

CHARITABLE OBJECTIVES

The main purposes of Urban Christian Outreach are: to establish contact with those in the city of Ottawa who are struggling to survive spiritually, physically, or psychologically; and to mitigate the effects of urban isolation on the life of the individual.

We do this by pointing people towards a relationship with God through faith in Jesus Christ, and by offering ongoing pastoral and practical care, including Christian education, street literacy and life-skills tutoring.

Urban Christian Outreach staff engages in mobile outreach on the streets, and in the coffee shops, parks and other communal places of the city. We especially (but not exclusively) develop ongoing relationships with those whose fragilities make it difficult for them to function in group settings. We seek to be present to their need, even when there are no apparent solutions, thereby offering hope, respect and dignity to the individual.

Urban Christian Outreach works in co-operation with other agencies by referring clients to social, medical, shelter, educational, employment and Christian organizations that will further expand the individual's personal network within the community, and will serve his/her various needs.

The heart of the work is relational. However, from time to time Urban Christian Outreach may develop structured programs and projects that are in keeping with the central focus of enhancing the well-being of those who are experiencing urban isolation and deprivation. This will be done according to the needs of the clients and the qualifications of current staff.

The geographical area of outreach and projects is within a five-mile radius of Parliament Hill (Ontario only). Follow-up may take us into other areas of the city, for home, hospital and jail visits.

We engage in dialogue and speaking engagements with individuals and groups, to promote a wider understanding of existing needs, and to search out possible solutions.

Annual Report from the President of UCO for 2023

In his book, 'God and the Pandemic,' bishop, scholar, and author N.T Wright, says:

... so often when people look out on the world and its disasters, they wonder, why doesn't God just march in and take over? Why, they ask, does he permit it? Why doesn't he send a thunderbolt... and put things right? The answer is that he does send thunderbolts – human ones. He sends the poor in Spirit, the meek, the mourners, the peacemakers, the hungry-for-justice people... These people, prayerful, humble, faithful, will be the answer, not to the question, Why?, but to the question, What? What needs to be done here? Who is most at risk? How can we help?'

Dear Friends,

I have begun my Annual Report for 2023 with this observation by Bishop Wright because it answers the questions of what UCO does and how it meets its mandate. Those we serve are those "human thunderbolts", he speaks of. I remember our founder, and former Executive Director, Katrine Barton-Coward, telling me that "We need the poor." I don't think I fully understood then what she was saying.

Unfortunately, the Adult Education Program at the Royal Ottawa Health Centre did not resume this past year as hoped. We pray that it will resume in the fall of 2024.

2023 has been no less challenging than 2022 was for the clients we serve, but to UCO's financial status as well. This was due to the lack of sufficient donations required to meet our commitments. As I prepare this report, we are continuing to experience a marked shortfall well into 2024.

Our Executive Director, Jill Wilson, continues her unwavering devotion on our behalf, reaching out to the ever more distressed people she is seeing on the streets of our beloved city. God has called us to do this work and we thank you for your prayers and support.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace and Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Thank you for your generosity and faithfulness in providing for Urban Christian Outreach in the Year 2023. God blessed us, and he blessed the poor among us. While we ended our year with a deficit, we can still be so thankful for the many wondrous things that our Lord did in our midst. We were able to help so many people, and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ and the hope that we have in Him, with those who struggle to get through the day.

Our work continues with those affected by addictions and mental health issues. I am happy to report that lives have been changed for those who entered addiction programs. Praise be to God! Thank you for your prayers! We hope to continue to refer more people to recovery programs.

We are currently in the planning stages of offering The Alpha Course in the fall, and would appreciate your prayers and support to make this happen. This program as you may be aware, is a 12 week introductory course to Christianity. We provide a meal, a video, and small group discussion. The course includes a weekend retreat, usually held at a camp or retreat centre just outside of the city, In past courses, many of our guests have said that it was their first time outside of the city of Ottawa! Lives were changed, as guests gave their lives to follow Jesus. We are seeking volunteers who might be able to help us with this ministry, by providing a meal, or financial support, or by helping out as a volunteer



Sidewalk Outreach and Pastoral Care

We serve an awesome God, and we are so very blessed to be called to minister among the poor, the homeless, and the marginalized of downtown Ottawa. Our ministry is quite unique; there are no other Christian ministries doing the work that we have been doing for the past 31 years. Here are some ways in which we are unique:

- * our ministry is prayerful and intentional; we follow the leading of the Holy Spirit, who takes us out onto the sidewalks, into coffee shops, shelters, parks, court houses, prisons, libraries, hospitals, and even under bridges
- * the Holy Spirit often draws us alongside those who struggle to be around people; those who don't frequent soup kitchens and shelters
- * we engage with people of all faiths, or no faith at all; we seek to share God's love
- * unless someone is shadowing us as a volunteer, we go alone, and not in pairs, often to those who are uncomfortable engaging with 2 people at a time. However, we know that we are not truly alone; God is with us. Emmanuel!
- * we engage in matters of justice, and sit on roundtables in order to improve the life of the poor
- * staff and volunteers receive ongoing training in areas of pastoral care, suicide prevention, addictions, mental health, Spiritual direction, healing ministry, senior abuse, human trafficking, and Bible studies
- * we offer Bible studies, one on one, to those who can't cope in a group setting

- * we build long lasting relationships and friendships with those who are interested; some tell us that we are their only friend in this world
- * we offer ongoing support to those who struggle with mental health issues and addictions
- * we seek to build a support network around those who need help from various services
- * we offer the Alpha Course from time to time, both one on one, and in small group settings
- * we come alongside the poor and help them to develop skills, often referring them to programs
- * we teach literacy and basic math in the downtown core, and in a classroom at the Royal Ottawa
- * we help to coordinate medical, dental, and legal appointments
- * we help with housing, supportive housing, access to services in the community, jobs, paperwork, etc.
- * we welcome opportunities to speak to congregations, church groups, and small groups about our ministry and about the plight of the poor

Bible Study

Bible Study continues to be a favourite part of my work. There is something so very special about opening up our Bibles in a downtown coffee shop, to sit with our friends, and to read God's Word written, aloud. I am amazed by the number of people who look at us, or who offer a smile or an encouraging comment. Sometimes, a stranger will ask to join us; Praise God! We are working our way through the Gospels with one of our UCO friends, after having read the entire Old Testament. With others, sometimes our Lord calls us to reflect upon just one verse. One study guide that I find helpful is, 'Through the Bible in One Year', by the late Baptist Minister, the Rev. Dr. Alan B. Stringfellow. Whether we are reading full chapters or just a verse, we invite The Holy Spirit to help us to read, to bless us with the eyes, ears, and mind of Christ, and to write his Holy Word upon our hearts. Thanks be to God!

UCO/ROMHC Adult Education Classroom

In partnership with the Royal Ottawa Mental Health Centre, we have a long history of working alongside Occupational Therapists (OT's) and volunteers to provide an Adult Education Program in a classroom environment. Enrolment is ongoing throughout the school vear; students are not restricted to the September to June schedule offered by the school boards. Students work on a variety of subjects including math, history, science, English reading and writing, Food Safety Training, computer skills, and G.E.D. (High school equivalency) as well as I.L.C. (Independent Learning Centre) credits. We hope and pray that we will be able to reopen our classroom in the fall of 2024

UCO's Treasurer's Report for 2023

Total income for the year 2022 was \$47,663.03 Our budget target was \$60,000.00

Total expenses were \$61,236.66. Our budgeted expenses were \$59,805.00

Income was below budget by \$12,336.97, and expenses were above budget by \$1,431.66

Budgeted surplus was \$195.00; however, by the end of year we had a deficit of \$13,573.63

The ratio of donations from individuals as compared to the ratio from churches and organizations is as follows:


· Individuals: 69.66 %


· Churches & Organizations: 30.34%
