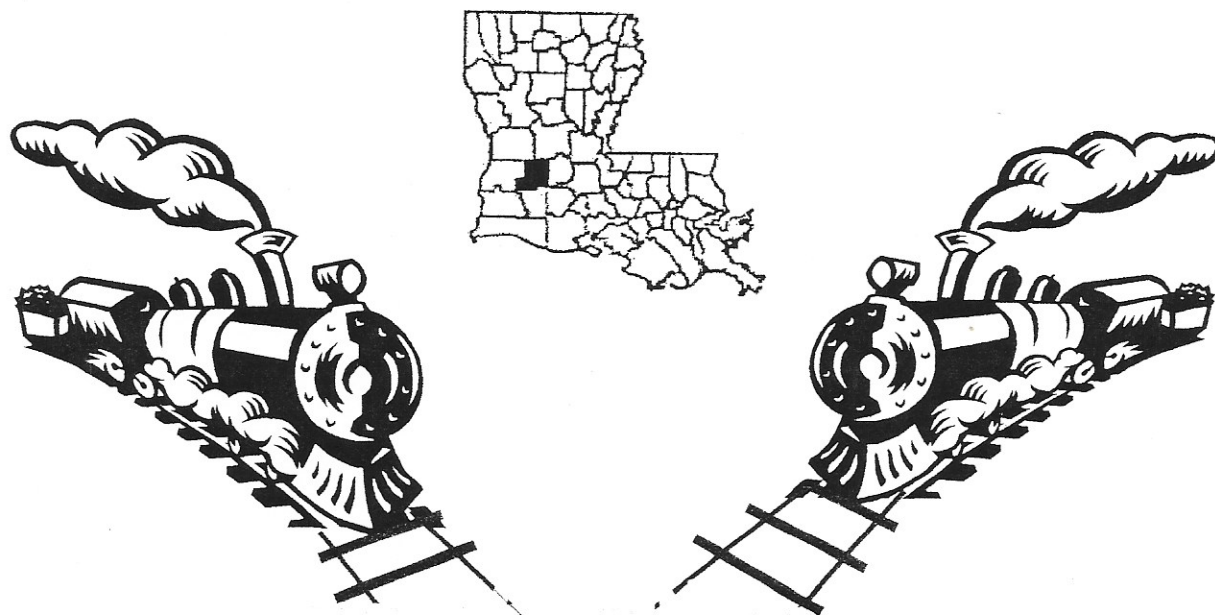

1. GEORGE WASHINGTON³ COE (*DAVID HUDSPETH², JAMES¹*) was born November 10, 1856 in Rapids Parish, Louisiana, and died June 30, 1901 in Near Oberlin, Louisiana (Rev. Paul Leeds Ch. Records). He married MARY VICTORIA CASTELLO/ COSTELLO 1878 in Louisiana, daughter of PEDOR COSTELLO and CELESTINE RODRIGUEZ. She was born November 13, 1860, and died December 28, 1910 in near Oberlin, Louisiana.

Notes for GEORGE WASHINGTON COE:

A handsome man with brown hair and blue eyes, he was a farmer near Hickory Flat, Old Calcasieu Parish. He was a dedicated churchman and charter member of Pine Chapel Baptist Church, helping build the Church near Oberlin, LA, and donated land for the church cemetery. He died, reportedly from shrapnel which had lodged in his skull from a gun which exploded in his hand several years previous. He is the Ancestor (great grandfather) of World Building Champion, Mr. Universe and Mr. Olympia, Boyer Coe.

Opened: June 24, 1912

To the Honorable the Judge of The Fifteenth Judicial District Court of The State of Louisiana, in and for the Parish of Calcasieu: The petition of David Coe, a resident of your said Parish and State with respect represents:

That his father George Washington Coe died in your said Parish and State eleven years ago, and his Mother Victoria Coe died in said Parish and State two years ago, leaving as their sole heirs; petitioner, C. T. Laird, Arabella Laird, Bessie Carroll, Athan Coe, Stella Coe, Lela Strother, Melven Coe, Myrtle Coe, and Ethel Coe.

That petitioner as the son of the deceased is entitled to be appointed Administrator of their Succession; that said deceased left at their death movable and immovable property in your said Parish and State, and left debts privileged and ordinary which must be paid; that administration of their estates is therefore necessary.

Wherefore, petitioner prays that due notice may be given of this his application to be appointed Administrator of their Succession and that after due proceedings had he may be appointed Administrator according to law; that a commission issue to some Notary to make an inventory of all the property left by deceased. He further prays for all orders and decrees necessary and proper in the premises and for general relief.

World War II songs

Warm, dreamy ballads were most favored

World War II songs ranged from the patriotic to the sentimental.

The period just before, during and just after the war were part of the big-band and "swing" music era.

Crowds gathered to hear, or dance to, music by bands led by Glenn Miller, Harry James, Count Basie, Duke Ellington, Sammy Kaye, Johnny Mercer, Woody Herman, Jimmy and Tommy Dorsey and dozens of others.

Vocalists included Bing Crosby, Dinah Shore, Frank Sinatra, Ella Fitzgerald, Dick Haymes, the Andrews Sisters, Jo Stafford, the Mills Brothers, Peggy Lee, Helen O'Connell, The Mills Brothers, Bob Everly, Tony Martin, The Ink Spots, The Merry Macs, The Pied Pipers, Fats Waller, Doris Day and others.

Popular songs during World War II could be divided into categories, with patriotic tunes like "Remember Pearl Harbor" and "Praise the Lord and Pass the Ammunition," morale-booster songs like "Accentuate the Positive," song-stories like "Bell-Bottom Trousers" and "First Class Private Mary Brown," and themes of love, parting and separation like "As Time Goes By," "I'll Walk Alone," "I'll Be Seeing You" and "I Don't Want to Walk Without You."

As the war approached its end, songs about homecoming and reunions emerged, like "It's Been a Long Long Time," and "My Dreams are Getting Better All the Time."

Homefront songs, most of them topical, were also popular, like "Rosie the Riveter" and "Milkman Keep those Bottles Quiet" in "Milkman," vocalist Ella Mae Morse sang of the sleeping difficulties of women working night shifts in American defense plants. There were a few novelty and humorous songs like "Mairzy Doats" and "Leave the Dishes in the Sink, Ma."

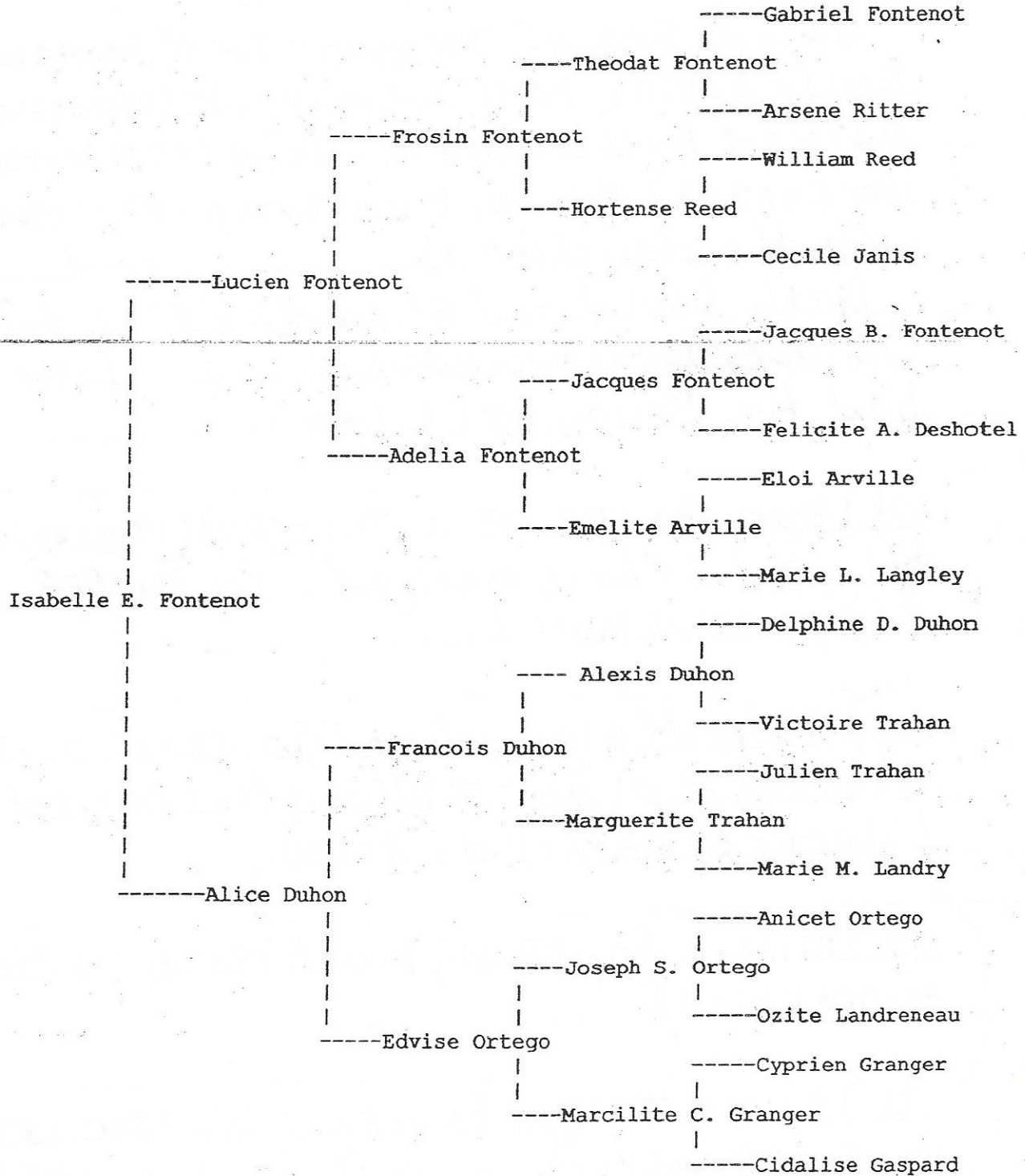

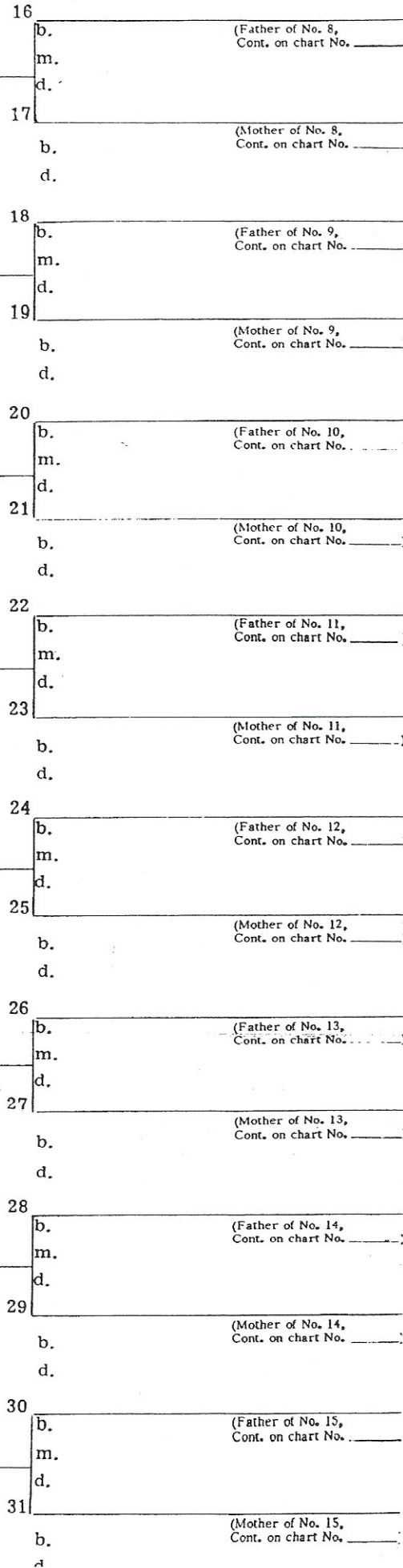
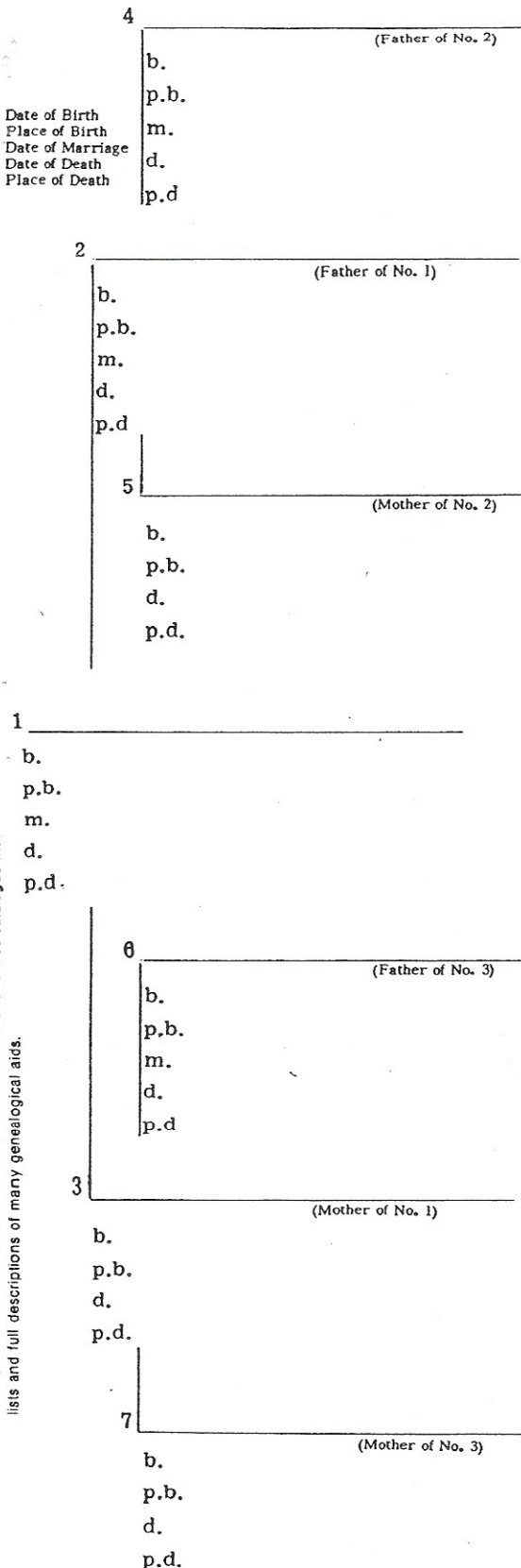
