First, we will visit the beautiful Dubuque Arboretum and Botanical Gardens, a nonprofit organization, that was established in 1980. The 57-acre campus is maintained 100% by volunteers. Their mission is to establish, preserve, and maintain a place that is a source of information, education, enjoyment, and beauty for all.



Then we will spend a special day aboard the Riverboat Twilight. Since 1985, the Riverboat Twilight has delivered one of the most exceptional cruise experiences in the Midwest. And it's not just a cruise; it's a conduit to reconnection, relaxation, and renewal. Marvel at the majestic Mississippi river while relaxing in style aboard a stunningly replicated

Enjoy breakfast before we make our way to Antique Archeology. It's the birthplace of Buffalo Bill. The two-story former fabrication shop is the home base for the American Pickers Show on the History Channel. It now houses some of their best picks and a new merchandise store. After our visit we will stop in Rockford, IL for lunch before checking into our overnight accommodation for the evening.



After a brief stop to freshen up at our hotel, get ready for a wonderful buffet dinner and show at the Fireside Dinner Theatre. Since 1964, the Fireside Dinner Theatre has been the premiere entertainment destination in the Midwest for superb musicals featuring Broadway performers, fine dining, and boutique shops in a one-of-a-kind setting.
