CASE SPOTLIGHT

United States v. Suarez
25-cr-106

What's the Basis?: According to the factual basis, an **investigation** revealed that **Suarez used CashApp to send funds in exchange for child sexual abuse material (CSAM)** on multiple occasions. Law enforcement executed a **search warrant** at the Suarez's residence and **seized an Apple iPhone 13 Pro Max**. A **review of the device revealed that the Suarez actively searched for, downloaded, and maintained at least 186 images and 853 videos depicting the sexual exploitation of minors**.

The evidence further established that the files involved real, identifiable victims and were obtained and maintained using electronic devices connected to interstate commerce.

What's the Violation?: Suarez pled guilty to **Receipt of CSAM**, in violation of **18 U.S.C. § 2252(a)(2),(b)(1)**.

What's the Punishment?: The Honorable Judge Wendy B. Vitter sentenced Suarez to **118 months of imprisonment, 8 years of Supervised Release, and \$42,000.00 in restitution**.

(21 U.S.C. §§ 841(a)(1), (b)(1)(C), (b)(1)(B))
Sentence: **30 months of imprisonment** and 5 years of supervised release.
Judge: Honorable Wendy B. Vitter
