

Dear Friends,

In the eight years since the *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* book came out, this has become one of my favorite hymns for both Advent and Epiphany—both times of seeking light. This third verse especially resonated with me as people waited desperately for their SNAP benefits or even to find enough money to buy food for a decent Thanksgiving dinner. These are people who do work, sometimes two or three jobs, but at minimum wage or less, cannot always put food on the table. Some are suffering because they had a serious injury and lost their insurance due to the bills they still had to pay. Some are senior citizens who are trying to raise grandchildren and great-grandchildren. One thing I will tell you—people cannot hear the Gospel over a rumbling stomach. And people who are struggling will know you by your actions, not your words. Jesus and the Old Testament had a lot to say about the way people claiming to be religious treated others. When we feed, give drink, clothe, visit someone in jail or who is ill, we have done it for Jesus.

And yet, my heart is joyful this week. This church put together 62 boxes so that those who are struggling can put decent Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners on the table. Yes, the affordability was not as good as last year, but we still went out and put these boxes together. Our young people carefully checked each box before taking them all over to the Interfaith Pantry at Sardinia Hope Church. This hymn asks God to "Make us your bread, broken for others, shared until all are fed." When we put together these boxes and when we take lunches around to families in need during the summer, we are God's bread, broken for others.

I love this communal aspect—bread, broken for others. I did some Holy Communion instruction

the other day where we talked about how important meals were in Jesus' day. People gathered together, ritually washed their hands, and shared from bowls with each other. Isn't it interesting that Jesus dips bread in a bowl and gives it to Judas? He breaks bread, even with Judas, who will betray him; even with Peter, who will deny him. At the end of the road to Emmaus, Jesus breaks and blesses the bread and then disappears. The disciples know him only in the breaking of the bread. Jesus also broke and blessed the five loaves and two fish (and later the four loaves and two fish). This was also a Holy Communion. Each Sunday, I will break and bless the bread for communion, as God speaks through me the words of Holy Communion.

Making sure that all are fed and all have water to drink is a way to prepare the way during Advent for our Christ to come. Christ, be our light this Advent season. Shine in our hearts both individually and as the church gathered today.

Game Night




Warmth Tree and Yellow Stars

These young people range in age from 14 to 18. In terms of warmth items, they could mostly use new pajamas, underwear, and socks. Other items, such as gloves or mittens, are also fine. Girls' sizes range from women's medium to large, and boys' sizes range from L to XL. If you do not want to shop, you can take an angel from the tree. The angels represent \$5 each. Take an angel off the tree and put money in the box beneath the tree. The Sunday School will empty the box after late worship each week.

We are trying something new for those of you who would rather give a more personal gift. You will

find large yellow stars hanging on the Warmth Tree. Each star has the name of a young person at the Wilson Children's Home. Give the star to Nikki Tracy, and she will give you the child's Christmas wish list. Each child has made out a wish list. The Sunday School recommends not spending more than \$40. You can go together with someone else. You can buy one present for the \$40 or two or three smaller presents for the same amount. You may not be able to find some things on the wish list, but you can get something close to them. Wrap up the presents into one package and place the star with the child's name on top.

This bid includes removing the current gutter/soffit, replacing the board across the back where damage has occurred, covering the board with metal, reinstalling the soffit, reinstalling the gutter and adding hidden hangers, as well as clean-up and disposal. A disclaimer is included for a possible estimate change if the gutter or soffit is damaged during the removal.

The basement window in the back is damaged, Colliver believes he can fix this as well.

Gutter cleaning – the guy who fixed the parsonage hasn't returned the call. George is still looking for someone to regularly clean them.

Parsonage leak (faucet) has been fixed.

Outside spigot in back is leaking, the plumber came out and turned off the water to it and recommended replacing it in the spring.

Cemetery—Tree removal – they've been trying to call the church, with no answer. Willa has touched base with them. The work will begin soon.
