Please pray for Albert (not his real name) who has been diagnosed with cancer, and will undergo surgery later this month. When I met with Albert, he accepted my offer to prayer with him. God did not disappoint. The Holy Spirit showed up in such power, that we were filled to overflowing with his presence and his peace. Albert was praising God, as we lingered in prayer. Neither of us wanted it to end. He now has renewed faith and trust in our Living God!

I also met with Pat, (not her real name) who is struggling to keep her housing. Every month, she is at risk of being evicted from the over-priced room that she rents. Housing could possibly be obtained were she to become homeless and end up in the shelter system. However, we are hoping to avoid this lengthy step.

I was so looking forward to visiting one of our longtime friends downtown. When I called him to set up a time to meet, I was told that Bob, had gone home to be with Jesus recently. I was so sad, I cried. Bob had struggled with addictions over the years, and was vulnerable to home takeovers and drug dealers. However, by God's loving mercy and kindness, our friend Bob, came to know Jesus, through one of our Street Alpha courses a number of years ago. We were able to help him get released from prison, and into supportive living care. Bob died peacefully in his sleep, likely heartrelated. It was a privilege to call Bob our friend, and we thank God for him and for our Lord's Saving Grace.
