**“For by grace you have been saved by faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God.”**

Ephesians 2:8-10, NRSVue

Dear Friends,

In October, my thoughts turn to Martin Luther, and although the above verse isn't as famous for leading Luther to the knowledge of God's grace as Romans 3, it was definitely one of Luther's favorite verses. It was one of the verses used at my mother's funeral 13 years ago and will be one of my Scripture readings as well.

The writer of Ephesians points out that by grace we have been saved by faith, but we had nothing to do with it. It is God's gift. Grace is God's gift. Our faith is God's gift. We do not save ourselves. We do not have the control here. God is in control. During this past year, I have had to remind myself of that every day.

I am a person who very much likes to be in control. You may remember one of my Reformation sermons where I talked about having my first car that boasted cruise control. It was at least a month before I had the courage to use cruise control because the car was in control, not me. Now, 24 years later, I am addicted to cruise control and I'm sure it's saved me from many a traffic ticket! The ELCA Churchwide Assembly was in Phoenix this past summer. Some of our Southern Ohio Synod staff put pictures on Facebook as they rode driverless cars. They looked like they were having fun, but my thought was "Nope. Nada. No way." Way too much surrender of control.

God has a sense of humor. My two main careers have been as a journalist and editor, and as a pastor. Those are about the two worst careers for someone who likes some control. Some order to her day. The newspaper is called the newspaper because it publishes the NEWS. Something is always new. As an editor, I would have my day planned, and one of my reporters would come in with a story that might be horrible news -- we had some really terrible murders -- or great news, but it might mean that we had to change the layout of the front page at the last moment. Election nights were really stressful. If machines went down in Montgomery County Board of Elections, we had no choice but to stay in the offices until we could get the suburban results we needed. No control. And as a pastor, I never know what each day will

bring. I may have my week planned when that old saying becomes evident: "God laughs when you tell him your plans."

With Pastor Ron's health issues and with my own small surgery for basal cell carcinoma, I could be somewhat in control. We knew about his surgery and follow-up. Those could be scheduled. I knew I would not be able to lift more than 8 lbs. for two weeks or to kneel, stoop, bend, or pick up things. So I made sure that I got in groceries before his surgery and again before mine, and I caught up on laundry, which entails me walking from upstairs to the basement with a basket load of dirty laundry and climbing the stairs again with the basket of clean laundry. But I could not control how many times I dropped things I was not allowed to pick up. I drop things a lot, it seems. I could not control the 9 hours we spent in the ER due to his acute gout and bursitis that probably had nothing to do with his original surgery. I could not control the low blood count he had after a follow-up procedure that meant he had to spend another night at UC instead of coming home. I had a lot planned that had nothing to do with making two round trips to Cincinnati. Everything turned out OK. I tell my flock to "give it up to God," but someone needs to remind me!

This "out-of-control" thing with God is a GOOD thing, not a bad thing. We do not have to do anything for God to love us. We cannot do anything that will make God stop loving us. Even though I believe that God's heart is breaking over how many times we ignore Jesus' New

Commandment, "Love one another as I have loved you," God still doesn't abandon us. For Luther, this realization was so freeing. In fact I would recommend to you his treatise on "The Freedom of a Christian." Luther struggled with doubts to the end of his life, probably because he suffered from depression. But in the end, he always clung to God's promises and preached grace to all.

God loves you so very much. If you have something between you and a brother or sister, please make it up. Both of you are God's children. If you have a circumstance, be it family problems or health problems, give those problems to God. Luther decided to make the Scriptures accessible to everyone by translating both testaments into German. Luther wanted all of us to see the jewels included in the Holy Bible and the grace that God talks about.

As we approach the Feast of the Reformation, read your Bibles. Find a devotional that speaks to you. Find a time to talk with me about the Bible if you have questions. Come to the different Bible studies. We have one in Acts going on at Dorcas Circle, and we will begin another Advent Bible study in December. We are theologians of the cross. Jesus saved us. We are gracious recipients.

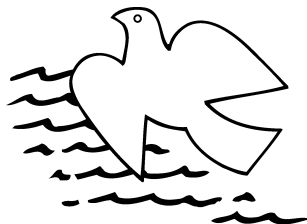

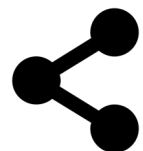
