to assist you.

All new members are asked to supply a five-generation Ancestor Chart, which will be kept in a file in the Genealogy Room of the Kinder Library, and plans are to compile these into a book.

A blank five-generation ancestor form is included in each issue of CrossRoads. The Society will accept items of interest to publish in CrossRoads: copies of Land Records, Wills and Probates, Marriage Certificates, and copies of Obituaries are some suggestions.

The research Department of the Library now has Rev. Heberts' CD of his Records of SW LA; CD of Confederate Civil War Veterans, and also has the Allen Parish 1930 Census Microfilm, plus Microfilms of older issues of Kinder newspapers.

2. Louis Langley - Confederate War Veteran

Obituary:

Died - at the home of his daughter, Mrs Eugene Buller, on Thursday September 15, 1921

Louis Langley, aged eighty two years, eight months, and three days. The funeral services were conducted Friday at the Catholic church by Rev. Father Borel, and internment made in the Liberty Cemetery by the side of his late wife. The services were very largely attended and all places of business were closed for the hour.

Mr. Langley was born in Old Calcasieu Parish January 12, 1839; married to Miss Delphine Pitre in 1858, both being only nineteen years of age. They spent their entire lives in this vicinity; Mrs Langley having died in 1894. Uncle Louie, as he was familiarly known to every one, was a kind and congenial gentleman, loved and respected by all who knew him, and will be greatly missed. The children left to mourn his demise are: Clophas of Cloverdale, Maxile

And Ozema, Mrs Eugene Buller and Mrs Homer Buller of Elton. There are also surviving him, twenty-five grand children and thirty-seven great grandchildren.

The Octave & Evia Savant Oak

MEMBER, LOUISIANA LIVE OAK SOCIETY 1986

An Indian Village live oak tree has been admitted to the Live Oak Society, an organization of century-old live oak trees. The Octave and Evia Savant Oak is located two miles east of Indian Village, on that portion of the old Savant home place owned by the late Lorie Savant Chatham.

This tree is 17.4 feet in circumference at the trunk, and a limbspread diameter of 106 feet. A minimum of 17 feet trunk circumference measured four feet from the ground, is required for member in the Live Oak Society.

This picture was taken with a 35mm camera by Charles "Billy" Reynolds. The oak is so immense the picture had to be taken in three parts and then pieced together so he could get a photo of the entire tree.

The only surviving Savant family members, who grew up under this tree, are Mrs. Nellie Reynolds of Kinder and Mrs. Odelia Lawrence of Austin. They each have camp houses near the old tree.

A Landmark

(Excerpts from 'Entre Nous' - Kinder News March 1987)

The Wurlitzer Juke Box played all the greats of the "Big Band Era". The menu read, Hamburgers for 10c, and you could order 'ice cold' soda. A room would run about \$1 dollar per night; this included a bath down the hall. To a soldier during World War II, who had camped in a tent, these week-ends were a little bit of heaven.

No, this wasn't in a movie, or even in a large city; this was the famous "Bessie Hotel" in Kinder, Louisiana.

If you had a little leave time, or just wanted to go shopping for the day in Lake Charles you could catch a bus without a lot of waiting. Kinder was one of the few towns with two major highways, going north, south, east, and west.

Trailways passed through almost every hour. The owner of Trailways, Morgan Walker, was a frequent visitor.

Your host, Lucky LaBuff, and your hostess, Mrs. Ettie Horn LaBuff, would greet you and feed you, and see that things ran smoothly.

Some of the young soldiers who brought their "best girl" there for a hamburger, later married and settled in Kinder. One in particular was George Lovejoy, and his best girl, Stella Ortego, now his wife.

Mrs. LaBuff said (in an interview) that Stella was a lovely bride and is still just as pretty.

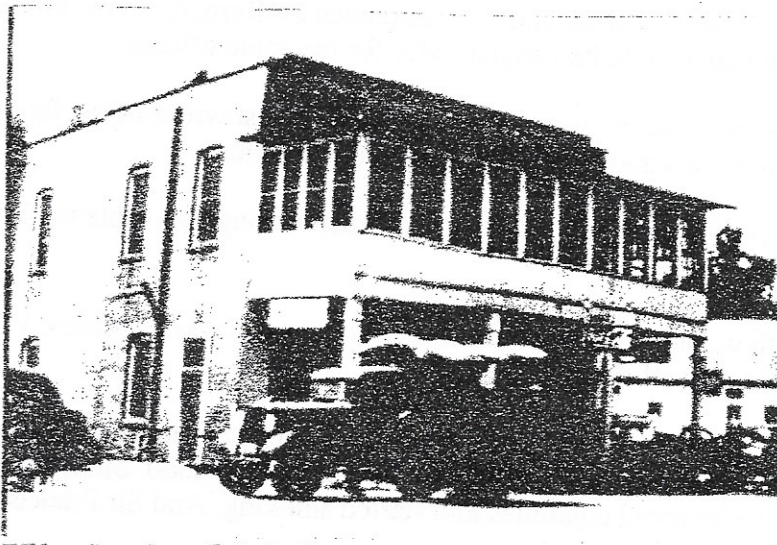
Another special, beautiful wedding was Miss Olla Belle LaBuff and Ed Fontenot, and Mr. Fred Allen sang.

After the LaBuffs, another manager was William Clark, father of Gertrude Fossett and Juanita Daigle.

The hotel, sold to the King Corporation in 1949, later became the site for the Chevrolet dealership, first for the Kings, then Elmer Doise, and later Klump Chevrolet.

Later a furniture store was opened in the old Hotel, then it was owned by Ryder Ford.

The grand Hotel of golden days was finally torn down, but there remains a generation in Kinder that will always treasure those wonderful memories.

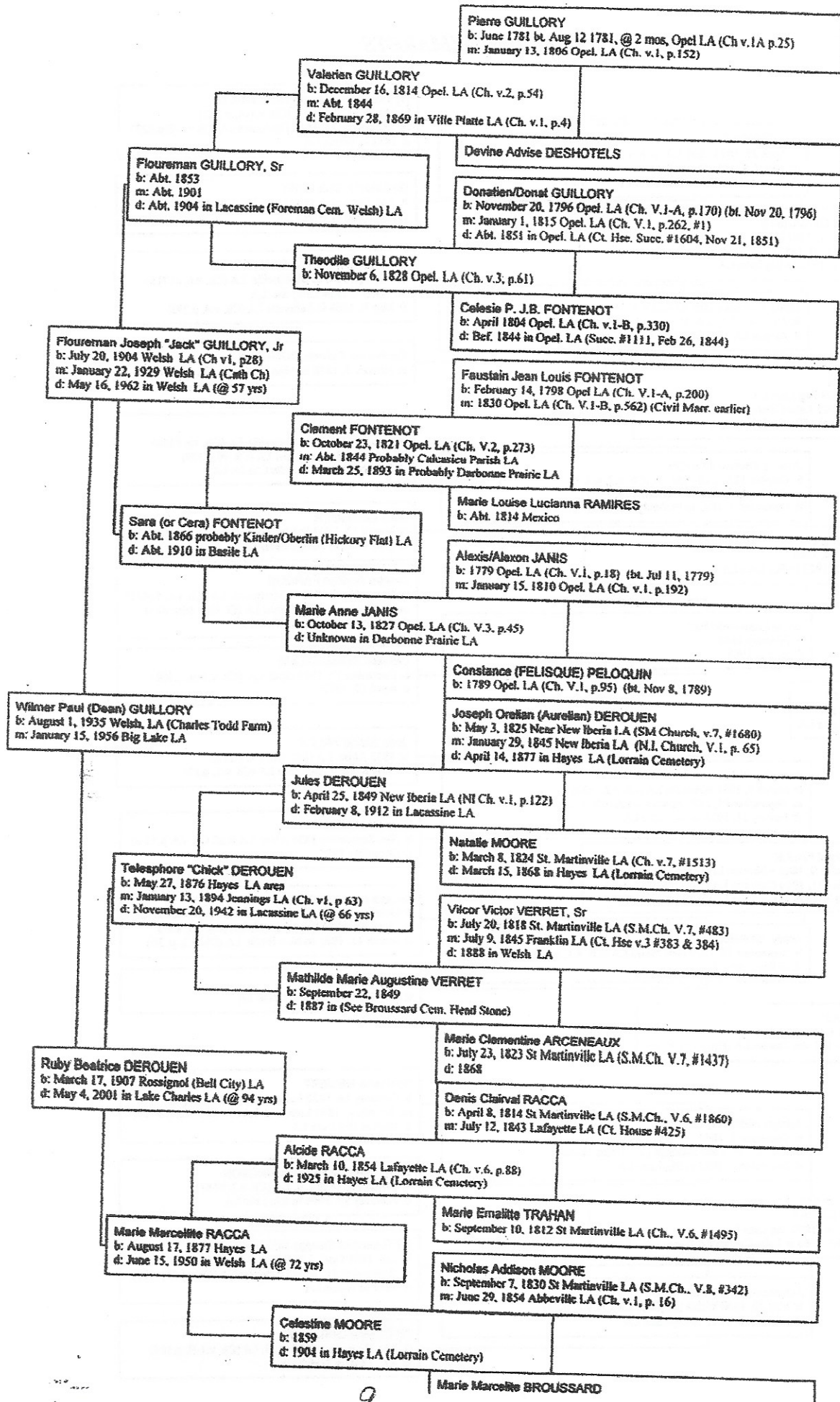


**Kinder's Old Bessie Hotel-Landmark
Of A By-Gone Era**

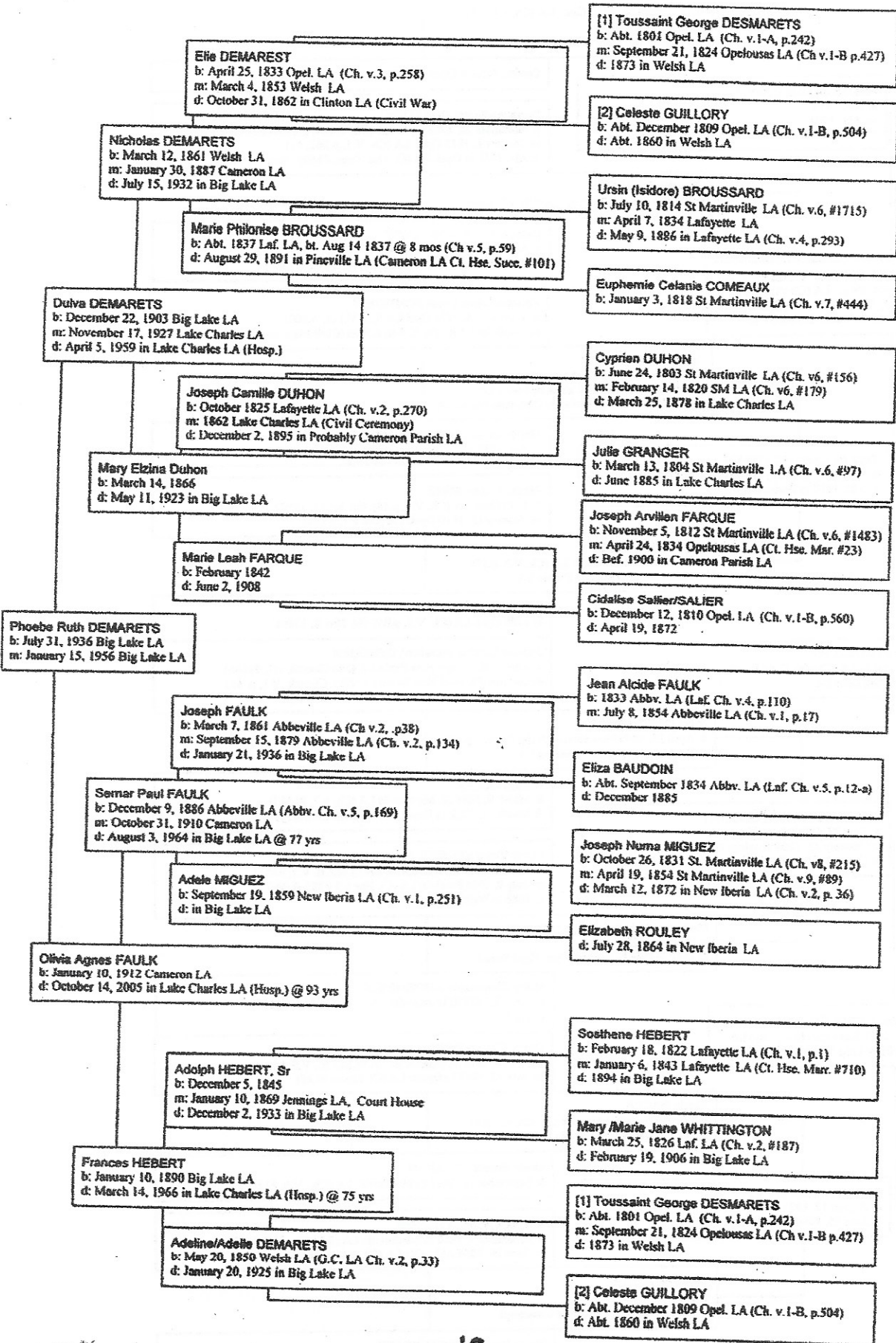
The following is a compilation of actual student GCSE answers.

Ancestors of Phoebe Ruth DEMARETS



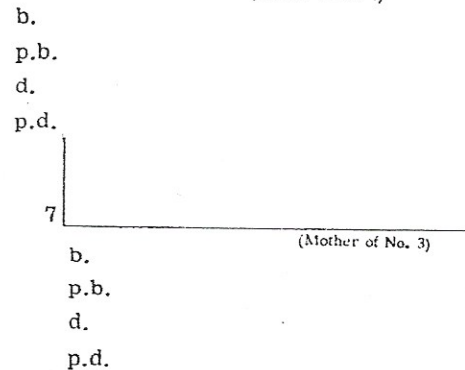
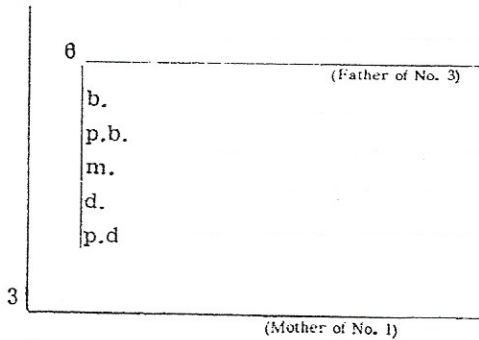
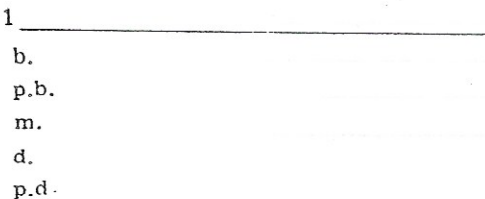
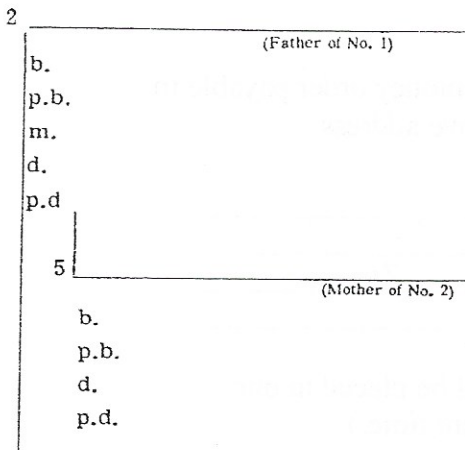
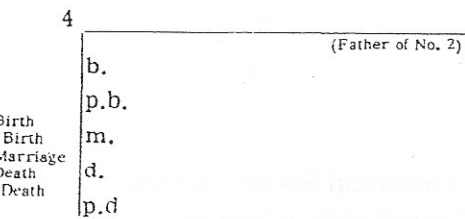
