# Unregistered Firearms, Revocations and Misprison...

## CASE SPOTLIGHT

### **United States v. Dustin Calahan** 24-cr-246

What's the Basis?: The Factual Basis states that the FBI issued search warrants for Mr. Calahan's Facebook and Twitter accounts, which eventually led to a search warrant for his residence. During the search, FBI agents recovered a short-barreled rifle. According to the ATF, a short-barreled riffle is defined as having a barrel length of less than 16 inches. Possession of such a rifle is without a special tax stamp, which Mr. Calahan did not possess. Agents also recovered a silencer that was not properly registered.

What's the Violation?: Mr. Calahan pled guilty to two counts of Possession of Unregistered Firearms, in violation of 26 U.S.C. §§ 5841, 5861, and 5871.

Sentence: Judge Sarah S. Vance sentenced Mr. Calahan to 12 months and 1 day for each violation. The sentences are to run concurrently.
