Foundation of Trust


Trust forms the essential base for all productive professional relationships and collaborations.

The essential elements: clarity, tone, timing, empathy




Clarity in Communication

Verbal Communication

Words convey the message directly, forming the foundation of effective communication.


Body Language

Vocal Cues

The 7 Cs framework for powerful messaging



Clarity and Conciseness

Messages should be clear and concise to ensure the audience easily understands the intended meaning without unnecessary words.

Concreteness and Correctness

Use specific facts and accurate information to make messages believable and trustworthy.

Coherence and Completeness

Ensure messages are logically organized and include all necessary information to avoid confusion.

Courtesy in Messaging

Communication should be polite and respectful to build positive relationships and encourage engagement.


Audience-centric approaches to tailoring communication

Know Your Audience

Comparing communication styles: assertive, passive, and aggressive

Assertive Communication

Assertive communication balances respect for self and others with clear, direct expression of thoughts and feelings.

Passive Communication

Passive communication involves avoiding expression of personal needs and yielding to others, which may lead to misunderstanding.

Aggressive Communication

Aggressive communication involves forceful, disrespectful expression that can damage relationships and hinder positive dialogue.


Techniques for active and reflective listening

Active Listening Essentials

Open Questions

Affirmations

Reflective Listening

Reflective listening demonstrates empathy by actively understanding and mirroring the speaker's message.

Summarising

Summarising clarifies understanding and reinforces key points to ensure accurate communication.



Being open and honest during crises builds trust and reduces uncertainty in stakeholders.




Maintaining Calmness

Ethos - Credibility


Ethos builds trust by establishing the speaker's credibility and authority to influence the audience effectively.

Acknowledging Emotions


Recognising and validating emotions encourages empathy and strengthens relationships.

Reducing Cognitive Load


Visuals help minimize mental effort by presenting information clearly and succinctly.

Self-awareness helps identify personal communication strengths and areas needing improvement for better interactions.


