

The Library will stock the necessary forms, and any member will be glad to assist you.

All new members are asked to supply a five-generation Ancestor Chart, which will be kept in a file in the Genealogy Room of the Kinder Library, and plans are to compile these into a book.

A blank five-generation ancestor form is included in each issue of CrossRoads.

The Society will accept items of interest to publish in CrossRoads; copies of Land Records, Wills and Probates, Marriage Certificates, and copies of Obituaries are some suggestions.

The research Department of the Library now has Rev. Heberts' CD of his Records of SW LA; CD of Confederate Civil War Veterans, and also has the Allen Parish 1930 Census Microfilm, plus Microfilms of older issues of Kinder newspapers.

Pentecostal Church Beginning in Kinder, LA (Excerpts from "Looking Back at Kinder" and Pentecostal Church Records)

In 1934 Blanchard L CLARK moved to Kinder and became Pastor of the First Pentecostal Church. He had married Vida Lee DONAHUE of Kinder, the daughter of Garland "Cork" Donahue and Louise RION.

The Donahues had kept the church going for a few years, but were in need of a pastor. Cork Donahue was a farmer, and later worked for the Railroad that was coming through the town. He established a rural mail route serving the river area and some of the northern section of Kinder.

With Vida Lee's musical talents, she was invited to assist with the music in a series of meetings in the area, and in Urania, Louisiana she met a preacher named Blanchard Clark which resulted in a church wedding on February 17, 1934 uniting Vida Lee DONAHUE and Blanchard L CLARK.

Rev. Blanchard Clark felt the call of God in his heart, and coming to Kinder, he saw the need for a Pentecostal preacher, and someone to fulfil the role as pastor. He remained for fifty years. He and Vida Lee had two children; Joan Clark and Ricky Clark. Joan grew up to be a wonderful leader in the church. She married Murrel EWING and they started their own church in Lake Charles. Vida Lee's sister, Emma Lee DONAHUE was a Sunday School teacher until she married Bro O'BRIAN, then they started a church of their own in Starks, Louisiana

Rev. B. L. CLARK started with a small church and only a handful of members. Some of the first members were family of Louise RION of Reeves, and the Donahues of Reeves. Bill GORDON and his family had moved into town just a year or so before and began attending, which added about ten new members. Mrs Emma LACAZE, her son Lad and daughter Evelyn became members. A KELLY family of LeBlanc were added.

Soon the church was growing and Bro. Clark became well known in the area and revival was taking place. Other churches in the area would visit, especially when special revival services were held. At these special times, Mr John SAVANT from Kingsfarm, who drove a school bus, would load up his bus on Friday and Saturday nights and bring the people to the revival. (Yes, in the school bus).

As the church grew, a board was formed; some early board members were: Thurston BAGGETT, Titus BUSHNELL, Elmer ALEXANDER, Dudley SOILEAU, and Lynn MARCANTEL. Elliott FONTENOT became assistant pastor. His wife Velvarie HAYMON FONTENOT assisted with singing and church duties. Chester BUSHNELL became Sunday School Superintendent, and Hazel BAGGETT was Sunday School Secretary. Sallie BAGGETT was church organist, and Shirley MARCANTEL was Church Secretary. Sally and Marvin BAGGETT were loyal members.

A youth department was formed with Loretta GORDON and Judy SONNIER as leaders. Chester BUSHNELL married Jean DUHON and Horace BAGGETT married Jean's sister, Shirley. They were loyal members. Jean and Shirley, Sunday School teachers, were the daughters of Wesley and Clemmie SOILEAU DUHON. Clemmie was a steadfast member.



Katy Vige was the mother of Cleonese. She had a little house not far from this house. When Katy died they buried her in the Green Oak Cemetery in Kinder.

William died young. He, his parents and sister, Tavia are buried in the Rigmaiden Cemetery in DeQuincy. Gus and Della are buried in the Perkins Cemetery in DeQuincy.

My Mama said when the boys came to see the girls, Cleonese had the girls in the kitchen and the boys on the porch and she sat down in the doorway. She would not let the boys get close to her girls

Della married Jim Shoemake; for a while they lived in DeQuincy. Marclan died and Cleonese sold this place in Marcantel Settlement, house and 60 acres of land, to them. Jim and Della built another house and Jim used the old Langley house to store his hay and feed for the cows. He had a Dairy.

Marclan was a faith doctor. Gus was a Baptist Preacher. Gus married Louetta Marcantel, daughter of Ernest "Nessie" Marcantel and Eliza Francis White.




**Genealogical Notes: by Ethel Fontenot Sacker
