I was moved to tears when he presented his gift and shared his story from his heart – from the very heart of Jesus. May our Lord bless Liam and may he continue to be a blessing to others through Liam. Praise God for this little child, for 'to him belongs the kingdom of heaven.'

Our classroom at the Royal Ottawa is full and students have been working hard on various subjects. I recently had the joy and privilege of inviting a fellow church member, Tina, to join us in the classroom as a volunteer. Tina, a faithful Christian, High School teacher, and Ph.D. in Education Candidate, was a blessing to staff and students. Tina shares her experience in our classroom in the following letter:

The Royal Ottawa Adult Education Program: Volunteer Experience

Jill Wilson, Executive Director of Urban Christian Outreach, described her job to me on Monday night. "I do different things, but part of my job is to teach within a classroom" stated Jill.

I was curious about the classroom environment that Jill mentioned.
I offered to volunteer in this particular educational institution in order to gain a better understanding of this unique educational system. The students within this system were referred to as students instead of mental health patients.

The unique part of this learning environment was that there were between two to three educators. occupational therapists, or volunteers all working together to help the students with their individual educational plans. Students educational objectives varied from learning the alphabet to taking the GED (General Education Diploma), a High School Equivalency Certificate which shows that students have a level of knowledge equivalent to a high school graduate. This environment also promotes social skills, self-care abilities, and Food Safety Certificates in order to help students become more employable in mainstream society. The learning environment was calm, quiet, respectful and engaging. Students came and worked on their school work, asked questions if they needed help and were treated with respect and dignity. I had the pleasure of observing the Food Safety Course during the second half of the class.

While sitting amongst the students, this was the first time where I had observed students as God's children. I had a strong feeling that these students will too be able to contribute to society in a powerful and meaningful way in the near future. I thanked Jill for sharing this part of her life with me.

It was one of the most beautiful, heartwarming, and soul-fulfilling teaching experiences I have ever encountered as an educator.

This is an experience that I will remember for the rest of my life.
