CASE SPOTLIGHT

United States v. Us-Real

What's the Basis?: According to the factual basis, ICE Enforcement and Removal Operations officers were conducting targeted immigration enforcement operations in Metairie, Louisiana, when they identified a vehicle connected to a previously removed Guatemalan citizen. Agents then initiated a traffic stop for the purpose of determining the occupants' immigration status.

During the stop, **the driver and the front passenger, Us-Real, were removed from the vehicle after allegedly struggling with agents in an attempt to flee. Officers deployed OC spray before ultimately placing Us-Real in handcuffs.** The factual basis further states that, **while detained in a government vehicle, Us-Real bit an ICE officer's finger.** The factual basis also states that **Us-Real used his head to push the officer backward, escaped from the vehicle while still in handcuffs, and continued struggling with the officer before fleeing the scene on foot.** Authorities caught Us-Real approximately one month later. Us-Real ultimately admitted that he intentionally assaulted a federal officer while the officer was performing official duties.

What's the Violation?: Us-Real pled guilty to **Assault on a Federal Officer** in violation of **18 U.S.C. § 111 (a)(1).**

What's the Punishment?: The Honorable Jay C. Zainey sentenced Us-Real to **5 months of imprisonment** (before subtracting and taking into consideration the three months served prior to his arrest).

This Week's Other Matters

U.S. v. FOLEY, 24-CR-198

Charge: Felon in Possession of a Firearm

(18 U.S.C. § 922(g)(1) and 924(a)(8))

Sentence: 26 months of imprisonment followed by 3 years of supervised release.

Judge: Honorable Eldon E. Fallon

U.S. v. MCCLAIN, 25-CR-177

Charge: Possession with Intent to Distribute Methamphetamine and Fentanyl

(21 U.S.C. § 841(a)(1), 841(b)(1)(A), and 841(b)(1)(B))

Sentence: 37 months of imprisonment followed by 3 years of supervised release.

Judge: Honorable Barry W. Ashe
