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SPECIAL SPEAKER

September 17, 2002 meeting of the Allen Genealogical & Historical Society was held in the Genealogy Room of the Kinder Branch of Allen Parish Libraries, at 10 AM.

Mr. Gerald Harrington, Clerk of Court for Allen Parish, was the guest speaker. He gave a very interesting and informative talk and discussion on functions of Clerk of Court offices, and records available, and how best to search and obtain copies of these various records.

Civil, Probate, Successions, and all Criminal records are processed and maintained by Clerk of Court. All Elections are handled, machines are kept in working order, ballots checked, Jury lists kept for selection of Jurors, and the office also act as Ex-Officio notary for Allen Parish (such as someone wanting to get copies of marriage license, birth certificates).

All systems are being up-dated, according to Mr. Harrington. A more modern filing system has been put into place; those records on microfilm are being converted to CDs, computer programs instituted, and "back indexing" is underway. All this is very time consuming and expensive, he stated, but will in time, provide more efficient, cost effective system, and a safer method of preserving valuable records.

As of now, all original records can be seen, but will be pulled by Deputy Clerks in the office. A fee will be charged for all copies

Mr. Harrington elaborated on the fact that microfilm can't be converted to CDs, and this is a work in progress. Also of particular interest was the recording of Military Discharges, (DD214). This service will be done without cost as an honor to all veterans.

Another interesting item is: Birth Cards may be obtained at the Clerk of Court office. These cards are now just as acceptable as Birth Certificates, according to Gerald Harrington.

The Clerk of Court and office does a tremendous service for all Genealogists, and is to be commended for the vision demonstrated.

Obituary of Susan White Langley (April 1, 1839 - October 4, 1929)

Mrs. Susan Langley was possibly the oldest person in this section, born April 1st. 1839, on Beaver Creek. She was one of five children born to Meredith and Louisa Lee White. Other children were Martin White, Lucinda (Mrs. Wm. Jackson), Elizabeth (Mrs. Francis Peet), and Emily (Mrs. Howell Myers), all deceased before the Civil War, the family moved to Green Oak Settlement and lived on the old Gidlow place, north of the little church. About 1861, the deceased was married to Jean Battiste Langley, son of John Battiste; Emily Reid Langley, and moved at once to the old home now occupied by their son Austin, and his family. In this home they lived, raised their family, and died, husband dying October 22, 1914, and now the wife October 4th. 1929. Of the children but two survive, Paul and Austin. The deceased were Miss Clemence, Millie (Mrs. Narcisse Fruge), Andre, and Oscar, a twin to Austin. In 1916 Mrs. Langley united with the Congregational Church at Green Oak and attended services till she was past ninety years old, long as health and strength permitted. For several months, old age and sickness confined her to her home and bed, during which time she suffered greatly, but in quiet resignation and trust. Her body was laid to rest in Green Oak Cemetery beside her husband and where many relatives lie, on Saturday, October 5th., services being conducted by her Pastor, Paul Leeds. Another link with the vanishing past has been broken with, the Tribune shares in sympathy with the bereaved friends.

Meredith and Louisa Lee White and children are listed on the 1850 Calcasieu Parish Census. In the 1860 Calc. Parish Census, Susan White is 18 years old and still living at home in the Hickory Flat area. Susan's husband, John B. Langley (1835 - 1914), was the grandson of Jean Langley (abt. 1784 - 1820) and Marie Anne Olivier, widow of Nicholas Fruge. They were both early settlers of the Opelousas District.

It is interesting to note that there are many, many descendants of the above families, living in the Kinder, Kingsfarm, Green Oak, and Indian Village settlements as of today.

A son of Meredith White and Louisa Lee White was Martin White, who was a brother to Susan White Langley, and who lived in the Kinder area. He served as a Confederate Soldier in the Civil War, and about 1871, married Marie Selina Pitre from this area, and they made their home here. Martin White donated land about five miles north of Kinder to be used for a Church and a Cemetery. It became known as the Green Oak Cemetery. That is where Martin White is buried, along with his sister, and many other member and descendants of his family.

The White, Langley, and Pitre families have an interesting and colorful history in Allen Parish, and "CrossRoads" plans to do further features on them.

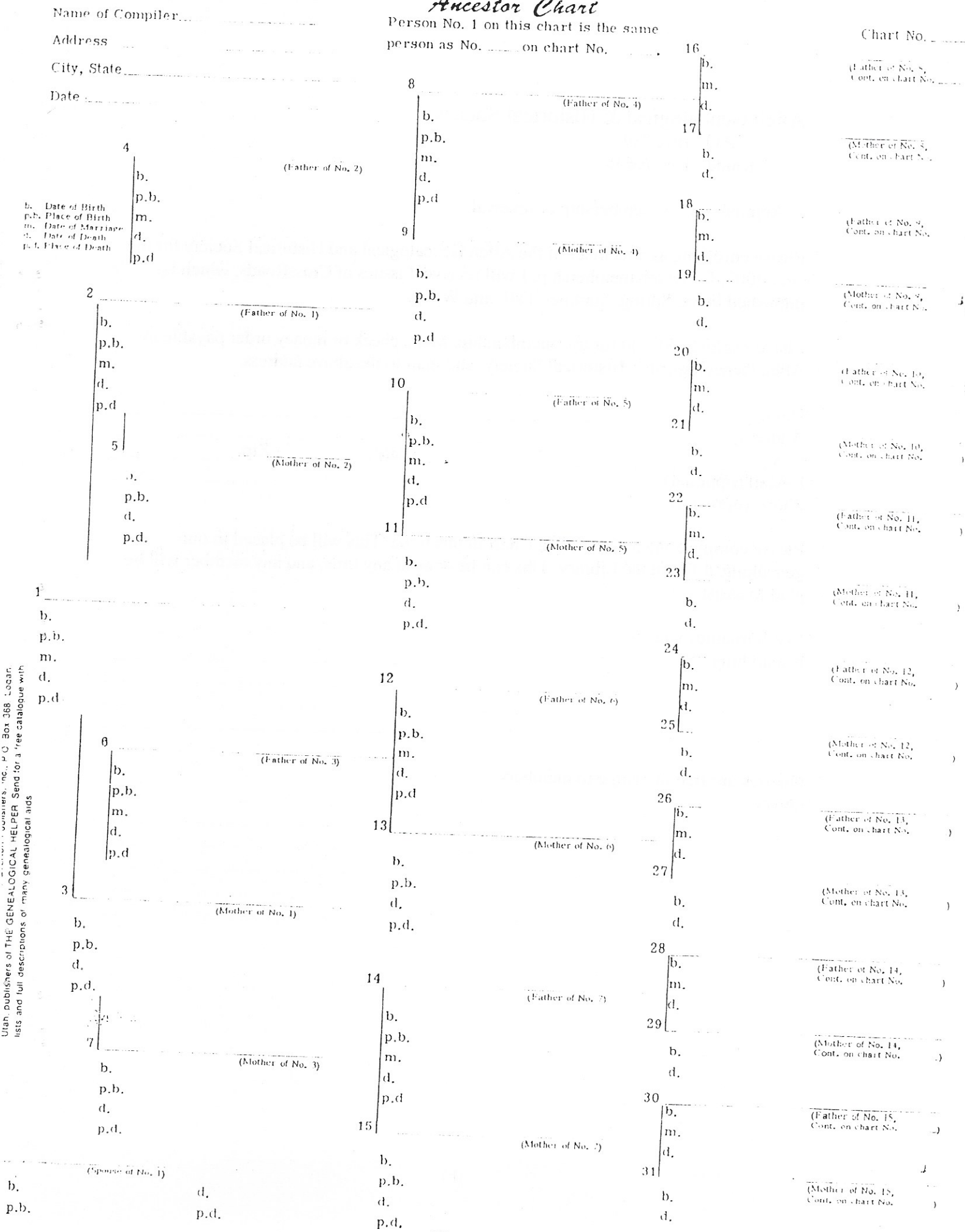
