3. New Evangelization


DOMESTIC CHURCH – Men and women who complete a Cursillo weekend almost universally transform from PRACTICING THEIR FAITH TO LIVING THEIR FAITH. Because Cursillistas live their "fourth day" for the rest of their lives, through weekly meetings with other Cursillistas focusing on Piety, Study and Action, the movement has sustaining influence on the faith lives of those who attend a weekend, unlike those who attend a retreat or conference, where "follow up" is often non-existent. This strengthens the family unit as depositories of the faith. Many wives report a major blessing, as their husbands often begin to take a faith leadership role in the family, once completing a Cursillo weekend. The importance of strong faith leadership from both parents, especially the father cannot be underestimated.

VOCATIONS – One of the direct benefits of stronger faith families is that they become a fertile ground for vocation development. There are many stories of children who have expressed an interest in vocation, only to be discouraged by one of both of their parent or other family members. Cursillo families would universally support vocations, in their children, grandchildren, and in others.

NEW EVANGILIZATION – In order to attend a Cursillo weekend you must be a practicing Catholic capable of receiving the sacraments. While Cursillo does not reach out to non-Catholics during a Cursillo weekend, the theme of Cursillo is "**Make a Friend, Be a Friend, Bring a Friend to Christ**". So the outcome of the weekend is aimed at bringing others, who may have never encountered Christ, into the Church.
