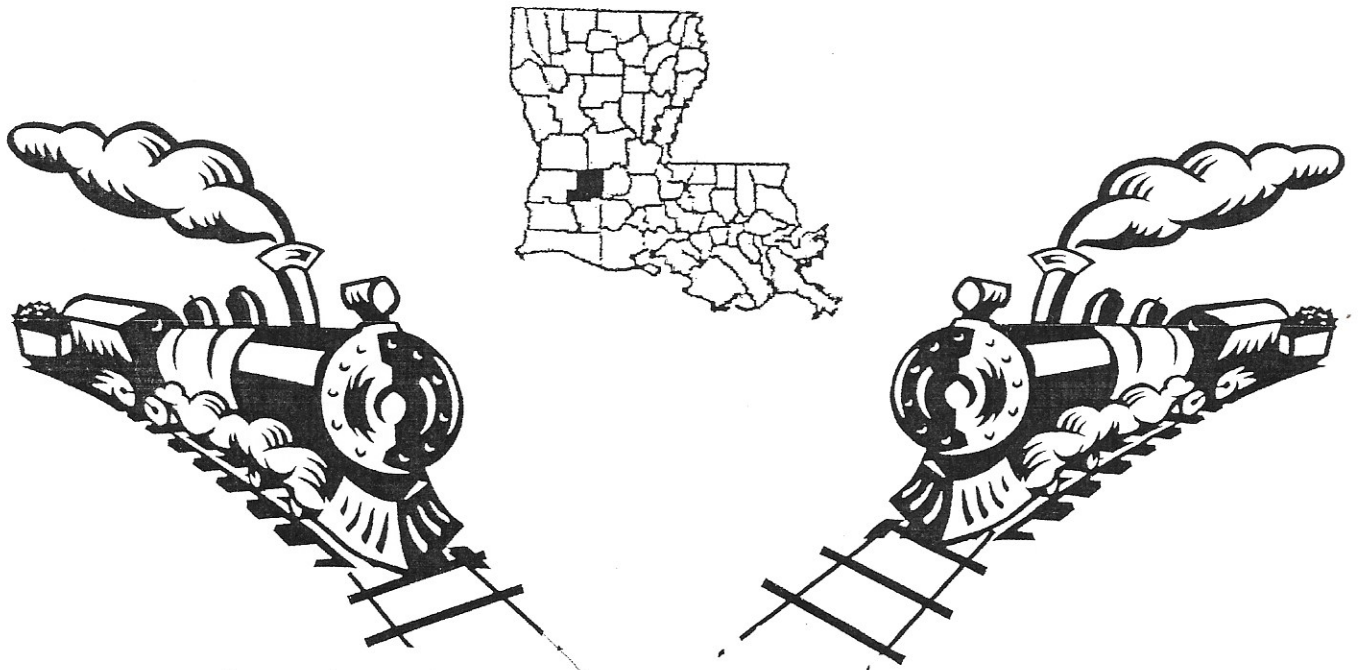

Some Interesting Early Genealogical Documents:

At the United States Mint in New Orleans, Louisiana, there are records of January 2, 1759 (Doc. 7344), showing Francois Marcantell (Marcantel) of Pointe Coupee and Pierre Richard signing a partnership contract for work on Marcantell Plantation, with both furnishing slaves to work on the Plantation, and the wife of Francois Marcantel to "take care of the hogs and chickens".

Francois Marcantel married Marie Anne Rondo (Rondeau), a Spaniard. (She died at age 25).

In a French Document (10302) dated December 30, 1767, Francois Marcantell of Pointe Coupee, married Marie Joseph Richaume, widow of Noel Soileau.

(Louisiana State Museum Library, New Orleans, Louisiana Volume #2).

In the Militia at Opelousas, 1770, is listed a Francois Marcantell, Italian; and also in the Federal Census of St. Landry Parish 1796, a Francois Marcantel, is listed as resident of the Quarter of Faquetaic, and also a Francois Marcantel, probably a son, residing in the Quarter of Coteau.

Michael Carrier is listed in this census living in the Quarter of Faquetaic along with several Fruges.

Pierre Richard, father and son, are listed in Quarter of Bellevue.

August 1810: Sale of Land; Louis Carriere for the sum of \$120 cash paid in hand, sells to Pierre Savant, a certain tract of land situated in the Grande Prairie.

November 30, 1810: Slave Sale; Joseph Lartique, in and for Francois Livaudais of City of New Orleans, sell to Louis Carriere, a Negro slave named Boca-aged about 15 years.

Business District is Looking Up

The Kinder business district is moving forward again and we hear of contemplated moves for improvements in the future.

Missouri Pacific Lines is nearing completion of the new Truck Terminal here, using the latest piggy-back method in moving freight in less than car-load lots from the source of order to the front door (or back) of the customer. It is reported that about fifteen new large van-type trucks will operate from Kinder. When an oil company orders supplies from Houston, they may be loaded into one of the vans, the van hoisted into an ordinary gondola car, trained to Kinder, the Gandy crane here will unload the complete van, a truck tractor will hook onto it and immediately deliver the supplies right to the job in the oil field. More detailed announcements will be forthcoming from Missouri Pacific in the near future.

George A. ASHY is nearing completion of remodeling inside his Western Auto Associate Store. The proprietor stated that he has re-arranged the interior to add more room for stock, and at the same time to make it easier for the customers to shop. Although he plans to continue to still handle furniture merchandise in small lots, he is primarily interested in the Western Auto phase of the dual business.

Harris SOILEAU, manager of Bruce's 5 and 10 Store is seen now beginning his one-block move from the stores present location near the Joy Theatre to the beautiful new PITRE building on the corner of Eighth Street (Main) and Fourth Ave. A gala opening is planned sometime in March which will not only celebrate the firm's new store, but also their first anniversary in Kinder.

Wayne SWORDS, local insurance agent, has completed his move into the Pitre Building. The Insurance offices are located in the rear of the main building, facing south on Fourth Avenue. Mr. SWORDS now has a main office and also a private office for carrying on the affairs of insurance with his customers.

The City Barber Shop, located on the corner of the new PITRE building, is operated by Paul LAFARGUE and Wildreau GRANGER. This portion of the building has been completed several months ago.

The entire PITRE building is air-conditioned and has a central heating plant.

Mr. Sidney PITRE, financier and business man who lives near Fenton, has sensed the potentiality for growth here and has invested his private capital in one of the most modern and beautiful commercial buildings to be found any place in Louisiana.

Letha Anderson, McMillin remember Kinder years ago

Sisters Letha Anderson and Hazel McMillin remember more about Kinder than most people. Age has something to do with it.

Letha was born in Lauderdale in 1910 and moved to Kinder in 1918, the year after her sister was born. Times have certainly changed since the sisters first roaming the dirt streets of Kinder.

"We didn't have a lot of things that we have now," Letha recalls. "There were no TVs and we didn't have a radio but we did have electricity."

Letha and Hazel are the children of the late Maude and Benjamin Saul Bertrand. Like so many couples

near the turn of the century, the Bertrands left the cold lands of northern America "to seek fortune" in the south.

"The thing I remember most is that Kinder had two passenger train depots," Letha says. "The young people would go and watch passenger trains coming in. That was the big thing."

"Some of the elders didn't approve of the young people going over to watch the trains come in."

Hazel remembers the Emad Sawmill by the Kinder pump "with a lot of nice homes out there. "There was a big commissary and store out there.

"My sister (Ruth Green)

taught out there and I used to go with her out there a lot," said Hazel, who now lives in Welch but visits her sister often.

Hazel also remembers jumping in her father's truck to the long haul over dirt roads to Lake Charles to see the Ringley Brothers Circus.

"There were a bunch of kids that wanted to go, so daddy loaded us up in his truck and we set out for Lake Charles. I remember it rained and we all had to sit under a tarp," Hazel said.

Letha remembers "old rice mills and cotton gins. I remember everybody being in farming."

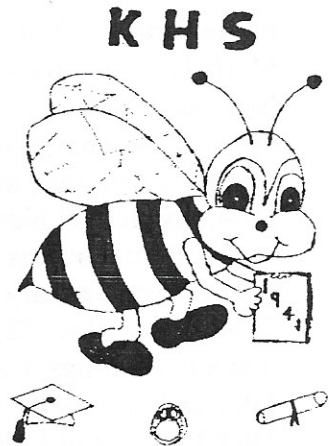

Noteworthy:

The first year book of Kinder High School was printed in this year. After an extensive search for an appropriate name for the book. "The Yellow Jacket" was chosen, and it has remained such since then. Most of the high school grades participated in putting this historic book into existence. Pictures were pasted to the pages, and information was typed the old-fashioned way. Page dividers were hand drawn. Contests were held for most intelligent, prettiest, most handsome, friendliest, and so forth. It was a fun project that drew the whole school together. Those who have copies in this day are very fortunate and prize their books highly. The yearbook project was put on hold for several years after that first one. So the 1941 issue of the "Yellow Jacket" is a collectors item, and those who own one hold on to it.



Jeansonne/Fontenot Genealogy

Jean Jeansonne, son of Charles Johnson (Jeansonne) and Marie Aucoin, married Anastasie Prejean, daughter of d'Amand Prejean and Madeleine Martin, were the parents of Rosalie Jeansonne, born in 1775. Rosalie married on November 22, 1790 at Opelousas, Louisiana, Jacques (Jacob Baptiste) Fontenot, born ca July 25, 1765. Jacques Fontenot died about 1821. He was the son of Jean Baptiste Fontenot and Marie Louise Lagrange.

Jacques Baptiste Fontenot, born July 10, 1810, Jacob Baptiste Fontenot and Rosalie Jeansonne, married Felicite Antoine Deshotels on September 7, 1833. She was born October 27, 1816 to Pierre Antoine Deshotels and Marie Louise Felix.

Pierre Antoine Deshotels was the son of Jacques Deshotels and Felicite Fontenot.

Marie Louise Felix was the daughter of Jean Baptiste Felix (Felisque) and Marie Louise Bienveau.

Jacques Fontenot, born July 2, 1836, died ca 1899, son of Jacques Baptiste Fontenot and Felicite Antoine Deshotels, married Melite Arville, born ca 1849; and their daughter, Adelle, born ca 1864, married on November 30, 1901, Frozan Fontenot, born April 15, 1864.

Frozan Fontenot was the son of Theodate Gabriel Fontenot and Hortense Reed. Their son, Lucien, born January 22, 1888 in Allen Parish, Louisiana, married on November 25, 1909, Alice Duhon, born Nov. 22, 1889 in Allen Parish. Lucien Fontenot died March 28, 1972 in a Nursing Home in Jennings, Louisiana, and his wife died July 30, 1971 in same Nursing Home.

Alice Duhon was the daughter of Francois Duhon, born Aug. 4, 1853, died Nov. 24, 1907 in Allen Parish, and Edvise Ortego, born June 22, 1855, died Nov. 11, 1931 in Allen Parish.

Francois Duhon was the son of Alexis Duhon and Marguerite Trahan.

Edvise Ortego was the daughter of Joseph Sostien Ortego and Marcelite CyprienGranger.

Frank Joseph Fontenot, son of Lucien Fontenot and Alice Duhon, born March 9, 1914 at Kinder, Louisiana, married on Nov. 21, 1936 Octavia LaFleur, born Sept. 12, 1918 near Elton, Louisiana; the daughter of Valcour Joseph LaFleur, born Nov. 2, 1892 in Allen Parish, baptized at Prairie, Louisiana; married in 1913 to Marie Ozite Ortego, born Dec. 14, 1891 in Allen Parish, died Aug. 9, 1968 at Houston Medical Center and buried in Liberty Cemetery near Elton, Louisiana.

Valcour Joseph LaFleur was the son of Joseph Olivier LaFleur, born 1863 and Azema Buller, born Jan. 7, 1868, died Nov. 10, 1947 at Elton, Louisiana.

Joseph Olivier LaFleur was the son of Valcourt LaFleur and Suzanne (Susan) Jeansonne, born ca 1841. Suzanne Jeansonne had first married Joseph LeBleu. She was the daughter of Edmond Jeansonne and Sarah McDonald Kimball.

Edmond Jeansonne was the son of (Loman) Edmond Jeansonne and Suzanne Lewellin. Sarah McDonald Kimball was the daughter of Wade Kimball and Elizabeth (Betsy) Stokes. The parents of Wade Kimball were Frederick Kimball and Sarah McDonald The parents of Elizabeth Stokes were Frederick Stokes and Anna ??

Azema Buller was the daughter of Emile Buller and Elizabeth Jeansonne. Elizabeth Jeansonne was the daughter of Henry Jeansonne (son of Edmond Jeansonne and Sarah McDonald Kimball) and Evalina Carantin.

Delia "Dee" Mae Fontenot, born Feb. 6, 1939, at Kinder, Louisiana, was the daughter of Frank Joseph Fontenot and Octavia LaFleur. She married John William (Billy) Chandler on July 6, 1957 at Elton, Louisiana

Marie Ozite Ortego was the daughter of Orise Ortego, born Dec. 15, 1862, and Octavia Deshotels, who had previously married Jean Adam Chaisson. Orise Ortego was the son of Onile Ortego and Marie Julienne Doguet.

Octavia Deshotels was probably the daughter of Pierre Deshotels and Genevieve Manuel.

Valcourt LeFleur, born May 18, 1837, had a twin brother, Valmont. Valcourt LaFleur's first wife was Laura Boular (Buller), and third wife was Lucille Young.

Valcourt LeFleur was the son of Olivier LaFleur and Celeste Pierre Baptiste Fontenot.

Olivier LaFleur, was born Nov. 21, 1797, and married Oct. 10, 1820.

Celeste Fontenot, born April 1804 and died Dec. 19, 1881, was the daughter of Pierre Baptiste Fontenot (born July 25, 1776), and Celeste LaFleur (born Feb. 24, 1776). Pierre and Celeste LaFleur Fontenot were married Sept. 15, 1794.

Pierre Baptiste Fontenot was the son of Jean Baptiste Fontenot and Louise Lagrange. Celeste LaFleur was the daughter of Jacques LaFleur and Marianne Fontenot (daughter of Philippe Fontenot).

Olivier LaFleur was the son of Jean Baptiste LaFleur (born about 1768) and Marguerite Berza dit LaFleur (born Dec. 24, 1766).

Melite Arville, who married Jacques Fontenot, was the daughter of Eloi Arville and Marie Louise Langley. Eloi Arville's second wife was Marie Louise Fontenot.

Parents of Eloi Arville were Joseph Antoine de Arville (born May 9, 1795) and Perrine Fruge, daughter of Joseph Fruge and Marie Friget (may be Fruge). Joseph Antoine de Arville (de Avila) was the son of Joseph Joachin de Avila and Marie Jeanne Fruge.

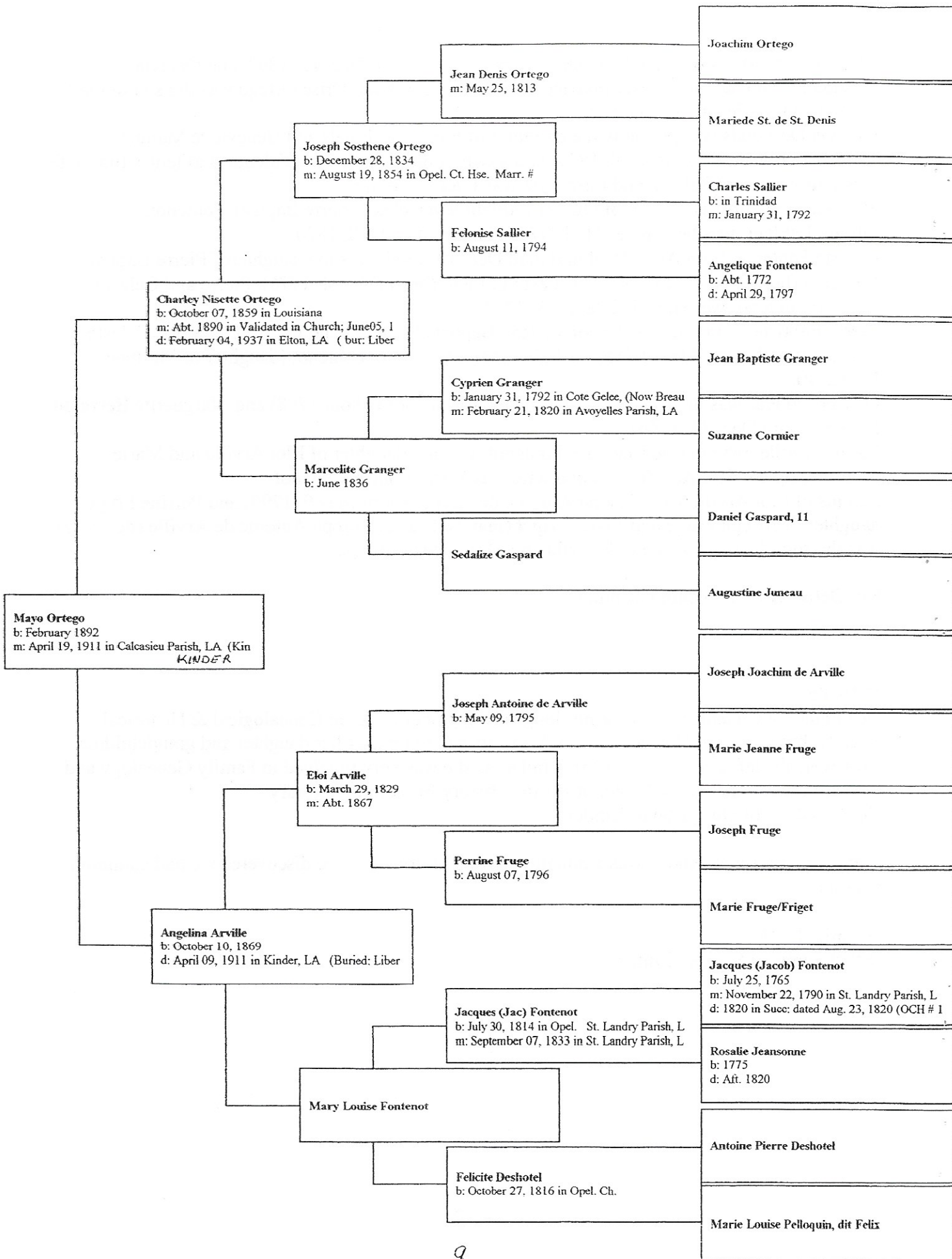
***Notes:

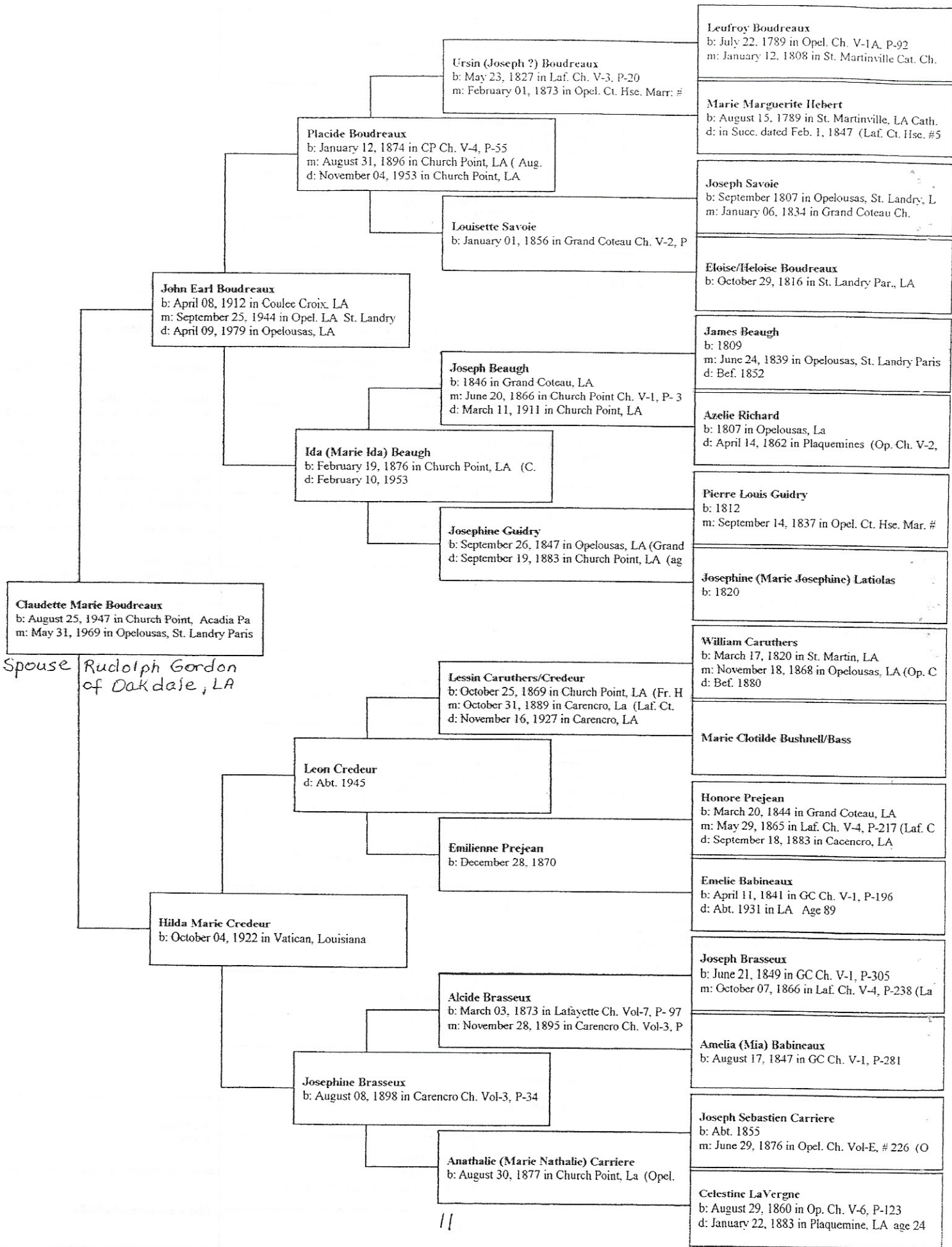

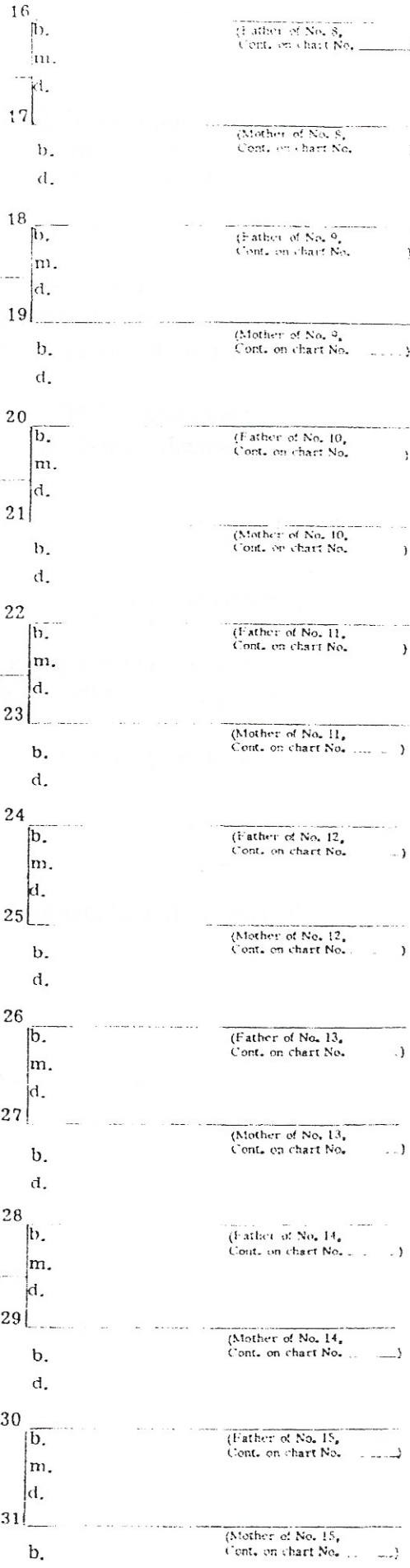
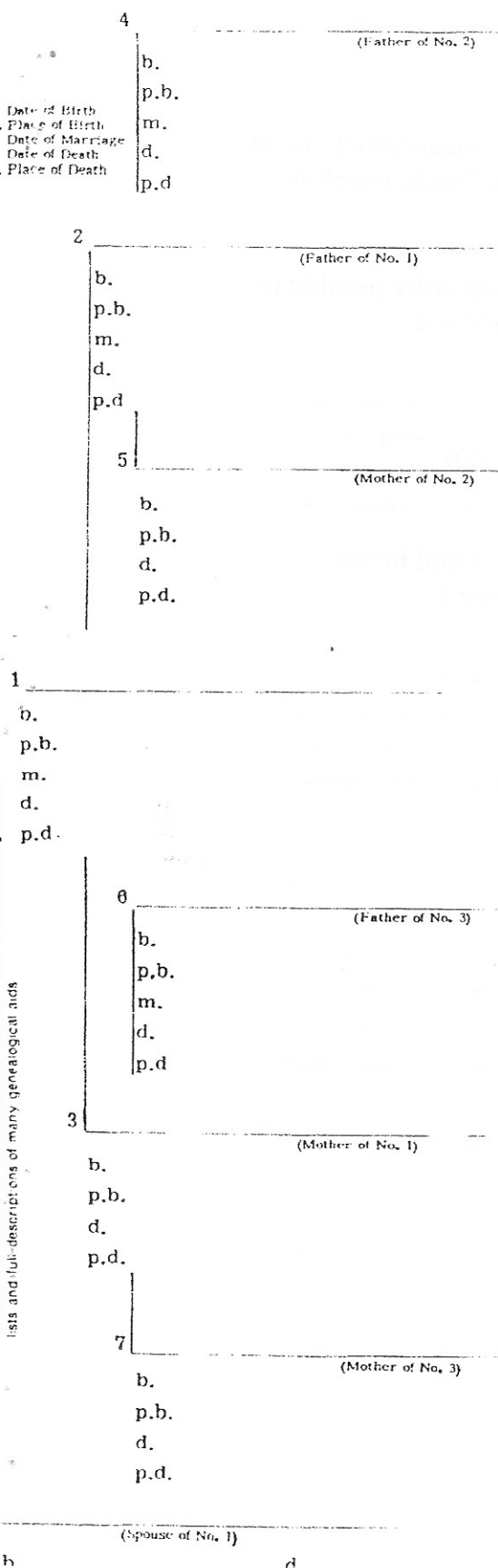
Ancestor Chart
